MELBOURNE, Nov 4 (Reuters/Internet): Corey Richards smashed his third century in 12 days to lead a New South Wales fightback on the opening day of their Sheffield Shield cricket match against Victoria on Wednesday.

Richards, who also blasted hundreds in the recent Shield matches against South Australia and Queensland, was unbeaten on 114 as New South Wales recovered from the early loss of test openers Mark Taylor and Michael Slater to reach 263 for five by the close.

Taylor, playing his first match since returning from Australia's triumphant tour of Pakistan, was dismissed for 10 after he was brilliantly caught by Matthew Mott at short leg.

Slater then departed for 13 when he skied a pull-shot to Matthew Inness at fine leg. New South Wales slumped to

52 for three when Andrew Sainsbury followed soon after but Richards and all-rounder Shane Lee put on 113 for the fourth wicket before Lee was caught by Matthew Elliott at mid-wicket for 67. Richards, who was dropped

LAHORE, Pakistan, Nov 4: Australian hockey legend Ric Char-lesworth said Monday field hockey was in danger of dying as the game had not been sold and marketted properly, reports AFP.

In spite of his fears for the game. Charlesworth is confident field hockey can continue to be an Olympic sport.



MELBOURNE, Nov 4: Australian cricket captain Mark Taylor has urged star leg-spinner Shane Warne not to rush his recovery from shoulder surgery, with the first Test against England starting on November 20, reports AFP. Warne has been forced to sit

out a second Sheffield Shield match for Victoria, who play New South Wales at the MCG today but is under consideration for a one-dayer on Sunday.

The 313-Test-wicket taker has not played international cricket since the tour of India and Sharjah in April.

"Warne, I think, is being patient and that's good, we don't want him to rush back any sooner than he has to. He has to get his shoulder right," Taylor said here Tuesday night.

"The last thing that Shane and Australian cricket wants in a recurrence of the injury. "But it's be nice to have him

back in the Australian team some time this summer." While Warne bides his time

another player pushing for a Test spot is Victorian opener Matthew Elliott who carried his bat for an unbeaten 120 in the opening Shield win over Tasmania last month.

Elliott was dropped after the third Test against South Africa in Adelaide last January. Losing his spot to the man from whom he took it initially -Michael Slater.

"I know he has worked very hard in the off-season and looks like he's in good form and is very keen to do well and wants to get himself back in Australian colours," Taylor

Olsen mulls taking year off

OSLO, Nov 4 (Reuters/ Internet): Norway's former national soccer coach Egil Olsen says he is tempted to take a year off despite an offer to keep training Norway's Valerenga soccer club next season.

Olsen, who led Norway to the World Cup in 1994 and 1998. told the daily Dagsavisen on Wednesday that he had received an offer of a permanent post at Valerenga, where he has had a temporary contract since August after retiring as national coach.

"I've been on this merry-goround for 27 years...It's tempting to take a year off, think only about having a weekend free from soccer," he said in Turkey, where Valerenga will play Besiktas on Thursday in the European Cup Winners' Cup.

"I have received a contract proposal and also a wage offer' from Valerenga.

Valerenga, bottom of the 14strong elite division in early August and apparently on the way to relegation, ended seventh after winning almost all its games after Olsen took over. It won the first leg of the Besiktas tie. 1-0, last month.

Under Olsen's leadership. Norwegian soccer emerged from a 50-year backwater.


