



While many city roads and public places are already choked with hundreds of unauthorised markets, some unscrupulous people have now embarked on constructing kitchen markets illegally in

different areas of the city Despite complaints from residents in Sobhanbagh, Panthopath, Gulshan Section-1, Zigatola, Green Road and numerous other places, neither the Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) nor the Rajuk has taken any action against the growth of

such "nuisance" in the city. The DCC and the Rajuk are blaming each other for "failing to do something" in this regard while it is alleged that officials of both organisations are regularly collecting "handsome amounts" from the market or-

Officials of DCC's Market wing under its Revenue Department said it is Rajuk's responsibility to stop construction of unauthorised structures while Rajuk officials said all kitchen markets in the city have to obtain permission from the DCC and "therefore it is

DCC's job to stop the nuisance". At Panthopath, between Samorita Hospital and the under-construction five-star hotel, one influential individual has built a pucca kitchen market without any authorisation whatsoever.

The market with more than fifty stalls started operation from the first week of this month. Shopkeepers said they have rented the shops from one Yusuf Ali. Near the market, huge piles of garbage have been rotting for days. Residents said since it was not a designated spot for dumping garbage, DCC trucks do not clean it.

At Sobhanbagh, one Haji Saheb has built a huge market with more than hundred shops. A banner there reads: "Haji Nabinewaz Katcha Bazar. Shops are being allocated."

When contacted DCC's Market Wing officials confirmed that none of these markets were authorised. Blaming the Rajuk for this, an official said, if a decision cames from above to demolish such structures, then it should be done by the Estate Department of the DCC.

Estate Department officials said that those were very "sensitive issues" and so any move to demolish those "must come from above". "If the Market Wing officially asks us to demolish these markets then we will move our magistrates and bulldozers," an Estate Department official said.

DCC runs about 20 kitchen markets in the city. The rest are unauthorised, DCC sources

# PM orders Krishi Bank outlet at every union

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said the gov-ernment has decided to open a Krishi Bank branch at every union to make agricultural loans available at the grass-

roots level, reports UNB.
"For the first time our government has decided to provide loans to sharecroppers and marginal farmers without guarantee from land owners." she said at a review meeting of the Finance Ministry.

The Prime Minister chaired the meeting at the finance ministry that reviewed the progress of implementation of post-flood rehabilitation and recon-

struction works. Hasina said previously the sharecroppers did not get loans because the land owners refused to be the guarantors for the loan

of the marginal farmers. But now, she said, the bottleneck has been removed and the bank officials will scrutinise the applications of the marginal farmers and provide loans to them to boost produc-

She, however, advised the officials concerned to create awareness among the farmers to utilise the loans properly and payback the loans on time.

The system would continue not only for the current year, but also in future, said the Prime Minister who was also apprised of the activities of various financial institution.

The Prime Minister asked the officials to monitor the loan distribution system so the real farmers get the loans and the middlemen cannot grab

#### Khaleda may attend 2nd semifinal if invited as chief guest: BNP

BNP chairperson Begum Khaleda Zia may witness the second semifinal of the ongoing Wills International Cup at the Bangabandhu National Stadium if she is invited with due honour, reports UNB.

"Begum Zia may attend the 2nd semifinal if she is invited as the chief guest in a proper way," BNP's sports secretary Hafizuddin Ahmed said at a press briefing in the city yesterday. Former state minister for youth and sports Sadek Hossain Khoka also addressed the briefing

Both are members of the advisory committee of the Wills International Cup tournament. Hafiz said the advisory committee at a meeting on October 21 decided to invite the Leader of the Opposition at a semifinal as the chief guest. On October 23, he said, he informed BCB president Saber Hossain Chowdhury that Begum Zia had agreed to attend the second

semifinal of the tournament. He said the BCB president informed him that a formal invitation letter would be sent to the BNP chairperson.

But, he regretted that till now the BCB authority neither sent any invitation letter to Begum Zia nor contacted any BNP leader in this regard.

The BNP sports secretary said a ticket for Begum Zia was dropped at the gate of her residence at 10 am on the opening day of the tournament undermining the dignity of the Leader

The Prime Minister said the priority of the government is to rejuvenate the economic activities in the rural areas, increase the purchasing power of the people and alleviate poverty. Bank officials told the meet-

keeping their respective areas clean paying for the door-todoor garbage collection service. To avail the service, households are paying up to Tk 400 each annually. The money is being paid without any receipt and it is in addition to DCC's holding tax. In Dhanmondi, for instance DCC cleaners are charging Tk 30 a month from every household for daily collection "We don't mind paying the amount as long as our area remains clean," said Quamruzzaman, a government officia

living in the area. Although the business of door-to-door collection has reached millions of city dwellers, involving millions of taka, DCC does not officially recognise it. A DCC official termed it a multi-million taka black business'.

