

Javed dedicates 79 to late brother

Aminul's sparkling debut, Malaysia downed by 141

KATHMANDU, Oct 5: Bangladesh got off to a predictably sound start in the second Asian Cricket Council (ACC) Trophy with a 141-run win over Malaysia at the Engineering Campus ground in Kathmandu today.
With the rain taking time out at Kathmandu and the clouds on holiday, Bangladesh, led by its new captain Aminul Islam, got little resistance from Malaysia to stamp their first win in the tournament after a frustrating drawn encounter against Papua New Guinea on the inaugural day when all the matches were washed out by rain.
Bangladesh, aided by a disciplined 79 from opener Javed Omar and a little calm knock from vice-captain Khaled Mahmud, posted a commendable total of 239 for nine in their share of 50 overs. In reply, Malaysia were bundled out for 98, thanks to a brilliant all-round performance from Aminul. The diminutive Bangladesh captain scored 36, effected a scintillating run out with a direct hit from cover-point, and took four wickets with his off-spin. But the most eye-catching aspect of the Aminul boys was their fielding and catching. Sajjad, though failed with the willow, took a magnificent diving catch at mid-on.

Bangladesh never appeared in danger after Aminul, who took the field as a full-fledged captain for the first time, won a good toss in the morning and opted to bat. The defending champions were off to a rollicking start with Shahriar Hossain and Javed Omar producing 86 runs in 20 overs. The two were separated when Shahriar was caught at short mid-wicket after scoring a 54-ball 30, studded with five fours.
Javed celebrated his return to the national team with a brilliant 79. The dapper right hander, who was later declared man-of-the-match, clubbed 11 fours in his 127-ball flawless vigili at the crease.
"This is a memorable day for me because I have never won the laurel while playing for the national team, said a beaming Javed adding that he wants to dedicate the small piece of glory to his late brother Asif Omar Belim.

Although Javed painted the town on his recall, there were marks at all inspiring for one-down Sajjad Ahmed, who came in place of an ailing Faruque Ahmed. Sajjad scored only five before becoming the second victim of Malaysian captain Ramesh Menon. After the fall of

two quick wickets, skipper Aminul Islam and Javed took the score to 177. But once Aminul departed for 36, Bangladesh suffered a stunning slide, losing three wickets at the score of 177. Javed quickly followed Aminul offering a tame catch at mid-wicket off the bowling of seamer Siswanto, who then went on to dismiss Rafique, promoted up to the batting order, for a first-ball duck.
The departure of Rafique however paved the way for the liveliest part of the Bangladesh innings with vice-captain Khaled Mahmud scoring a breezy 36 off only 20 balls. The agile Mahmud clouted two huge sixes and three fours in an en-

terprising knock. Mahmud was particularly harsh against Siswanto, who conceded 18 runs in the 48th over with Mahmud clobbering 14.
Siswanto, the most successful Malaysian bowler with three for 54 runs, however had the last laugh. The tall right-arm seamer had Mahmud at long off. But by then Bangladesh had amassed a commanding total on a tricky wicket producing uneven bounce. Javed played extremely well and he deserves the m-o-m award.
"The fielding was up to the mark. The batting is all right. Specially, I'm impressed with my openers. The only thing I'm disappointed with is my fast bowling," said Aminul after the match.

"I was expecting a total more than 250. But after the fall of three quick wickets we could not reach the mark. Still, 200-

plus is a defendable total on this type of wicket," said Aminul. When Aminul was talking to the press, Gordon appeared reluctant to meet the media.
The only thing Gordon said to his players, "The day is not yet over. Let's have some practice."



The three practice venues are-BUET ground, Dhanmondi Cricket Stadium and Sultana Kamal Women Sports Complex ground.
Bangladesh Cricket Board president and Deputy Minister for Shipping Sabur Hossain Chowdhury was also present with Quader during the visit.
After the inspection, Quader directed the National Sports Council (NSC) officials to complete the preparation works in the practice venues before October 15. The minister will re-inspect the venues on October 16.
All the three grounds were in need of improvement in dressing room facilities. Dhanmondi Cricket Stadium and Sultana Kamal Women Sports Complex grounds also require works on the outfield and wickets.

One world, one game

The trophy of the Wills International cricket tournament, starting in Dhaka from October 24, is to be designed on 'one world, one game' theme, according to a report of India's The Hindu newspaper.

The trophy, designed by Jaipur-based jeweller, Arun Fabuwal, will be unveiled in India before the nine-nation knockout tournament gets underway.
All the nine Test-playing nations will participate in the 9-day mega event. New Zealand will take on Zimbabwe in the opener.
KIRSTEN DOUBTFUL
Opener Gary Kirsten, a bulwark of the South African batting line-up, may miss the imminent Wills International Trophy cricket tournament in Bangladesh because of a finger injury, says a Cricinfo report.
Kirsten broke a finger during Western Province's opening Standard Bank League match in Fochville on Friday night.
The selectors have said that Kirsten will be given "every chance" to prove his fitness prior to the tournament in Dhaka, but remarked selection chief Peter Pollock, "replacements are in the wings".
No potential replacements have been named, but Andrew Hudson, Herschelle Gibbs and Mike Rindel would probably be on the selectorial short list.

