

Rangers chase Guivarc'h again

GLASGOW, Oct 14 (Reuters/Internet): Rangers said on Wednesday they were trying to sign out-of-favour French international striker Stephane Guivarc'h from Newcastle United.

The Scottish premier league club tried to recruit Guivarc'h last season when he was with French club Auxerre.

Rangers said in a statement they had had spoken to both Guivarc'h and Newcastle but neither the club nor the player had been in touch since the talks.

Guivarc'h rejected Rangers' advances before the World Cup finals despite being flown to Glasgow in a private jet belonging to Rangers chairman David Murray and looking over the club's set-up. He insisted he was not interested in Scottish football.

The French World Cup winner has had an unhappy time in the English premier league, injury limiting his chances of playing.

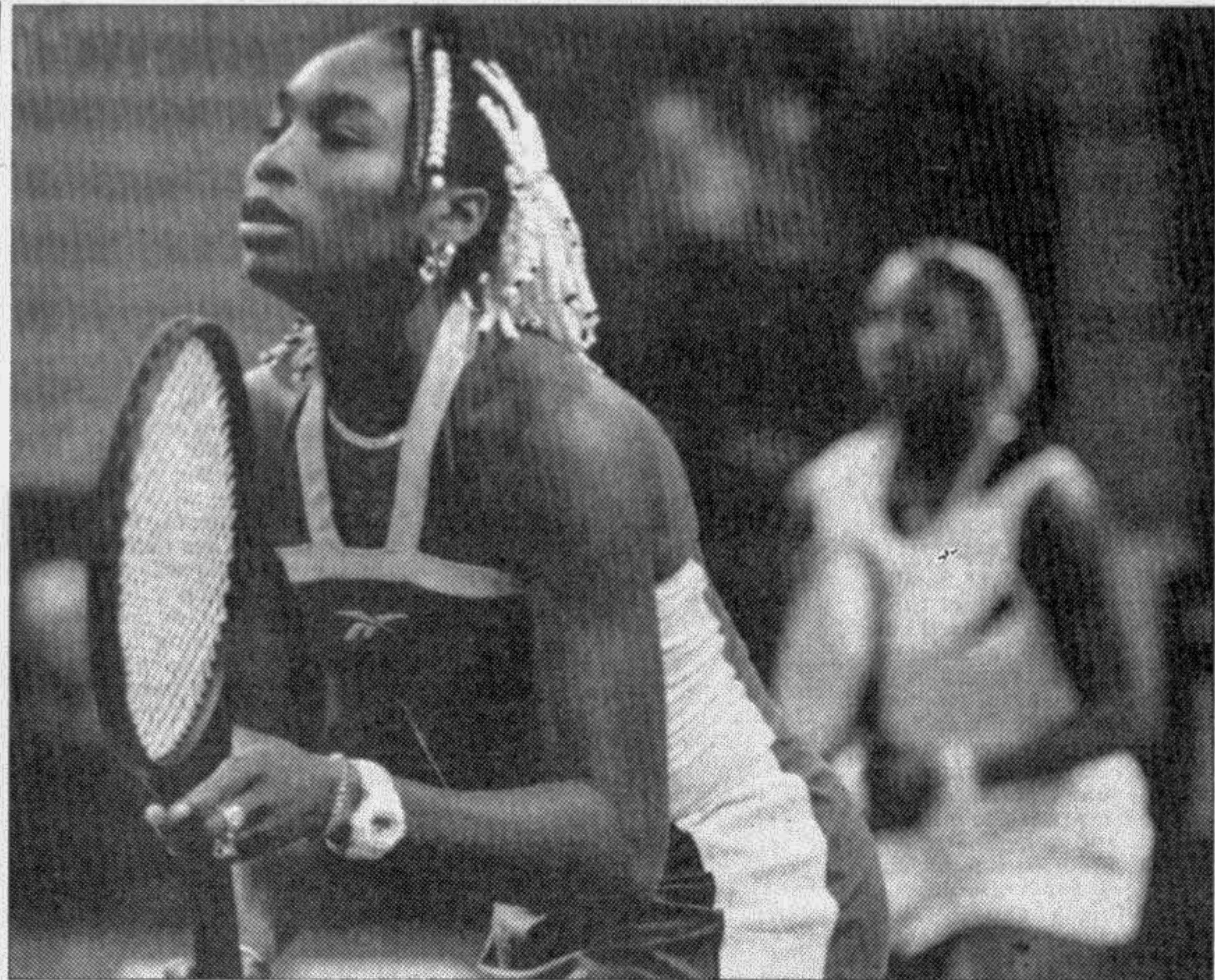

BRUSSELS, Oct 14: Belgium turned back 20 British football fans heading to Luxembourg for a match between the Grand Duchy and England on Tuesday, forcing the fans to spend the night at Brussels Airport, the Belgian Gendarmerie said, reports AFP.

