Clinton was trying to clear the way for an agreement by Sunday, the end of four days of talks, but signs of discord were evident.

Fastest man

scaled Mount Everest in 20 hours and 24 minutes to become the fastest ever to reach the summit of the world's highest peak, reports IANS. Kaji Sherpa, a resident of

Solukhumbu district of Nepal. reached the Everest summit on Saturday to break Frenchman Mark Batard's record. Batard had climbed the 8,848-metre peak in 22 hours 29 minutes in October 1990. Sherpa started his ascent

from the base camp at 4 p.m Friday and reached the summit at 12:24 a.m Saturday. Information reaching here suggests that Sherpa had reached 8,700 metres at 6 a.m but lost three hours due to bad weather. "He resumed climbing after the weather got better and reached the summit at 12:24 a.m.," said a statement from Tuborg Speed Everest Expedition (TSE) '98 the organiser of the climb.

Had it not been for the weather, Sherpa would have climbed the peak in less than 18 hours as he had vowed earlier. organisers claimed. Sherpa led a five-member TSE team. Sherpa's 1994 bid to break Batard's record was thwarted by bad weather, which forced him to give up after reaching 8,400 metres in 12 hours. This is the fifth time the 33-year-old Sherpa had reached Everest summit.

Fuel pipeline burst: 100 killed in Nigeria

WARRI (Nigeria), Oct 18: More than 100 people scavenging for fuel from a burst pipeline were killed in southern Nigeria today when a fire ripped through the area, witnesses

said, reports Reuters. The death toll from the incident, described by one oil industry official as an act of sabotage, could reach 200 as many of those taken to hospital were not expected to survive, some witnesses said.


