Leewards wreck US

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Oct 7 (AP): Leeward Islands made a rousing start in the defence of their Red Stripe Bowl cricket crown with a 242-run win Tuesday over mirmows the United States in the opening Group B at Kensington Park.

The Leewards, bolstered by a strong first wicket stand between debutant Wilden Cornwall and captain Stuart Williams, posted a record 330 for four in their 50 overs.

Their fearsome pace attack, spearheaded by Anthony Lake. then destroyed the American batting for mere 88 in 28 overs. Lake finished with five wickets for 41 runs. Only Wayne Headley made any score for the

US, leading the way with 29. The Leewards stroked their way to the highest total in a regional one-day game tanks to superb batting from Cornwall who cracked 126 and Williams who hit a sparkling 82 in an opening stand of 187.

The pair plundered the tame American bowling and were separated in the 30th over when Williams was caught off fastbowler Richard Lewis. His enterprising inning came off only 90 deliveries and included eight boundaries.

Cornwall, from Antigua, was also in attacking mood, belting 14 boundaries and two sixes off only 122 balls. In all, he batted for 155 minutes.

West Indies discard Keith Arthurton, who made 38, and Sylvester Joseph who finished unbeaten on 29, also got among the runs.

Action in Group B continues Wednesday with hosts Jamaica playing the USA.

Manoj to get back his due

MUMBAI, Oct 7: The Board - of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has decided to release the entire benevolent fund amount due to Manoj Prabhakar which it had withheld after the former Indian all-rounder had retired from the game, reports PTI.

"I remember the matter had come up for discussion at the board's AGM in Calcutta," BC-CI's executive secretary Sharad Diwadkar said here today confirming news reports.

Last month Prabhakar, whose match-fixing charges had raised a hue and cry in India cricket, had fired another bouncer by threatening to sue the board for non-release of his

benevolent fund. Prabhakar, who represented India in 129 one-day internationals and 39 Tests, in a legal notice to the board prior to the AGM had warned that if it failed to release the funds within four weeks, he would "initiate appropriate legal pro-

ceedings. The notice issued through Delhi-based advocate Nidhesh Gupta said though Prabhakar retired from international cricket in March 1996, the board has ignored several representations for the release of funds running into several lakh

of rupees. The notice said a substantial part Prabhakar's match fees was deducted by the board for deposition of the same in the benevolent fund meant for him.



RAWALPINDI, Pakistan, Oct 7 (AFP/Internet): The Pakistan cricket team is hoping to lift it

self both on and off the field in the wake of an ongoing matchfixing controversy and an innings humiliation by the touring Australian team in the first

While officials are intent on taking Pakistan cricket past the allegations that have stained its image internationally, the team hopes to show unity in its performance in the second Test that starts in Peshawar from October 15.

"We need to play positively and as a unit," said Pakistan coach Javed Miandad, who weathered many storms in his playing career.

Once a Pakistan team loses. the cricket-crazy locals go in search of non- cricketing reasons for the defeat. Pakistani fans find it hard to accept their team has been beaten by a better "Pakistan are the type of

team about whom it is hard to make predictions. They can lose to any team, but can also win against formidable oppositions," former Australian player Ian Chappell has said. Match-fixing, betting and

bribery controversies are the current talking points in Pakistan cricket and no less than three committees are investigating various claims. The committee formed by

the cricket board had implicated Wasim Akram, Salim Malik and liaz Ahmed.

Wasim and Malik both played in Pakistan's opening Test loss against Australia.

"We are doing our best to solve this controversy and let our players focus on the game," said Cricket Board chairman Khalid Mahmood.

Pakistan captain Aamir Sohail feels that it is the performance on the field that counts and that off-field problems should be left behind when the

team plays a match. "You win some and lose some. There is no excuse and there are no non- cricketing reasons for our loss, we played badly and lost," he said after the

crushing first Test defeat. Sohail has vowed his team will fight back and believes his team still has the ability to win the series.