33rd Chess Olympiad

Bangladesh beat Iraq, eves Czeched

Bangladesh men's team posted their third win in the 33rd Chess Olympiad when they registered a 3-1 win over Iraq in their sixth round clash at Elista, Russia, on Sunday.
According to a message received here yesterday, International Master Ziaur Rahman and Abdullah Al-Rakib won their boards while International Master Reefat-bin-Sattar and Enamul Hossain Rajib drew their ties against their Iraqi counterparts.
With the win, Bangladesh now have 13.5 points out of possible 24.
In the seventh round, Bangladesh were scheduled to meet Vietnam yesterday.
In the women's division, Bangladesh lost to Czech Republic by 5-2.5 points.

Australia complete an emphatic victory

RAWALPINDI, Oct 5: Australia trounced Pakistan by an innings and 99 runs in their first Test victory on Pakistani soil for 39 years here today, reports AFP.

The home side were dismissed for a paltry 145 runs in their second innings in 13 minutes of play on the fifth day, marking Australia's first win since the Lahore Test of the 1958-59 series.
"It was a long awaited historic win and that was at the back of the boys' minds", a delighted Australian captain Mark Taylor said. "It is a great victory and with a substantial margin," he added.
"It's a fantastic feeling, having won Tests in the West Indies, South Africa, New Zealand and India, we were aspiring for a victory here and that has come after 39 years."

But Taylor added that the Pakistanis are a very good side and can bounce back.
Taylor whose first match as Australian captain was in Karachi in the 1994-95 series has now won 23 of his 43 Tests. He lost his first series here 1-0.
Pakistan skipper Amir Sohail was in pensive mood after the rout suffered by his side.
"I accept that we played really badly but I am not unhappy, you win some and you lose some, the bottom line is that they outplayed us," he said.
"The Australians fully deserved this win as they have outplayed us in both batting and bowling, but this is not the end of the series and I hope they will fight back."

Paceman Glenn McGrath trapped Pakistan's last man Saqlain Mushtaq leg before for seven to the tourists jubilation soon after play resumed in bright morning sunshine at the Pindi Stadium here.
However, by the fifth morning the match was only of academic interest with Pakistan teetering overnight on 137-9. Rain had delayed Australia's win on the fourth day by enforcing a 117-minute break.
Leg-spinner Stuart MacGill

collected a total of nine wickets while player-of-the-match Steve Waugh and Michael Slater hit splendid centuries to help Australia pile up a match winning 513 in the first innings.

It was a strong all-round performance from the tourists, with an inexperienced bowling attack coming through with flying colours.
"MacGill was here as a replacement for Shane Warne but he has had a fantastic match and I am sure that he will make his own name," Taylor said.
The 27-year-old Western Australian finished with the figures of 9-113 (5-66 and 4-47) in only his second Test.
Steve Waugh and Slater came to the rescue on the second day when the top order batsmen slumped to leave the visitors reeling on 28-3.

The pair put on a stand of 198 for the fourth wicket to put their team in the driving seat, with Waugh amassing a magnificent 157 and Slater getting 108. Darren Lehmann with 98 in only his second Test and a plucky 82 by wicketkeeper Ian Healy also contributed to a commanding 244 run first innings lead for the tourists.
Healy marked the match by overhauling legendary compatriot Rodney Marsh's record of 355 Test victims by catching Wasim Akram on the fourth day. Healy now has 356 slaps in 104 Tests.

"We put our heads down on the second day and once we were out of trouble and gained a big lead the win was in sight," a jubilant Steve Waugh said.
"Barbados 1995 was an achievement but I count this as one of the greatest wins. We haven't won here for quite sometime so this win can be rated as high as anywhere in the world," he said.
For the home team Saeed Anwar's fighting 145 in the first innings was the only high point.

Pakistan's coach, the former great Test batsman Javed Miandad, said, "There was no excuse for the loss."
"We planned to beat them

with spinners but our bowlers did not bowl as per planned, we are good side and can come back," he said.

West Indies were the only other side to have inflicted a Test innings defeat on Pakistani soil, achieving the feat twice at Lahore first in 1958-59 and then under the great Viv Richards in 1986-87.
The second Test starts at Peshawar on October 15.

KATHMANDU, Oct 5: Japan would choose to forget their bitter memories on the third day of the Nepal showpiece as Hong Kong hurried down in the history of Asian Cricket Council Trophy.

Hong Kong heroes shot out the unfortunate Japanese for only 18 runs in their group stage match at the Tribhuvan University ground today. The sumo wrestlers could survive only 20.2 overs after being sent into bat by Hong Kong skipper. The highest individual score was four while Mr. Sundries 10. The most interesting aspect of the Japan innings was that seven of their batsmen returned to dressing room without giving any trouble to the scorers.
To add insult to injury, Hong Kong rushed to the victory mark in only 2.3 overs. The fate of the match was perhaps decided in the shortest possible time, starting at 9am it was over at 10.15 am.

The real flair of the ball-bashing game was however provided by the United Arab Emirates at the St. Xavier's -- the ground where their captain Saeed Al Safar scored an unbeaten 209 against Thailand. Saeed's double century, a record in limited-over game, enabled his side to amass a mind-boggling total of 346 for four, that too only in 45 overs. In reply, Thailand were bundled out for 72 in 32 overs. UAE won the match by 292 runs.

Saeed, who took the depleted Thailand attack to the sword, put on 206 runs for the first wicket with Naser Siddiqi who chipped in with 66. In his explosive 136-ball undefeated knock, Saeed clouted fifteen sixes and ten fours. The big-hitter, who was later adjudged player-of-the-match, also took four wickets for only 11 runs in his 4 overs.

For a change there was no rain in Nepal and all the four-matches scheduled for the day commenced uninterrupted. At the southern strip of the Engineering Campus ground, Singapore defeated Papua New Guinea by five wickets.
