rk Philippoussis, who has been struggling since reaching the United States Open fi-

nal two months ago, got his game back together at the 2.2 million-dollar Paris Indoor Open on Monday when he defeated Danel Vacek of the Czech Republic 7-6, 7-6, reports

The 6ft 4in (1.91m) Australian, who now faces 10thseeded Petr Korda, fired down a score of aces during a tough 1hr 49min showdown on the Bercy Stadium show court in a match in which neither player dropped their serve.

Struggling at first to find his length and direction, Philippoussis, who had won only two matches in three tournaments since his loss to compatriot Patrick Rafter at the Open final, saved the only break point against him in his opening service game.

Vacek, better known as Yevgeny Kafelnikov's doubles partner, saved nine.

There were mixed fortunes for the other Australian players on duty. Todd Woodbridge staged a great escape act to beat awkward Czech Bohdan Ulihrach 6-3, 2-6, 7-6, but richer Richard Fromberg's disappointing run continued when he went out to rising French player Arnaud di Pasquale 3-6.

Woodbridge looked to be heading for the nearest exit from the tiny number two court tucked away inside the grasswalled stadium complex, when he dropped serve to trail 2-5 in the final set.

But the 27-year-old from Sydney dug his way out of trouble, threading a series of blistering passing shots past the stretching Czech and winning 11 out of 13 points in a purple patch to level the scores at 5-5. He then dominated the tiebreaker to earn a secondround match against secondseeded Marcelo Rios of Chile.

The powerful baseline hitting of France's 1997 junior champion Di Pasquale proved too much for clay-court specialist Fromberg, who had arrived in Paris with a dismal record of only one win from his five previous tournaments.

Henman on Tuesday., Di Pasquale, a finalist at Bucharest and a quarterfinalist in Lyon and Palermo, grinned at the prospect.

"I've seen him play about 10 times — nine times on the television." he said.

Henman is one of the players still in contention for a place in the elite eight-player ATP World Championship in Hanover later this month.

Swiss man-mountain Marc Rosset, a finalist here in 1994 but a qualifier this year, charged past Wayne Ferreira of South Africa 6-3, 6-4 to earn a second-round showdown with in-form 11th-seed Richard Krajicek.

The 26-year-old Dutch player, who won his 15th career title at Stuttgart on Sunday when he destroyed Kafelnikov in straight-sets, arrived for the tournament facing a dilemma.

The injury-prone Krajicek had been planning to have arthroscopic knee surgery later this month. But his unexpected success in Germany has propelled him back into the top 10 in the rankings and he. too. could now qualify for Hanover.

The 6ft 5in (1.96m) player from Rotterdam eliminated Andre Agassi, Goran Ivanisevic and world No. 1 Pete Sampras on his way to his first Super Nine tournament success in Germany and he is now in eighth place in the race to qual-

Germans Nicolas Kiefer and Tommy Haas came safely through the first round without dropping a set.

Kiefer defeated Slovak qualifier Jan Kroslak 7-5, 6-1 while Haas eliminated Spain's Carlos Costa by the same scoreline.

Kiefer now plays Britain's 13th-seeded Greg Rusedski on Tuesday, while Haas will face sixth-seed Alex Corretja of Spain.

Veteran Italian Gianluca Pozzi notched up one of the opening day's major surprises.
The 33-year-old left-hander from Bari put out the 1996 champion Thomas Enqvist of Sweden 6-3, 6-3, further progress may be difficult, how-

ever, he now plays fifth-seeded American Andre Agassi. This year's tournament, which has attracted 19 of the world's top 20 players, has taken on a special significance because Sampras' top world ranking is under serious threat from Marcelo Rios and Rafter.

The 27-year-old American who is bidding to become the first player in history to top the world rankings for a sixth consecutive year, faces Thomas Johansson of Sweden in his first

match on Wednesday. Johansson survived stomach pains and on-court treatment on Monday to see off French opponent Sebastien Grosjean 7-6, 6-7, 6-4 -- thanks mainly to the accuracy and power of his big sliced serves.

Sampras has just three weeks left in which to confirm his status. After Paris, where he is bidding for a third triumph after his successes in 1995 and 1997, the American would apply for a wild card for either Stockholm or Moscow in an effort to win more points before the ATP Championship.

