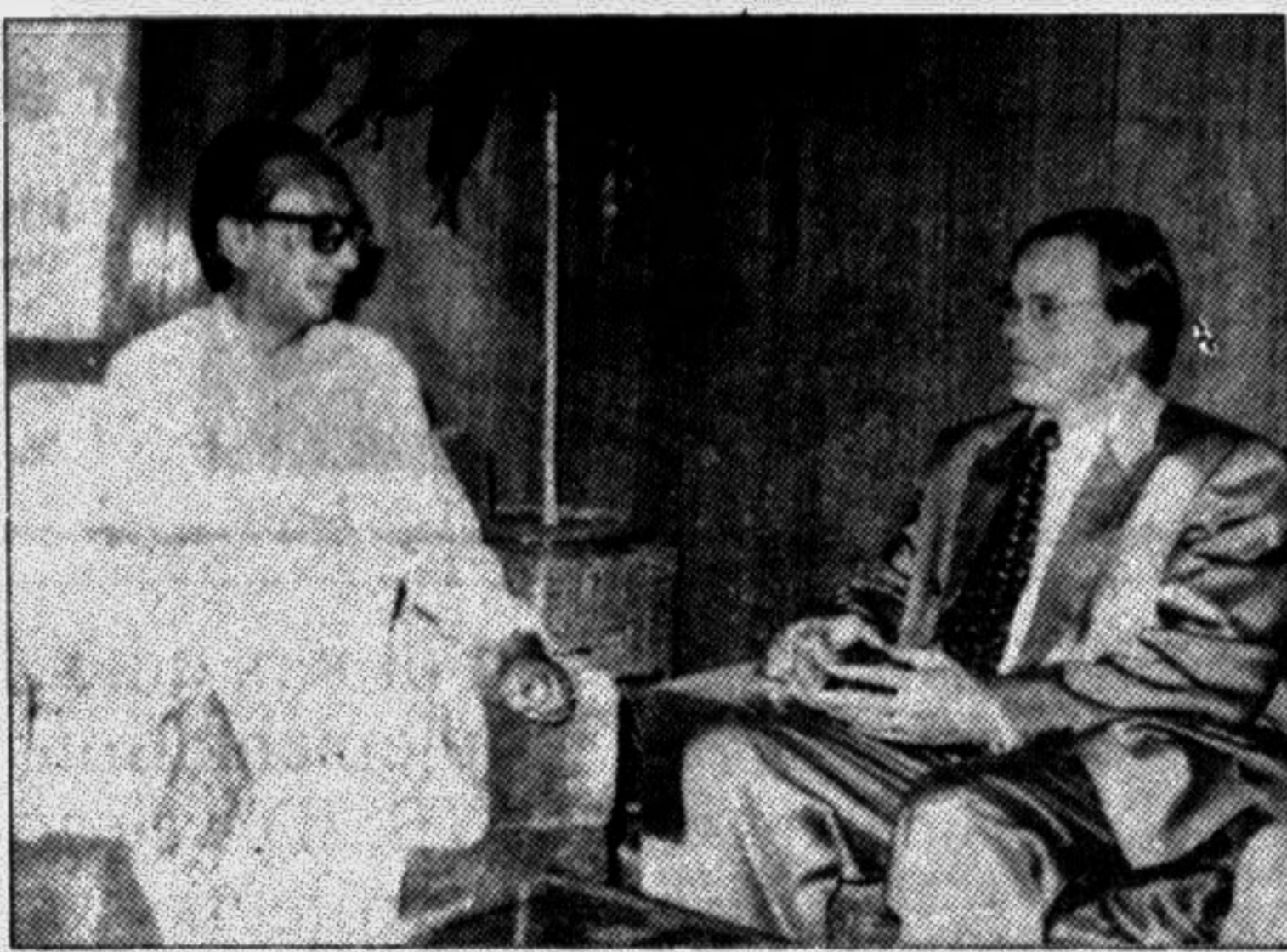
Receiving the donations at her office, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina expressed her deep gratitude for their generous assistance towards the distressed humanity.

