Ince needs help

LONDON, Oct 25: Liverpool captain Paul Ince could be driven out of international football unless he receives support from the Football Association, according to joint Liverpool manager Roy Evans on Saturday, reports Xinhua.

Ince has been charged with misconduct by the FA after his dismissal in Sweden and faces an investigation into his alleged "V-sign."

The Liverpool midfielder has already had his automatic one-match ban extended to three by UEFA because of comments made to Italian referee Fierluigic Collina as Ince left the field in Stockholm. The FA has also vowed to get

to the bottom of the matter and Ince is likely to suffer more punishment before the incident is finally laid to rest. England coach Glenn Hoddle

has maintained a resolute silence as the arguments have dragged on.

But Evans has leapt to the defence of the man he bought from Inter Milan and he clearly feels that unless Ince starts to receive some support from the men from Lancaster Gate, the 31-year-old may consider quitting the international arena for

have four major tournaments -Stuttgart, Paris, Stockholm and Moscow - to play before the ATP finals in Hannover. It was not immediately clear





The "Wills Sports Cricket Book", authored by cricket journalist Kishore Bhimani, also gives a preview of the extravaganza expected in Britain next year.

"The book has tried to encapsulate all that went into creating the game's magical moments right from 1975," Bhimani said

The book tries to give details of every match of the world cup interspersed with off-field stories including the Karry Packer phenomenon, advent of colou-

red dress for cricketers and daynight games. 'Caribbean Conquest' is the rightly the title of the first chapter which recounts the victory of the West Indies under captainship of Clive Lloyd in the first two World Cups held in Britain in 1975 and 79. The next two chapters "Indian intervention" and "Technicolour triumphs" gives details of how South Asian countries dominated the next four World Cups in 1983. 1987, 1992 and 1996 either by winning the coveted tournament or organising it. The last section of the six

chapters is some sort of a pre-view of the World Cup '99 which is expected to have the largest television audience in the history of the game. The other two chapters deals with some of the important venues and players.
"It has outlined the whole

happening from uncertain beginnings to today's mega-event status of a sport that is a national passion, a binding force that unites an entire nation," International Cricket Council president Jagmohan Dalmiya said in a recorded message during the release ceremony.

Former Indian captain Kapil Dev was the chief guest of the function attended by almost all the Indian team members for the Wills International Cup Cricket tournament to be held at Dhaka from today. Dev presented a signed copy of the book to Indian captain Mohammed Azharuddin wishing the team best of luck for the

tournament at Dhaka and the

next World Cup. A separate

section has been devoted to the individuals known for their incredible achievements in the World Cup matches. Those from the West Indian include Clive Lloyd, Vivian Richards and Courtney Walsh. Kapil Dev. Sachin Tendulkar, Mohinder Amarnath have made it from India while those from Pakistan include Imran Khan, Javed Miandad, Wasim Akram and Inzamam-

Ul-Haq. Sunil Gavaskar is a no-

table absentee in the list from India. Sri Lanka, the present holder of the World Cup has three players in this section: captain Arjuna Ranatunga, his deputy Aravinda De Silva and explosive batsman Sanath Jayasurya. The International Cricket Council aims at expanding and popularising the game in newer areas. Dalmiya in his foreword to the book writes: "..with the ICC's unflinching resolve to globalise cricket it is not far off when we will see 16 more teams participating in World Cup Cricket." The first five tournaments was confined to nine countries only

"The success of the 1999 World Cup will surely provide the right impetus and inspiration for many cricketing contests to follow in the new millennium," Dalmiya said.
