

Tap technology to fight poverty: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday urged the scientists, technologists and engineers of South Asia to transform their innovations and endeavours for the welfare of the people, reports UNB.

"I am confident your efforts can help emancipate people from the curse of poverty," she said addressing the inaugural session of the First Convention of the SAARC Diploma Engineers Forum at the Osmani Memorial Auditorium in the morning.