"This is not the end of the series. We still have two Tests to go and we can pull it off from here," **he sai**d.



Pakistan Cricket Board legal adviser Sibtain Fazil said after the judicial inquiry their statements would not be released, but Australian Cricket Board (ACB) chief executive Mal Speed told ABC radio Waugh was challenged by lawyers over his evidence.

Speed said Waugh had relied on a statement he made four years ago and had faced crossexamination over his evidence. including by a lawyer for Malik

"There were a number of points put to Mark Waugh but he handled them very well. He has a very simple story to tell and he told it well," Speed said.

Once the first cricket Test against Pakistan was over and conditions for the hearing had been negotiated, Waugh had been comfortable to give evidence, he said, but added: "I think Mark's very pleased that it's over -- it's been a distraction ever since the team arrived in Pakistan.

Speed said Taylor's involvement in the inquiry had been minimal and he had simply told of being advised by his players that offers of bribery had been made.

The ACB had vetoed a request last week to make Australian players available to give evidence, saying they were in Pakistan to play cricket only. Both Waugh, 0, and Taylor. 3, failed in the first Test.

US to mark Davis Cup centenary

BOSTON (Massachusetts) Oct 7: A three-day Davis Cup centennial celebration will be conducted here next July as part of a quarterfinal tie or qualifying round match to be hosted by the United States, reports AFP.

US Tennis Association officials announced that they would host a tie July 16-18, 1999, at Longwood Cricket Club, where US and British teams inaugurated the Davis Cup matches on August 8, 1900. The US team won 3-0.

The 1999 Davis Cup draw will be conducted Thursday in London.

If the US loses in an opening-round tie April 2-4, the US team has received special permission to host a qualifying round tie in July rather than the traditional September date after the US Open.

Fluminense in ignominy

RIO DE JANEIRO, Oct 7 (Reuters/Internet): Former international Branco was sent off as Fluminense, one of Brazilian soccer's traditional powers, were humiliatingly relegated to the third division of the national championship on Tues-

day night. The 1-1 draw away to ABC resulted in a third successive relegation for a club who once boasted legendary players such as Rivelino and Gerson in the team.

Fluminense were relegated from the first division in 1996 but were spared the drop when the Brazilian Football Confederation (CBF) decided to reinstate them. But last year, they went down again and this time there was no change in the rules to save them.

"Flu", playing in group D, went down as on of the two worst fifth-placed teams after Santa Cruz beat Volta Redonda in group B to finish with the same number of points but more games won.

However, with rule-changing a common practice in the Brazilian game, there is already talk that Fluminense could escape the third division and even be granted a return to the first next year by backroom wheel-ing and dealing.

Acting president David Fishel has already suggested an "amnesty" while former president Francisco Horta said on Wednesday that a "National League" should be set up for the eight best-supported teams in the country - which he said in-

cludes Fluminense. ABC, who finished second and qualified for the quarterfinals, took the lead early in the second half. Fluminense equalised in controversial style two minutes later with an own goal that followed a goalmouth scramble.

The game was delayed for five minutes as ABC players protested that the ball had not crossed the line.

Branco was sent off later for a tackle from behind. The 34year-old had rejoined the club halfway through the campaign after a year away from football.

The second division of the Brazilian championship features four groups of six with the bottom team in each group plus the two worst fifth placed teams going into the third division. Brazil's third division is a

total soccer backwater, ignored by fans and the media and where teams cover huge distances to play unknown opponents in decaying stadiums.

Tuesday's relegation will not affect Fluminense's participation in next year's Carioca (Rio de Janeiro state) championship. where they will line-up alongside the state's three big clubs Vasco da Gama, Flamengo and Botafogo.

Berkovic claims foul play

LONDON, Oct 7: Israeli international midfielder Eval Berkovic on today accused English Premiership club West Ham of attempting to cover-up a training ground assault on him by his Welsh international teammate John Hartson, reports AFP.

