Brindisi to take Espanyol job

BARCELONA, Spain, Oct 10 (Reuters/ Internet): Argentine coach Miguel Angel Brindisi is set to become the coach at struggling Spanish first division club Espanyol, according to Spanish media reports on Saturday.

The club confirmed that they had been negotiating with Brindisi on Friday over his contract and a formal announcement is expected on Tuesday after a meeting of the club's executive board.

Sources close to the club suggested that Brindisi had been appointed only until the end of the present season.

The former Argentine international will step into the shoes of his compatriot Marcelo Bielsa, who is due to take over as Argentine national team coach in December, but will have a tough job revitalising Espanyol.

The Barcelona club are 18th in the Spanish first division. two places off the bottom.

Bielsa joined Espanyol in the summer from Argentine club Velez Sarsfield but, after the post-World Cup departure of Daniel Passarella, he was offered the chance to coach his national side.

Brindisi has held several top coaching jobs in Argentina and was a member of the country's 1974 World Cup squad.

New deadline for 2012 Olympic bidders

NEW YORK, Oct 10: The nine American cities hoping to play host to the 2012 Olympics were given more time Friday to come up with government guarantees to back their bids, reports AP.

The US Olympic Committee's policymaking panel set Dec 31 as the new deadline for the bidders to obtain city or regional government acknowledgment that tax money could be required to cover any budget shortfall a privately financed Summer Games might encounter.

That's three months past the original deadline, which was met by only four bid committees - Cincinnati, Dallas, Houston and Orlando-Tampa.

Four others — Baltimore-Washington, New York, San Francisco and Seattle - had obtained promises of council consideration of the commitment. while the ninth, Los Angels, had no such action in the pipeline.

But rather than cut its field drastically, or even eliminate just one city that already has staged two Olympics, the USOC decided to give all bidders more time, committee president Bill Hybl said.

"I think we have clarified the rules, not changed the rules." Hybl said.

Los Angeles staged the Summer Games in 1932 and 1984, and is home to two of the American members on the International Olympic Committee, Vice president Anita De-Frantz and sporting goods executive Jim Easton.

DeFrantz and Easton are USOC executive committee members and were at Friday night's meeting in Phoenix Ariz. But Hybl and other USOC officials said stretching the deadline was not an act of favoritism.

"We did this to be fair to all nine cities," Hybl said.

He said the nine bid packages submitted by the Sept 30 deadline all looked different. and that a task force including Donald Fehr, head of the baseball players' union and a USOC member, would work to coordinate the bid language. USOC executive director

Dick Schultz said only one of the nine cities had submitted a complete and fully documented package. He declined to say which city that was, but other committee sources, speaking on the condition of anonymity. identified it as Dallas.

SYDNEY, Oct 10: World 400metre sprint champion Cathy Freeman revealed Saturday that she was sexually abused as a child, saying she made the matter public to help others, reports AP.

When Freeman was an 11year-old, a man known to her family entered her bedroom and sexually assaulted her. The Australian newspaper reported The admission will appear in her biography, "A Journey

Just Begun," to be released next week, the paper said. "I'm strong enough to deal with it now, but because I said nothing then he could have gone on and done it to other

girls," Freeman was quoted as

saying in the book. "So speaking out isn't just for me, it's to help other girls out there, and young boys too. The lesson is, if it happens to you, don't be afraid, you're not to blame, tell your parents. And parents should get help for their children so it minimises the

mental damage. "Sadly we do have men like him out there, but staying silent doesn't help."

Freeman became Australia's first Aboriginal track and field world champion when she won the 400m at the Athens World Championships last year. She said she suspected such abuses happened as often in indigenous families as in non-indigenous, but believed less attention was paid to indigenous cases.

Boxing isn't good for girls

SYDNEY, Oct 10 (AFP/ Internet): Australian doctors have called on the Tasmanian state government to stop an amateur boxing bout between two teenage girls in Hobart this weekend.

The bout between a 14-year old from Hobart and a 16-yearold from New South Wales was being conducted by a rebel organiser and was not sanctioned by the sport's ruling body.

The Australian Medical Association (AMA) urged quick action to stop children boxing.

"The AMA opposes all forms of boxing on health grounds but specifically recommends the prohibition of all forms of boxing for people aged under 18. AMA president David Brand said in a statement.

