Tahiti storm into semis

BRISBANE, Australia, Oct 1: Tahiti secured an Oceania Nations' Cup semifinal against tournament favourites Australia on Friday after a decisive 5-1 win against Vanuatu here late Wednesday, reports AFP. Striker Gerald Quennet

scored a hattrick, while Tahiti's other goals came from midfielder Teza Zaveroni and substitute Harold Amaru.

Tahiti started their second round qualifier in blistering style rifling in three near misses in the first six minutes before Quennet hammered home the first goal in the ninth minute.

Quennet, who had too much speed for the Vanuatu defence timed his run perfectly to head home his first off a neat cross from Benoit Michelena.

The pair combined again within a minute with Michelena firing in a low cross from the left for an unmarked Quennet to drive home.

Tahiti could have extended their lead several times before half time but went to the break 2-nil up.

Midfielder Peter Roronamahava, who scored in Vanuatu's 8-1 loss to New Zealand in their first round qualifier, found the woodwork with a thundering shot from 30 metres. Vanuatu's resurgence was

short-lived before Tahiti made it 3-nil in the 54th minute when midfielder Teva Zaveroni was unmarked in the box to drive home a cross next to the upright from striker Hiro Labaste. Labaste, who terrorised the

Vanuatu defence, set up Tahiti's final two goals to complete the

Quennet raced on to a Labaste pass in the 74th minute and shrugged off a tackle to notch his hattrick while Tahiti's fifth came one minute later when substitute Harold Amaru received a cut back from Labaste for an easy tap in.

Vanuatu gained a consolation goal in the dying stages when substitute Edwin Rarai scored a spectacular division header off a free-kick from Pita Kalotong.

In the second match, Fiji made hard work of beating the Cook Islands 3-0 to earn their semifinal place against New Zealand on Friday night.

The Cook Islands went within one goal of registering a world record defeat in their 16-O loss to Australia on Monday.

Castrilli quits his job

Cup in the following year.

BUENOS AIRES, Oct 1: Argentina's controversial referee Javier Castrilli, who sent off 202 players in 234 professional games, has resigned after denouncing match-rigging in Argentine soccer, reports Reuters.

The 41-year-old, who refereed up to the quarter finals in the World Cup in France, accused the college of referees and its head Jorge Romo of leaking on referees to rig games.

Calling such referees "clowns and jesters of those in power" he demanded that referees' income be investigated and accused them of accepting free

trips to the Caribbean. He has also attacked the long standing president of the Argentine Football Association, Julio Grundona, who snapped back this week that Castrilli

had "gone mad." "Why does he say I have gone mad? Because I tell the truth?" responded Castrilli, who pre-

sented his resignation on Tuesday night. Grundona told reporters on Wednesday: "It would be a shame if Castrilli resigned. Two

months after the World Cup, he cannot give up his career so quickly.

Another controversial figure, Paraguayan 'keeper Jose Luis Chilavert who plays for First Division Velez Sarsfield, agreed that Castrilli would be a loss.

"It would be a pity because he's a very good referee. He has given very good results. He may have made mistakes, but no one is perfect," Chilavert told local

radio. But Argentine sports magazine El Grafico's wast edition, which came out last Thursday. made no bones about its opinion of Castrilli's refereeing. "Does he think he's God?" It asked on a front cover deco-

rated with a red card. "Free with this edition. Use Castrilli's card and chuck out whoever you want," said the magazine.

Oceania Nations' Cup | Buchanan evaluates | Tahiti storm English cricket

BRISBANE, Australia, Oct 1: Blame for England's miserable Ashes efforts of the past decade could be laid solely on the county cricket system, Queens-land coach John Buchanan said Wednesday, reports AFP.

Buchanan, who returned home Wednesday from a disastrous season as coach of English county Middlesex, said Australia's first-class players were a league above their English counterparts.

Asked if the problems in county cricket were the reason for England's Ashes drought since Australia won back the trophy in 1989, Buchanan replied. "I have no doubt about

"Because what England is drawing on at the moment is a squad of maybe 18 to 20 players who can play, not necessarily consistently, at Test level, whereas they should be drawing on 40 to 60 players.

"They've got infrastructure problems that they're trying to address but again it seems the county system is working against that because they're protecting their own self-inter-

Euro leagues warn FIFA

BRUSSELS, Oct 1: The Association of European Football Leagues on Wednesday threw down the gauntlet to FIFA by warning in the name of the clubs it represents that it will refused to release players for January's Confederations' Cup in Mexico, reports AFP.

"This tournament, partially organized for commercial motives by FIFA in no way takes into account the interest of clubs, who are nonetheless the players' principal employers," a Belgian league spokesman told Le Soir.

"We had suggested that this competition, which occupies the players for more than a fortnight, comes at a time when the league championships are going at full tilt, should take place every four years at the end of the season.

"FIFA took no account of our arguments, under these circumstances there is no question of our clubs freeing their players, who in addition would have to play at altitude, right at the start of the year." the spokesman added. The association, which rep-

resents six of Europe's largest league, met in Brussels on Monday to discuss their stance on the Confederations' Cup and will meet again in Lisbon on October 30. FIFA themselves discussed

the problems of the Confederations' Cup at their two-day meeting in Zurich last week. English, French and Italian clubs have all slammed the January 9-20 competition as they stand to lose their French and Brazilian stars in mid-sea-

But FIFA's new president

Sepp Blatter has already written to the French Football Federation, spelling out that the competition is an official competition and any players who do not play in it face being banned.
