An unnatural death case was filed with Pallabi thana in this regard.


Results of JU admission tests Oct 11

Results of admission tests for Honours courses at Jahangirnagar University in 1997-98 session will be announced on October 11, official sources said.

Kibria seeks Canadian help to recoup losses

Finance Minister SAMS Kibria has sought expanded cooperation of the Canadian gov-ernment to overcome the damages caused by the century's worst flood in Bangladesh, reports UNB.

He made the request in a meeting with Canadian State Minister for Foreign Affairs and International Trade Raymond Chan in Ottawa on Tues-

During the meeting, they discussed bilateral and international issues, said an official handout on Thursday.

Kibria also requested the Canadian minister to increase Bangladesh's quota for readymade garments export.

Mentioning the traditional friendly relations between the two countries, Raymond Chan said the matters would be decided through discussion between the representatives of the two nations

Rajshahi University land

Owners yet to be compensated 34 yrs after acquisition

RAJSHAHI, Oct 2: Owners of some 66 acres of land acquired by the government for Rajshahi University have not yet got compensation even after 34

years of acquisition. Locals alleged that the University authorities had not done anything, save construc-tion of the Art College building and a graveyard on the land during all these years. The "victims", meanwhile,

formed a "committee for recovering the lands occupied by the Rajshahi University" with a view to what they term retrieving the land from the RU au-

thority. Amiruddin Mondal, convenor of the committee, told APB that the then government acquired 65.18 acres of land for the Rajshahi University in face of opposition and objection from the local people in the

year 1963-'64. Concerned authorities had made a verbal commitment to the local people that the owners would be able to use their plots until the university administration constructed any building on those.

It was also pledged that wards of the owners of these plots would be given preference in maters of admission to the university and to provide them with job opportunities in the university on the basis of a special quota.


The university authorities never fulfilled their commitment during the last 34 years.