## Swedish envoy calls on Zillur

The Swedish Ambassador Anders Johnson yesterday called on LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Zillur Rahman at his Secretary's office, an official handout said in the city, reports BSS.

They discussed and exchanged views on different aspects of bilateral relations and matters of mutual interests, particularly the Swedish assistance in the post flood rehabilitation and reconstruction of damaged rural infrastructures and installing the potable water treatment plants of different capacities in pourashavas and interior rural areas for supply of safe drinking water.

## Sugar production target 1.85 lakh MT this year

RAJSHAHI, Oct 25: Sugarcane crushing of current season of the country began yesterday with the expected production target of one lakh eighty-five thousand metric tons of sugar, reports BSS.

An official source said that the country produced one lakh sixty-seven thousand metric tons of sugar last year. "The production target of current crushing season might be hampered due to earlier flood in the country," the source added.

North Bengal Sugar Mills of Gopalpur began its crushing season with the production target of seventeen thousand six hundred metric tons of sugar by crushing two lakh twenty thousand metric tons of sugarcane, the source said.

Rajshahi Sugar Mills is expected to produce sixteen thousand eight hundred metric tons of sugar by crushing two lakh ten thousand metric tons of sugarcane during the current crushing season, the source said adding that the production of the mills will start from November 6 next.

Sugarcane crushing in thirteen other sugar mills of the country will start soon, in phases, the source added.

## Biman cargo sales centre opens at Banani

Civil Aviation and Tourism Minister Mosharraf Hussain inaugurated the Biman cargo sales centre at Iqbal Centre at Banani on Saturday, a Biman press release said yesterday, reports BSS.

Speaking on the occasion the minister said location of the sales centre at the new site would help increase the cargo sales and achieve the current year's target of selling 25 thousand metric tons of cargo worth Taka 130 crore.

In the last fiscal year the airlines earned a net revenue of Taka 106 crore by selling 22 thousand metric tons of cargo, the press release added.

Among others, Dr H B M Iqbal MP, Civil Aviation and Tourism Secretary Md Omar Hossain and Managing Director of Biman Air Commodore M Rafiqul Islam were present.

## One run over by bus in Comilla

COMILLA, Oct 25: A young vendor was killed when a speeding bus knocked him in front of Maynamati Cinema Hall in Burichang thana today, reports APB.

The deceased was identified as Mujibur Rahman, 20, son of Hazrat Ali of Kutumabapur village in Chandania thana.

Police said Mujibur received severe injuries when a Dhaka-bound bus from Companyganj ran him down on the Comilla-Sylhet highway while standing on a roadside at about 10:30 am.

He was rushed to the Combined Military Hospital in Comilla where he succumbed to his injuries soon after admission.

The bus sped away. A case was filed in this regard.

## Hatem Ali's 1st death anniversary observed

The first death anniversary of Hatem Ali Talukder, a former freedom fighter and veteran Member of Parliament was observed yesterday, reports BSS.

State Minister for Foreign Affairs Abul Hasan Chowdhury attended a memorial meeting, organised by Tangail Foundation, Dhaka, at the National Museum.

Eminent freedom fighter Bangabir Kader Siddiqui MP, renowned physician Dr Mirza Mazharul Islam and barrister Shawkat Ali Khan were present as special guests.

Terming Hatem Talukder, who was one of the founding members of Awami League and a close associate of Bangladesh, a 'silent worker' for mankind the state minister said he (Hatem) sacrificed his life for the welfare of the people specially for Tangail and Myemensingh districts.

## Death anniversary of Qulkhwan

The fourth anniversary of death of Abdul Haq Chowdhury, a noted writer and researcher with specialisation on Chittagong, will be observed today, says a press release.

Late Chowdhury has 11 books including a two-part book on history of Chittagong in his credit.

In observance of the day, Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) will hold a discussion at CCC auditorium at 4:30 pm. Besides, different other socio-cultural organisations have also taken up separate programmes to mark the occasion, the press release adds.

