Bangladesh rout Thailand 6-1 Hockey final against India tomorrow

Bangladesh set up a final clash with favourites India by thrashing hosts Thailand 6-1 in their last round match of the four-nation invitational tournament at the Bangkok National Hockey Stadium yesterday.

This is the first time that Bangladesh is playing a hockey final in any tournament.

The final will be contested at the same venue tomorrow.

According to a faxed message received here last night, Bangladesh led the first half 4-0. Centre-forward Ariful Haq Prince opened the floodgates in the eighth minute and captain Mamun-ur-Rashid doubled the score four minutes later from a penalty corner.

Prince, the young stalwart from Ajax, then struck twice in the space of four minutes to ensure Bangladesh an unassailable lead at the break.

Bangladesh, who recorded a hard-fought 3-2 win over Uzbekistan in the inaugural match and went down fighting to India 1-4, added two more goals in the second session.

Mamun struck his second goal of the match in the 42 minute while Shuvro completed the Thai rout scoring the sixth goal two minutes later.

Attack on Captains Walk

SYDNEY, Nov 3 (AFP): Vandals damaged busts of several Australian cricket captains on display in New South Wales and stole the one of current skipper Mark Taylor, a report said Tuesday.

The damage to the Captains Walk in the sleepy town of Coolamundra, the birthplace of Sir Donald Bradman, comes just weeks after cricket-mad Australia hailed Taylor a hero for his 334 not out against Pakistan.

Eleven Australian captains were honoured with the \$1,550 bronze busts in the walk, which was opened in August this to mark Bradman's 90th birthday, the Daily Telegraph said.

Eventually all 40 Australian captains will be on display, although The Don's bust is housed in Bradman's Cottage, a small museum near the walk.

Among those who had their granite bases damaged during the attack were Ian Chappell, Greg Chappell, Bill Lawry and Allan Border.

Taylor's manager, John Fordham, said he was "extremely disappointed" at the damage.

"I know Mark hopes that the bust stolen is returned and the appropriate action is taken against the vandals," he said.

Coolamundra Shire Council vowed to prosecute those responsible but said theft -- not vandalism -- was the likely motive.

"Vandals go to wreck things, these people were trying to steal the busts," said council general manager Shane Godbee. "The damage wasn't actually to the faces of the busts -- they tried to lift the busts from their bases."