The immigration service decided to stop them at the border because they are known hooligans, a Gendarmerie officer said. Six English supporters arrived from London on a flight on Tuesday morning and 14 more by another flight in the afternoon, he said.

Waqar discredited in the dock

LAHORE, Oct 14 (Reuters/Internet): Fast bowler Waqar Younis told a judge probing charges of betting and match-fixing in Pakistan cricket that two Test players retired from the game because they were convinced matches were rigged.

"Waqar (Younis) admitted that Rashid Latif and Basit Ali retired from international cricket (in 1994-95 in South Africa) after they had a clash with Salim Malik on match-fixing," Ali Sibtain Fazli, the lawyer for the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB), quoted Waqar as telling judicial commission head Justice Malik Mohammad Qayyum.

Waqar said he knew about the rift between the players and claimed to have tried to play the role of a mediator. But Rashid (Latif) and Basit (Ali) refused to play alongside Salim Malik, Fazli told Reuters.

"Rashid and Basit were convinced that Salim Malik had sold out to the bookies," Fazli quoted Younis as saying in his testimony.

Latif was Malik's vice-captain on the tour and had announced his retirement along with Basit in Johannesburg. They reversed their decision three months later.

An interim report released by the PCB recommended that Malik, Ijaz Ahmed and Wasim Akram should not be selected until the investigations were completed.

The trio has been named in the Pakistan team for the second Test starting at Peshawar on Thursday.

Two weeks ago, Basit appeared before the judicial commission but his statement was recorded in camera. Informed sources said he talked in detail about match-rigging and named Malik as the match planner.

Latif has been directed to appear before the commission on Saturday. Justice Qayyum has also summoned Pakistan

Pakistan team player. "But Raja Zafar Ali, who is Raja Aftab's real brother, denied that he or any of his family members did not have ever placed bets. He has been issued a notice under section 476 CRPC by Justice Qayyum and has been instructed to appear again on Saturday," Fazli said.

The PCB lawyer said Waqar was examined in detail about the corruption in the Pakistan cricket team. "He denied having any knowledge about it," he said.

"He also denied accusations that he deliberately bowled badly to allow England to triumph in a one-day international on the 1992 tour.

"He also dismissed accusations of his teammate Aaqib Javed that he returned a car to the bookie which was gifted to him after playing a role in fixing a match in the Singer Cup game in Colombo (Sri Lanka) in 1994," said Fazli.

Asked about Wasim's shoulder injury that stopped him from playing the 1996 World Cup quarterfinal against India, Waqar said, "He was injured in the match before the quarterfinal and pulled out at the last moment."

He termed Wasim's going to India as 'unusual'. Meanwhile, Salim Malik was spared an appearance before the court Tuesday as the judge was forced to take a day off. Court sources said Judge Qayyum had to take a day off for medical treatment and so could not take evidence from 34-year-old Malik.

LONDON, Oct 14 (Reuters/Internet): English county Nottinghamshire announced the appointment of Clive Rice as cricket manager on Tuesday.

The former Springbok all-rounder was at the heart of Notts' success in the 1980s, captaining them to two championships.

He is currently head of the South African cricket academy. Rice replaces Alan Ormrod, who was sacked in September after five years in the job. Notts finished third from bottom in the 18-team county championship, winning just three of 17 matches.

"Ever since we announced the departure of Alan Ormrod, Clive Rice was the only person on our list," said chairman Stuart Foster.

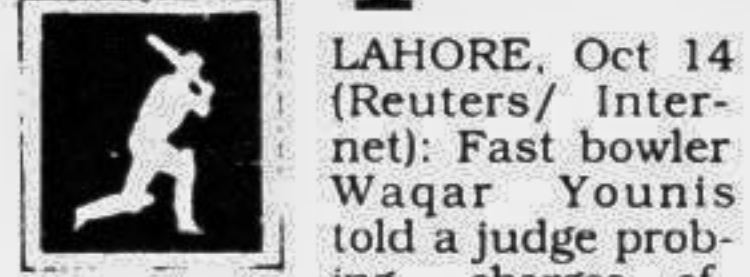
