## No plan to form party with vote-thieves: PM

MYMENSINGH, Oct 15: Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina today turned down the opposition allegation that Awami League was again out to revert to one party system, saying "we-will never form any party taking the vote thieves who plundered national wealth while in

power," report agencies. Sheikh Hasina outrightly rejected the recent remarks by BNP chairperson and Leader of the Opposition Begum Khaleda

She also dismissed the allegation that the present govern-

ment is misusing relief goods. Sheikh Hasina was addressing a big gathering at Mirkanda High School ground at Paranganj of sadar thana.

The Prime Minister said the BNP that fell from power for vote rigging is now making tall talks and spreading falsehood against this government.

"When they (BNP) were in power, they plundered crores of taka and misappropriated relief money and materials. Being ousted from power they are spreading lies against the ruling party," she alleged.

Hasina said she has a strong organisation and there is no need to induct the vote thieves in her party. "Awami League is the party of the people and the

people are with the party."

About the distribution of relief and VGF cards among the flood affected people, she said

everything is going on properly.

There is no allegation of misuse of relief materials, she said and warned that any irregularities in distribution of VGF cards and relief will be dealt with severely. The Prime Minister said the

government will not tolerate any misuse of relief goods. "If anybody tries to plunder people's food, he will not be spared," she added.

in stead. Asked about the scheduled arrival of two of the cricket teams in Dhaka on the day of hartal, Mannan Bhuiyan replied: It is the government's concern.

On Sunday, the cricket team of Zimbabwe is due to arrive at Zia International Airport at 4.30 am while that of England at 3.15 pm.

Anwar Zahid also spoke on the occasion while some other BNP leaders were present. But no leader of other components of seven-party alliance was present at the press briefing.

Meanwhile the city BNP at a meeting last night decided to bring out processions in all the 90 DCC Wards today and torch processions from five places in the city the day after to drum up support for Sunday's hartal.

tagon, Hill Tracts and of the Bay of Bengal. Shell now has 50 per cent stake in Cairn's con-

cerns in Bangladesh. Unocal, on the other hand, has become a partner of Occidental in blocks 12, 13 and 14

covering the Surma basin. The cooperation would, in future, mean that the resources in blocks 5,7,10, 15 and 16 could be channelled together through a pipeline for export,

said a source. Unocal has been trying to sign a contract with the government without any bid over the Shahbazpur gasfield since late 1996. Accordingly, it submitted a Western Region Integrated Project (WRIP) proposal for developing Shahbazpur gas-field, building pipelines and setting up power plants. How-ever, because of loopholes in the proposal that goes against Bangladesh's interest, the gov-

ernment is yet to sign this deal. Unocal is insisting that the RIP deal would be a 99-year one. While its pipeline contract seeks one dollar royalty per unit of gas used by any party, it also wants gas supply to WRIP's power plants at the government subsidised rate (presently around 1.1 dollars a unit) while it wants to sell Shahbazpur gas at international rate (presently around 1.8 dollars a unit).

Petrobangla sources said, Unocal is trying to strike a major deal in Bangladesh as it intends to become a giant in South Asian energy field.

Unocal, along with another oil company, Enron, has built an inter-regional gas pipeline from Myanmar to Thailand. It had initiated another inter-regional gas pipeline from Central Asia to Myanmar. However, the scheme could not go ahead beyond Central Asia due to problems in Afghanistan.

But Unocal is still working to promote regional gas exportimport and gain from pipeline tariff in the sub-continent, sources added.

On the other hand, Cairn and Shell were recently awarded two blocks in India and Cairn already has started work in full swing in one block.

Cairn has been discussing prospects of gas export to India since late 1996, sources revealed.

"At that time, such discussions seemed too ambitious or useless. Because Bangladesh is not in a position to export gas now or it will not be in a position to export gas in a decade." said a Petrobangla source. "But now it seems that the foreign companies concerned know what they are doing."

