ment, reports Reuters. The loss was another bitter disappointment for the Australians, who were bundled out of this year's World Cup by Iran. Australia, beaten by Brazil in last year's Confederations' Cup final, had been heavilly

favoured to win today's decider.

But midfielder Mark Burton slotted the ball into the back of the next in the 24th minute to give New Zealand the lead and the visitors then held off the home side for their upset win at Suncorp stadium.