"We feel glad about the ser vice and we even encouraged such moves by giving away about 300 rickshaw vans to the ward commissioners," said an official of the Conservancy de partment.

In many areas, besides pri

vate entrepreneurs, the collection is organised by the respective ward commissioners under whom certain number of DCC cleaners have been assigned with wheelbarrows, brooms and other tools. Conservancy officials said on an average, every Ward Commissioner in the city has 55 cleaners working under him. There are over 5,000 cleaners working under the

These cleaners are to report to the respective commissioners on daily basis and ensure cleanliness of the wards as per their direction. The cleaners get their pay only after the ward commissioners give clearance But none of the DCC officials could say where the 'collection money goes or whether the money is spent on development activities in the wards.

The door-to-door garbage collection was initiated by some local enthusiasts in Kalabagan area. DCC is yet to take any step for garbage recycling. The only recycling is done in the informal sector.

## No ULFA business venture in Bangladesh: Mustafiz

The government has no information about any business venture run by the ULFA (United Liberation Front of Assam) guerillas in Bangladesh as has been claimed in a publica-tion of the Indian Ministry of Home Affairs, Foreign Secre-tary Mustafizur Rahman said

yesterday.
This is "spurious information", he said.

Talking to BSS at his office yesterday afternoon, Rahman said the Indian Home Ministry's publication 'Bleeding As-sam' has been received in the Foreign Ministry. "It contains some unsubstantiated allega-tions against Bangladesh," he

It has been alleged that the ULFA got sanctuary in Bangladesh and put all their money into Bangladeshi banks. It has also been stated that ULFA operates a number of business houses in Bangladesh which include media consultancy, soft drink manufactur-

ing, hotel, private clinics, mo-

tor driving schools, groceries, shops, drug stores, poultry farms and such other income generating projects.

Earlier, Rahman, responding to a BBC report on the 'Bleeding Assam' monitored and published by newspapers here, stated that there was 'no truth in the allegation that Bangladesh was providing shel-ter to the Indian insurgents.

The Foreign Secretary said "as have been stated on a number of occasions earlier, the territory of Bangladesh will not be allowed to be used against its neighbours". He stressed that the arrest, trial and conviction of Anup Chetia, the ULFA leader, and his associates are "testimony to Bangladesh government's resolve not to give support or sanctuary to insur-

gents from across the border.' The Foreign Secretary said "it is unfortunate that Indian Home Ministry has chosen to publish such a spurious information without verification."

From Page 1 gard. But the ministry sent the file back as it was not convinced about Petrobangla's move to shortlist six companies when none of them fulfilled the criteria. The Petrobangla chairman has now asked the bid evaluation committee to review the documents of all the 22 bidders and shortlist six companies.

The evaluation committee however told the Petrobangla chief that the review under the existing criteria would not change the score of the bidders. The committee suggested rewriting the guidelines.

The evaluation criteria took into account such points as major activities of the bidder, general experience, clients' lists, involvement in PSC activities in the last five years. CVs of expatriate and local experts etc.

The companies that participated in the bid include Arthur Andersen, Avasthi & Associates, Global etc. "It is interesting that the se-

lection criteria of Petrobangla were so tough that a company like Arthur Andersen -- which was government's consultant for the second round block bidding -- did not qualify," said a source.

Petrobangla sources said that the idea of hiring of foreign consultants to help the government monitor foreign oil and gas companies' work was initially resisted on the argument that it would be suicidal as foreign consultants would fail to see Bangladesh's perspec-

However, the authorities went ahead with the process of hiring foreign consultants. "The criteria have been set

ideally to ensure that the foreign consultant would be thoroughly experienced in such monitoring," said one Petrobangla official.

Another source said that the bid participants were more or less qualified and experienced "But no private company in the world can have the total experience of PSC monitoring -which is basically a task of a government," said he.

The already signed PSCs are raising questions about their profitability from the Bangladesh point of view. Experts say because of

Bangladesh's weakness in PSC monitoring, British company Cairn could hike the approved budget for Sangu gasfield to US\$ 264 million from 178 million. Lack of monitoring is also cited as a reason why the Magurchhara explosion (in Occidental's block) took place.


