

STUTTGART, Nov 2: Dutchman Richard Krajicek slammed down 21 aces in an awedisplay of

power tennis to crush Yevgeny Kafelnikov in straight sets in the final of the Eurocard Open on Sunday, reports AFP. Krajicek, the 11th seed, rendered Kafelnikov helpless until

ending his opponent's agony by punching a backhand volley on match point to seal a 6-4, 6-3, 6-3 victory in the 2.45 million dollar indoor event. Kafelnikov, seeded 10th in a

tournament which featured the world's top 10 players, struggled with his serve and made a series of unforced errors. failing to earn a single break point in the one-sided battle which lasted just 85 minutes.

By winning in Stuttgart, where he lost to Czech Petr Korda in the final last year, Krajicek boosted his chances of a berth in the ATP Tour World Championship for the top eight players, which starts on November 23 in Hanover.

The 1996 Wimbledon cham-

pion pocketed a comfortable 376,000 dollars while Kafelnikov, who also won a Grand Slam two years ago - the French Open - had to be content with 198,000 dollars.

Currently 11th in the world, the 26-year-old Krajicek, who peaked at number five in 1997, is certain to rejoin the top 10 in the next ATP Tour rankings to be released today.

Krajicek broke Kafelnikov in the opening game of the first set, which he wrapped up with

A sharp forehand volley enabled him to build a 2-1 lead in the second set. A double fault by Kafelnikov later gave him three set points. He squandered the first two but on the third, the Russian hit a forehand wide.

Kafelnikov, who threw his racquet in disgust after being aced twice in a row in the seventh game of the second set, lost serve again in the third set to go 2-0 down before bowing out.

"I tried everything but nothing worked," said Kafelnikov. "When Richard serves that big. there's not much you can do."

The 24-year-old Russian, whose start to the season was hampered by a knee injury sus-tained while skiing, has won two titles this year but has been disappointing on big occasions.

"It's been a great year because I had a child," said Kafelnikov, whose wife, Mascha, last week gave birth to a baby girl. "But as far as tennis is concerned, it's been a disaster. I want to forget about 1998, I'm looking forward to

Krajicek has enjoyed a tremendous run here, knocking out Andre Agassi and Goran Ivanisevic before taming world number one Pete Sampras in the semifinals.

"It's been a great week," he said. "It will help me in what I want to do next, which is to improve my ranking. If I keep playing like that and if I stay fit. I know I can gain a few places.

Both Krajicek and Kafelnikov will now head for the French capital where the Paris Open starts today. Sampras will be there too, needing a good showing in his bid to end the year as number one for a record sixth consecutive time.

Snyder tames Rubin

QUEBEC CITY, Nov 2: Seventh seed Tara Snyder made the most of her first appearance in a WTA Tour final by rallying to defeat fifth-seeded fellow American Chanda Rubin 4-6, 6-4, 7-6 (8-6) on Sunday in the 164,250 dollars Bell Challenge, reports Reuters.

The 21-year-old Snyder earned 27,000 dollars for the victory. After finishing 1997 ranked 113th, the 21-year-old Snyder has vaulted to 45, thanks to quarterfinal show-ings in Amelia Island and Madrid, and is sure to move up in next week's WTA rankings.

Last year, Snyder won her first professional title at a Challenger event in Delray Beach, Florida and in 1995 won the US Open juniors singles title. This year, she advanced to the second round at all four Grand Slam tournaments.

Appearing in her first final of the year, Rubin was gunning for her second career singles title having won in Linz, Austria, last year, the 22-year-old Rubin continued her career frustration in finals, posting her sixth

runner-up finish. A former top-10 player, Ru-bin currently is ranked 38th in the world. At the 1996 Lipton championships, she suffered a broken wrist which sidelined broken wrist which sidelined her for seven months. Ecclestone's ambition

LONDON, Nov 2: Formula One supremo Bernie Ecclestone is planning to bring together the world's greatest tennis tournaments into one global championship, it was reported here on Sunday, says AFP.

Ecclestone plans to raise 1.2 billion pounds (two billion dollars) in a bond issue to fund his tennis project as well as his already published proposal to create a European football league, according to a report in the business pages of the Sunday Times.

Investment bank Morgan Stanley has been trying to raise the money by securitising the future income stream of Formula One Holdings (FOH), the company that controls Formula One. FOH is owned by trusts

whose beneficiaries are Ecclestone's wife, Slavica, and his two children.

The report quotes Ecclestone as saying that he had been approached to become involved in tennis.

"There should be just one championship," he said. "I'm actively talking to people involved with tennis and I think it will happen with or without me. It would be a good opportunity for the trust.

"The whole organisation needs overhauling. There are too many, tournaments. The ranking system is a joke and people find it difficult to know who is the best. I am looking at both tennis and football."