Bangladesh would be 'put in a situation so that it is bound to export gas,' said the source.

Abdul Kahar Akand, the investigating officer (IO) of the case, invoked Sections 120B (criminal conspiracy), 448 (house trespass), 449 (house trespass in order to commit offence punishable with death), 302 (involvement in the killing), 109 (abetment) and 34 (Act in furtherance of common intention) of the Penal Code, while bringing charges against the accused.

The CID cited 76 v 'nesses, including the informant, in the charge sheet of the case. Besides, around 155 people were interrogated during the investigation.

CID collected 53 alamats. including bullets, files and papers from Prison Department. documents from Army Headquarters and the DC's office. Blood stained clothes of the four leaders were also recov-

"Greed for political power led the accused to kill the four national leaders" — the investigating officials said.

CID, however, did not single out the principal accused. "The court will decide," said one offi-

CID did not mention which specific charges were brought against whom. The IO, in the charge sheet

recommended relieving Nuruzzaman from the case as there were not sufficient witnesses and evidences against him, according to the investigators. According to the charge

sheet the then president, Khandakar Mushtaque Ahmed along with his civil and military accomplices conspired to eliminate four influential leaders of the Awami League, who they feared, would challenge their position. Mushtaque and his accom-

plices first requested the four leaders to join the cabinet. Then the killers allured the four national leaders and at last the accused persons threatened the four leaders. The four leaders were arrested and taken to the jail on August 23, 1975, when the killers failed to make them agree to their proposals, investigators said.

Mushtaque and his accomplices started considering the four leaders as possible threat to their survival when a meeting attended by Awami League MPs in the Bangabhaban on October 16, 1975, ended in a pandemonium, without arriving at any decision. About 150 to 200 Awami

League MPs were present at the meeting that was actually arranged to give Mushtaque more political authority, according to the investigators. Besides, army officials, who

at that time were in the Bangabhaban and now facing trial for the killing of Banga-

bandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and his family members were afraid that their rival group in the Cantonment might dislodge Mushtaque from power, sending them all behind bars on charges of killing of Bangabandhu.

The killers of 15th August became afraid due to the activities of the rival group in the Cantonment led by the then Brig Khaled Mosharraf, Chief of General Staff, and the then Lt Col Shafayet Jamil, Station Commander, Dhaka of Bangladesh Army in the last week of October, 1975, the charge sheet

Then the killers had a meeting at the Bangabhaban on November 2 night. The blue print for the killing of the four leaders was chalked out in that meeting following which a group of five was sent under Risaldar Moslemuddin to carry out the operation at around 4 am on November 3, 1975. Other members of the group

included Dafadar Marafat Ali, LD Abul Hashem Mridha and two other unidentified soldiers. The jail authorities refused to let the group get inside the

jail, initially. An order over telephone from the Bangabhaban facilitated their entry into the jail at around 4 am, according to the

CID findings. At gunpoint, the group forced the jail wardens to open the cell of the new jail building where the four leaders were confined in separate rooms and brought Tajuddin Ahmed, Mansur Ali and A H M Kamruzzaman inside Room No: One where Syed Nazrul Islam was already con-

fined. They were shot inside the prison cell of the jail. Another group of four later came and charged the leaders with bayonets soon after the first group left the jail. The second group which charged the four leaders with bayonets, however, remained unidentified, the investigators said.

During the investigation, the CID recorded the judicial statements of three persons, one accused and two witnesses. under Section 164 of the Code of Criminal Procedure

Of the accused, CID recorded the judicial statement of Taheruddin Thakur. Besides, two witnesses -- informant Abdul Awal, the then DIG (Prison) and the then IG (Prison) Nuruzzaman -- gave judicial statements.

The CID investigators, however, were not able to recover the FIR that was filed with Lalbagh thana by the then DIG (Prison). During the investigation, the

CID could not find the autopsy report on bodies of the four national leaders, the investigators said, adding the witnesses include the doctors who conducted the autopsy of the bodies.