## Steps taken to empower women

KURIGRAM, Oct 25: Whip of the Jatiya Sangsad Prof Khaleda Khanam said the present government of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has taken various pragmatic steps to empower the women community, reports BSS.

"As part of the efforts, the government has brought the country's large number of womenfolk into the electoral process," she said while speaking as the chief guest at a meeting of the elected union parishad chairmen and members of the district here yesterday.

She called upon the elected representatives, especially the women leaders to dedicate themselves for the betterment of the lot of down-trodden millions.

## Donated flour found to be rotten!

CHANDPUR, Oct 25: Some 15 cartons of packet flour, sent by the Disaster Management and Relief Ministry to the district relief office on Saturday for distribution among the flood victims, were found totally unfit for human consumption, reports UNB.

Officials said most of the 3-kg paper-backed packets of flour were found containing black pests and emitting a foul smell.

"The bad stink spread over the area as soon as the packets were opened at the relief office close to the local press club," said the UNB correspondent.

The district relief officials said the flour was donated by Saudi Arabia as emergency relief and they received the cartons from the Relief Ministry.

Informed sources said the flour, donated by Saudi Arabia, was despatched on Saturday to 28 districts, including Chandpur.

Each of the packets contains the manufacturing date of 1417 Hijri with instruction to use the item within one year. Now is the month of Rajab, 1419 Hijri.

The official said they are yet to receive instructions about what to do with the unwholesome flour.

## 'Landless farmers to be provided with khas lands on priority basis'

NOAKHALI, Oct 25: State Minister for Land Akhbar Rashed Mosharrar today said the present government had formulated a complete policy on distributing khas lands giving priority to the landless farmers and women in line with the principles of the father of the nation, reports BSS.

"Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman had actively led the peasants movement and after assuming power enacted laws to protect their interest," he said while speaking at a workshop on khas land management here.

He added that the present government of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina formulated the khas land policy and formed representative committees at district and thana levels for its proper implementation.

District administration organised the workshop in collaboration with Association for Land Reform and ADAB, the apex body of NGOs.

Members of parliament Mohammad Shahjahan, Barkatullah Bhulu, Mohammad Fazul Azim, Divisional Commissioner of Chittagong M Sakhatul Hossain and ALRD chairperson Khushi Kabir, among others, spoke on the occasion while Deputy Commissioner K M D Abul Kashem was in the chair.

## Despair still grips tribal, non-tribal residents despite signing of CHT accord

Despite signing of the peace accord 10 months ago, tribal and non-tribal residents in the Chittagong Hill Tracts region are passing their days in hope and despair, reports UNB.

"We had hoped that peace would prevail soon after signing the peace deal, but we are here facing new problems of extortion and terrorism," bemoaned many people in the hill districts while talking to UNB last week.

Expressing their conflicting views about the peace accord, many urban people complained they are facing extortion and terrorism in a larger way compared to the rural areas in the CHT.

Shyamol, a Bengali trader of Banorupa market in Rangamati, said after signing of the treaty, people have started moving freely even at night, but a new problem has come up. Tribal youths have now resorted to extortion, particularly in the urban areas.

However, he is still optimistic that peace would finally come shortly.

Kothika Kisha, a Chakma living at Parachhara in Khagrachhari district and a student of Jahangirnagar University, is a bit frustrated seeing the dilly-dallying in implementing the agreement.

About relation between tribal and non-tribal residents in the hill tracts, Kothika said one day harmony must prevail.

Mohammed Farid Uddin, a student of class X of Shahid Abul Ali Academy in Rangamati, said there was no such terrorism as it was before signing of the accord. "We want to live together in peace," said the schoolboy.

An auto-rickshaw driver, Mohammed Hashem, 35, of Rangamati town, looked relaxed after signing of the peace deal as he can drive his vehicle at night if desired.

However, a timber trader K M Jafarullah said extortionists are disturbing them in running their businesses smoothly.