Graphic pictures published in the Daily Mirror show Hartson kicking Berkovic in the head after a clash at West Ham's training ground.

Berkovic, who claims the kick left him in agony with blood pouring out of his head, said: "I am very upset with the West Ham board. They tried to cover up what happened on the training pitch.

They did that because Hartson enjoys privileges that others don't. A different player would have been out of the club.

Berkovic said he was unable to eat for two days after the assault, which happened last

Hartson, who has been involved in several previous inci dents, appeared before magistrates on Monday for kicking a pub's hanging baskets. He said: "I like Eyal. He is a quality player and it was just one of those things. How many times do I have to apologise?"

Serie A players prepare to fight back



ROME, Oct 7: Some of Italy's top soccer players backed a call on Tuesday for a

strike to protest against media insinuations that their sport is rife with doping, reports AFP.

The strike suggestion was made by Sergio Campana, president of the Italian players union (AIC), who said drastic action might be needed to kill off allegations which surfaced in August and have continued to haunt the championship.

The AIC suggested a stoppage of 30 minutes on the next weekend of the Serie A championship — October 17-18 — but Campana warned the proposed strike could then escalate. "It might need a stoppage of

six months," he told RAI state radio. "Certainly we need to do something to put an end to this climate that has been created. Think of the conditions that

Juventus and Parma players have had to put up with."

Juve and Parma have been at the centre of the speculation over doping. Both clubs have vehemently denied administering banned substances.

Roma coach Zdenek Zeman claimed in an article published in August that drug taking was widespread in Serie A.

This week 24 Parma players were reported to have shown abnormally high levels of red blood cells in tests carried out in July.

Parma players Fabio Cannavaro and Dino Baggio said on Tuesday they would back a formal strike call.

"A strike is fair," said Cannavaro, currently preparing with Italy's squad for the European championship qualifying match against Switzerland on Saturday.

"This doping scandal has given players a terrible image and is threatening to muddy our

careers," he said. "You only have to think of the insults shouted at AS Parma players during our match in Bologna on

Baggio advocated a strike against "those who have slandered us.

"It's time to raise our voices," he said. "People have already put us down as drug takers even though we're not. We can't accept all this ... The time is right

for legal action." Juventus striker Filippo Inzaghi said: "Given that the only time we've ever achieved anything is when we've gone on strike I don't see any alternatives. The strike would be against all those who present players in a bad light without

any proof." There is no league soccer this weekend in Italy due to the match against Switzerland. Serie A restarts on Saturday October 17.

Hosts of Euro finals



LISBON, Oct 7 (Reuters/Internet) Barcelona were given the chance to cap their cente-

narv vear in grand style on Wednesday when UEFA announced this season's European Cup Final will be played at the Nou Camp Stadium.

Barcelona, one of three Spanish representatives in the Champions' League, could be crowned European champions on May 26 in the first European Cup final to be held at the Nou Camp since AC Milan defeated Steaua Bucharest 4-0 in 1989. The UEFA Cup, which last

year became a one-off final rather than a two-legged affair, will be played in the Luzhniki Stadium in Moscow on May 12. The European Cup Winners' Cup Final will be staged at Birmingham's Villa Park, England, on May 19. The only other occasion on

which a European final was played on a neutral ground in Eastern Europe was the 1973 European Cup final between Ajax Amsterdam and Juventus,

staged in Belgrade. The match at Villa Park will be the first European final to be staged in England on a neutral ground other than Wembley.

Thomas Kurth, head of UE-FA's Competitions department explained: "The English Football Association submitted Villa Park as their choice as construction work at both Wembley Stadium and Old Trafford ruled out those two grounds.

"Villa Park won the vote to stage the game over the Parken Stadium in Copenhagen."

The Nou Camp stadium has a seating capacity of 92,000 and has staged four major finals, including the 1982 European Cup Winners' Cup Final in which Barcelona beat Standard Liege in front of the only 100,000 crowd in that competition's history. It also staged the 1972 Cup

Moscow and the 1992 Olympic final in which Spain defeated Poland. This season's European Cup

Winners' Cup final when

Rangers defeated Dynamo

after UEFA's decision on Tuesday to merge that competition with an expanded UEFA Cup.