Three-times champion Boris Becker, 30, now-semi-retired but always a danger on a fast

indoor surface, opens his campaign on Tuesday with firstround match against French-

man Nicolas Escude. Magnus Gustafsson of Sweden reached a second round clash with 12th-seeded compatriot and 1997 finalist Jonas Bjorkman when he finally completed a 6-4, 3-6, 6-3 victory over Michael Chang in the early

Other late winners included Australian Jason Stoltenberg. who survived a whirlwind start by French Davis Cup player Guillaume Raoux to clinch a 2-6, 7-6, 6-4 win and reach a showdown against fourth seed Carlos Moya of Spain.

There will be no rest for Todd Martin, who stormed back after dropping a first set tie-break to beat Paul Haarhuis of the Netherlands 6-7, 6-4, 6-4 just before midnight.

Martin returns to the same tiny number-two court on Tuesday to play 14th seeded Goran Ivanisevic of Croatia.

BEIJING, Nov 3: China hopes to win its first Asian Games gold in the kick-fighting martial art of taekwondo in the Games next month in Thailand, the official China Sports Daily newspaper said Tuesday, re-ports AP.

The team of six women and three men will be China's first to compete in taekwondo at the Asian Games, the report said. China only began developing


taekwondo in 1995, a year after the last Asian Games, the newspaper said.

China picked up one silver and one bronze medal at the 1997 World Championships and won a gold, silver and five bronze medals at the Asian Championships this year, the report said.

With South Korea, Taiwan and Iran — the strongest tackwondo nations - all competing in the upcoming games, "the Chinese team's goal is to go all out to win one gold medal," it

Head Coach Chen Liren was quoted as saying that a recent decision by the sports' international federation to adjust weight categories for competitions would affect China's women. The team would not be dominant at any weight, he

2002 World Cup finals, amid concern over the country's depleted state coffers. The five-man delegation, headed by FIFA vice-president Antonio Matarrese, was briefed by Park Seh-jik, head of the

2002 World Cup organising committee, on the master plan to build stadiums and other facilities. "The delegates put a string of questions on South Korea's ability to complete the construction of transportation, ac-

commodation and stadiums as planned," a committee official told AFP. Park told them South Korea would have "no problems" in raising funds for the construction of hotels, stadiums and

added. On Wednesday, the FIFA delegates will tour three provincial cities hosting matches after inspecting the construction site for the main stadium in Seoul.

"The construction of stadiums here appears to be delayed. But I believe South Korea will be able to complete preparations as scheduled," Matarrese told Yonhap news agency.

Japan and South Korea will co-host the 2002 World Cup finals. The two countries will each host around half the games with the final being held

The crisis sweeping Asia had depleted South Korean state coffers. Government officials have promised not to scale down 2002 events. But some cashstrapped cities have been under pressure to give up matches, a move which requires FIFA's approval.

Meanwhile, South Korea is expected to actively pursue football exchanges with North Korea following the successful trip to the communist state by top officials of the Hundai Group, officials said today. An officials of the Korean

Football Association (KAF) said its chief Chung Mong-joon was likely to go to North Korea soon to promote football exchanges between the two Koreas, still technically at war since the 1950-53 Korean War.

"We do expect him to go, but no date has yet been set," the official said.

Chung, a son of Hundai Group's founder Chung Ju-Yung. said the time was right for him to go to Stalinist North Korea amid proposals that the reclusive state could host some of the matches of the 2002 World Cup finals.

"I heard that during the visit by Hundai Group to North Korea. North Korea's high-ranking officials had looked for me." Chung was quoted as saying by Sport Seoul daily.

Chung said he had already received permission from the Seoul government to make contact with North Korea, but did not think the time was right until now.

"I feel this is the right time

now," Chung said.

He said he had heard that North Korea's reclusive leader Kim Jong-Il had personally shown interest in football during the Hyundai visit and had asked why he had not gone to Pyongyang.

All contacts and visits to North Korea needed approval from the South Korean government as they are banned under the Draconian national security law. Chung said the trip to North

Korea by Chung Ju-yung had

opened a new era in sports ex-

changes between South and North Korea, which had been deadlocked for some time. "I plan to visit North Korea at this occasion and discuss issues related to football ex-

changes between South and North Korea," Chung said. Chung Ju-yung returned home last Saturday following his historic meeting with Kim Jong-Il, who gave his personal blessing for the launch of a lux-

ury cruise boat service to the