Suhovon Chakma, manager of the Hotel Dreamland in Rangamati, said he is doing brisk business after the peace agreement.

Hazrat Ali, 50, a new settler at Killa Pahar Para in Balukhali Union of Rangamati Sadar, said, "The signing of peace accord has put an end to unrest in the area."

Alli, a fisherman came from Sherpur district in late 70s, said before the accord, one used to pay about Tk 2,000 to Tk 2,500 annually per fishing net as extortion to Shantibahini members.

The people of this village live on fishing, driving engine-boat, making furniture and cultivating paddy, commonly known as 'jum'.

Some tribal and non-tribal people here also stated that they had to pay Tk 1600 for a 16 horse-power engine-boat. Tk

200 for each house and Tk 30 for sowing 10 kg of jum seed.

"The bad days are gone. We are now living in quiet without any disturbance from extortionists,"

Bangalee, Chakma, Marma, Tripura and Tanchanga people are now living together in the Balukhali Union of Rangamati Sadar thana.

"I feel free after the peace agreement," Bimol Chakma said, adding his family members remained always scared because his uncle who was an armed member of Shantibahini had surrendered to the army during the insurgency.

A former UP member Ayub Ali, 35, of Balukhali Union, whose forefathers had lived there for 100 years, said the present situation in the area is good. There is no demand for subscription by the Shantibahini now.

Brojomohan Chakma, 60, repatriated from Tripura on February 9, 1998, now staying at a refugee camp at Dighinala Model Government Primary School in Khagrachhari said he along with his family are passing a subhuman life.

He alleged that 13 families are residing in a school building. They have not yet been rehabilitated as the 21-point package deal signed between the government and the Jammu Welfare Association in April 1997.

Most of their land have been occupied by new settlers. He said the lands which were not grabbed by others have been returned to tribal people. They left the homeland in 1986, he said.

Dr Ashutosh Barua, general secretary of Rangamati district Awami League, said "We have succeeded to make tribal and non-tribal understand about the usefulness of the peace accord." Majority of the people have supported the agreement, he said.

To a query, Ashutosh said his party here took initiative to open talks informally with local opposition leaders on the implementation of the agreement.

"But response is mixed," he said.

Mohammed Zahir Ahmed, general secretary of BNP Rangamati unit, said the differences between tribal and non-tribal have widened after signing of the agreement.

He said after the agreement, it appears that tribal people have gained independence. Ahmed, however, admitted that a better situation is prevailing in the district since 1992.

A S M Shaidullah, Ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami of Rangamati, said the wide gap between tribal and non-tribal has broadened after the peace agreement.

The agreement, he said, has triggered conflicts between tribal and non-tribal, and tribal and non-tribal. Chakma and Chakma and the PCJSS and the ruling party.

The Jamaat leader said they will not hold any dialogue with Santu Larma's party PCJSS, but said they may sit with the government if it can assure them that the CHT peace accord would be scrapped.

## 1 killed, 2 hurt in Faridpur

FARIDPUR, Oct 25: A youngman was killed and two others, including a UP chairman, were critically injured in separate incidents in the district today, police and hospital sources said, reports UNB.

They said a group of unidentified armed miscreants stabbed Nazrul of Gopalpur area in the town indiscriminately at about 10:30 am. He was admitted to Faridpur General Hospital and died on the way to Dhaka.

In another incident, chairman of Komorpur Union Parishad, Barek, came under attack in front of the district Judge Court at about 2:30 pm. Miscreants cut his right elbow and tendon of his legs.

He was admitted to Faridpur General Hospital and was later shifted to Dhaka in a critical condition.

SP Abul Mabud visited the injured UP chairman in the hospital.

Armed men attacked Shawkat Mattabor, witness of an under trial case, with sharp weapons in the Judge Court premises at about 12 noon. He was admitted to Faridpur General Hospital.