No club in the competition's 38-year history has won that cup in successive seasons. But Chelsea, who won last year in Stockholm, could do so on a rival English ground next May.

UEFA's Executive were preoccupied with the re-organisation of their club competitions during two days of meetings, culminating in Tuesday's announcement the Champions League is to be expanded from 24 to 32 teams from next sea-

On Wednesday they also discussed changes to television coverage of European football and are considering altering article 44 that determines which matches can be televised across national borders in Eu-

That subject, and a re-negotiated TV contract in light of changes due to be made to the revamped Champions' League, are likely to occupy debate before the next UEFA Executive meeting in Israel in December.

Mixed bag on UEFA plan though no figures were fixed. MADRID, Oct 7



(Reuters/Internet) : Real Madrid president Lorenzo Sanz on Wednesgave an immediate thumbs down to UEFA's plans for revamping European club competition.

But while the European champions were critical of the UEFA idea, their archrivals Barcelona led a chorus of Spanish support for the enlarged 32-team Champions' League.

Sanz, who recently announced that the club's debt had risen to 20.15 billion pesetas (\$132.8 million), said he preferred the rival plan put forward by Milan-based sports marketing group Media Partners because of financial considerations.

"It's acceptable in sporting terms -- a balanced plan -- but in terms of economics we will have to wait and see what hap-

"Grave doubts remain. How is the money going to be shared out? How much will go to the clubs and how much to outside agencies? The maximum percentage of the profits should go to the clubs." UEFA announced on Tues-

day they would expand the Champions' League to 32 teams and merge the UEFA and Cup Winners' Cup from next season in an attempt to head off the threat of a European Super League.

They said there would be more money for clubs and, althe prize fund is reported to be between \$450-\$600 million. about half that offered by the organisers of the Super League. UEFA's Task Force will con-

tinue to work on the planned

changes and present the complete package, including prize money, to the next executive meeting in Israel in December. Barcelona president Jose Luis Nunez was clearly impressed by the latest proposals.

saying: "This is very satisfactory. It seems to me to be very positive." And a Barcelona club spokesman said: "We've always said that European football at the highest level must be within

UEFA. We support their plans." Spain's third Champions' League representative this season, Athletic Bilbao, were also in favour and, along with other clubs, welcomed the fact that UEFA's plan was not an "invitation only" affair.

Athletic president Jose Maria Arrate said: "It seems fairer to participate by qualification rather than invitation. With this plan, between eight and 10 clubs have the opportunity to participate." Atletico Madrid president

Jesus Gil commented: "It's undoubtedly better to play on sporting merit rather than through invitation, whereby the abyss between big and small clubs is going to increase." Spain's Football Federation

added their support through its president Angel Villar, who said: "The new competition is

very positive for European and Spanish football, as it ensures another participant in the final

English premier league spokesman Mike Lee said his organisation "broadly welcomed UEFA's commitment to reform" but added there was still a great deal to be covered.

The Premier league and English club chairmen have concerns about the financial model used by Media Partners, the organisation behind the Super League proposal, who have promised prize money of \$1.2 billion.

Eladio Parames, spokesman for Benfica chairman Joao Vale e Azevedo, said: "We are still waiting for the final details to make a proper study of the proposals.

Parames said the club was waiting in particular for the financial details because "one thing is certain: the clubs were being badly treated by UEFA when it came to distributing money that the clubs themselves were generating."

A spokesman for Dutch champions Ajax Amsterdam said the club had no comment to make until the Task Force completed its report to UEFA. The executive president of Olympique Marseille, the only French club to have won the European Cup, also said there was more to be done.

Media Partners said UEFA had not addressed the hard issues. "We are happy if UEFA gives the clubs a better deal next season," said a spokesman.