The bout is to be held on Sat urday night with tickets selling at about \$6.

The hall was booked for the event by the Claremont Boxing Youth Club. A spokesperson was not available for comment. The AMA said young boxers

exhibited early evidence of brain damage in some studies, despite not being able to punch as hard as older fighters are.

"The danger of boxing for get Tyson's reports young people was underscored by the 1987 death in the UK of a 15-year-old amateur boxer. Joseph Sticklan, due to brain damage after his second fight. Brand's statement said. "We are also concerned that

young people may not be capable of making rational decisions about the dangers of boxing when choosing a sport." The AMA said it would begin

advertising campaign early next year encouraging parents to steer their children away from boxing. Amateur Boxing Union of Australia secretary Arthur

Tunstall said the Tasmanian amateur boxing association or its federal equivalent did not sanction the Hobart event. He took issue with the AMA's statements about the dangers of

boxing generally, but said he was preparing a response and would not comment in detail. "This is being done by a rebel

organisation. We do not endorse female boxers. It is not sanctioned," he said. National president of the

union, Sol Spitalnic, said women fighters were not recognised in Australian amateur boxing but did not overrule women over 18 fighting. "There should be an age limit

-- I think about 18," he said.



Davenport celebrates ascent



FILDERSTADT. Oct 10 (AP/Reuters): Lindsay Davenport became the world's No 1 women's tennis player Friday when Martina Hingis was beaten at the

Porsche Grand Prix. Hingis needed to win to hold off the charging American in the rankings but lost a 3-6, 7-6, 6-4 quarterfinal struggle to Belglum's rising star, Dominique Van Roost.

Davenport, the US Open champion, will officially end the Swiss teenager's 80-week reign at the top in the new rankings to be released Monday.

Davenport celebrated by winning her quarter-final against Natalie Tauziat of France 7-6, 7-5 later on Friday.

Hingis, slowed by a taped ankle from a jogging injury suffered earlier in the week, fought back from the brink of defeat several times before Van Roost blasted a forehand down the line to end the two-hour, 18minute battle.

Davenport, the daughter of a former US Olympic volleyball player, becomes the ninth player to be ranked No 1 since the computer rankings were started in 1975. It highlights a remarkable

year for Davenport, whose

ranking soared while she dropped 35 pounds earlier this season. She also won her first Grand Slam in New York. But Davenport isn't sure her new status as the world's top-

ranked player will bring her the same fame as predecessors like Martina Navratilova or Chris "It's a little bit like with Pete

Sampras," said Davenport, 22. "He can do what he wants and people still find him boring." Hingis was in trouble from the start against the 12thranked Van Roost, falling be-

hind 3-0 in the first set. Van Roost, who blitzed Venus Williams in straight sets in her previous match, constantly caught the 18-year-old Hingis flatfooted or moving in the wrong direction with her disguised strokes.

But Hingis came alive and fought from behind in both the final two sets. She trailed 1-4 in the third set, then pulled even at 4-4 and fought off two match points before losing.

"I think I played the best match of my life. But it's easy to play well when you have nothing to lose and the other player has a lot to lose," said Van Roost, 25, who will break into the top 10 in next week's rank-

Hingis' top ranking had been in danger for months as Davenport improved, while her own game slipped in the face of a

wave of new talented players. Last year, at this time, the Swiss player had a whopping 3,095 point lead over then No 2

Jana Novotna in the computer rankings.

Davenport, who turned pro in 1993, was inspired by Jennifer Capriati capturing the Olympic single's title a year ear-

Until then, the 1.98 metre (6ft-3) had been told she was too tall for the sport and should follow in the footsteps of her vol-

leyball-player family. "I thought that was the coolest thing that could happen to someone. I knew then, at the latest, that I had chosen the right path," said Davenport, who also captured Olympic gold

Hingis took the loss of her world top spot in her stride. "It's no drama. It's nothing special," she said.

"I don't want to deny Davenport the number one spot, she's been playing very well and at the moment she's the one who belongs there."

Davenport said: "I knew before I went on that I was number one and I just had to hold my mind together to try to win the

"I never aimed to be number one. I just aimed to win tournaments. But it's pretty amazing. I never thought I would do