## JS body for halting cat-fish cultivation

The Parliamentary Standing Committee on Fisheries and Livestock at a meeting yesterday suggested stopping cultivation of African cat-fish (magur) in the country after reviewing the report submitted in this regard by the Directorate of Fisheries, reports BSS.

The committee meeting, held at the Sangsad Bhaban, was presided over by its chairman advocate Mohammad Mosharraf Hossain, a Parliament Secretary press release said.

The report said the other species of fishes are being hampered by the cultivation of African cat-fish in the country.

Discussing the post-flood rehabilitation programmes relating to fisheries and livestock sector, the meeting underscored the need for the appropriate use of vaccines in order to preserve country's livestock and poultry. The committee advised the concerned authorities to examine the qualitative standard of the vaccines before use.

Committee members State Minister for Fisheries and Livestock Faridul Chandra Roy, Syed Rafiqul Haq, Kamrun Nahar Putil, Mozammel Hossain, Dr Mohammad Ali and Mohammad Fazul Huq attended the meeting.

## 'TMMC to help improve standard of treatment' Case filed against chairman of Bhoirabpasha union

JHALAKATHI, Oct 25: A case has been registered against six people including Chairman of Bhoirabpasha union of Nalchiti thana on charge of malpractice relating to Vulnerable Group Feeding (VGF) scheme, reports UNB.

The hospital, first of its kind in the country, was set up at a cost of Tk 30 crore at Konia in Gazipur district.

Addressing a press conference at the National Press Club yesterday afternoon, Managing Director of the hospital Mohammad Shamsul Haq said that the standard of equipment in the hospital is the best in the country and equivalent to any European hospital.

Of the total investment, Sonali Bank provided Tk 15 crore as loan, he said.

The hospital has three departments — Complete Cardiac Diagnostic Facility, Invasive Cardiology Department and Open Heart Surgery Department.

Haq said there is also an outdoor department in the hospital.

A renowned cardiologist Dr Wahidur Rahman and other heart specialists have joined the hospital which, he hoped, will help improve the standard of treatment of heart patients in the country.

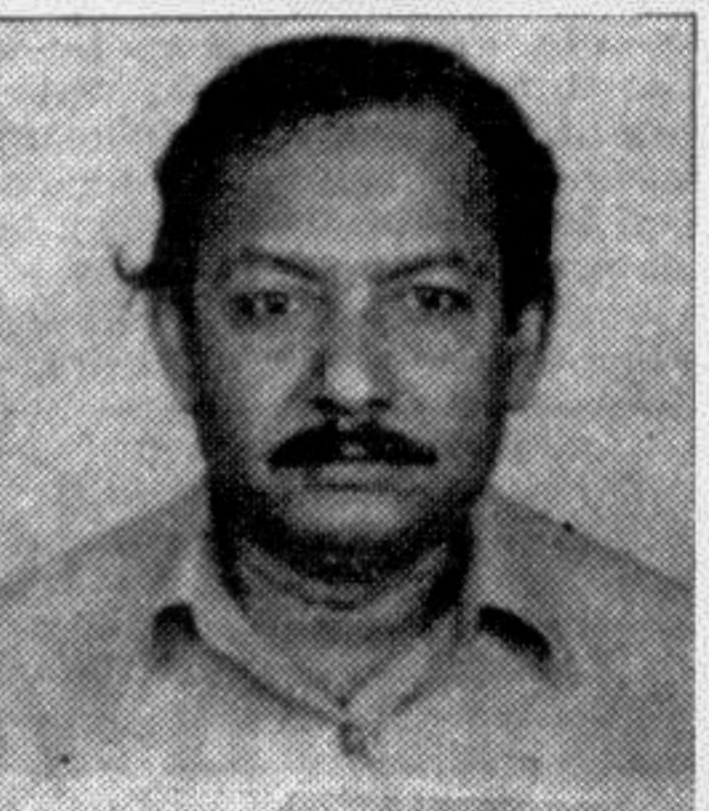
The managing director also said that the hospital was set up to provide modern cardiology treatment to the people and to save hard-earned foreign currency.
