Tyson sued again

LOS ANGELES, Nov 5 (AP/ Internet): John Horne, Mike Tyson's former co-manager. filed a lawsuit against the boxer on Tuesday, claiming breach of contract and seeking damages in excess of \$14 million.

Horne had filed a suit against Tyson's new adviser. Shelley Finkel, in state District Court in Las Vegas last month, seeking a 10-per cent share in any money Tyson makes from his next five fights.

Tyson, who had his Nevada boxing license reinstated Oct. 19 -- a day before Horne filed his suit against Finkel -- will reportedly return to the ring Jan. 16 against Francois Botha of South Africa at the MGM Grand. The bout would be promoted by America Presents.

In the lawsuit filed Tuesday in Los Angeles Superior Court, Horne claimed Tyson breached a contract that the two entered into with Showtime Networks Inc. along with co-manager Rory Holloway and promoter Don King on March 17, 1995.

Horne, now a movie producer in Beverly Hills, Calif., also claimed that Tyson has failed to repay personal loans of over \$50,000.

The lawsuit claims that Horne, Holloway and King -known as Team Tyson -- signed a contract with Showtime on March 17, 1995 that called for the group to handle Tyson's first 10 fights after Tyson was freed from an Indiana prison on rape charges, and that Horne would be paid 10 percent of Tyson's earnings.

India may bid for 2006 Games

CALCUTTA, Nov 5: The Indian Olympic Association is considering bidding for the 2006 Asian Games, IOA president, Suresh Kalmadi, said here today, reports PTI.

"We are thinking of bidding for the 2006 Asian Games, think it is high time we seriously bid for the Games which we last hosted 12...16 years back," Kalmadi said while addressing a meet the press programme at the Calcutta Sports Journalists' Club.

Philippines to send 276 athletes

MANILA, Nov 5: Philippine sports officials announced Thursday that at least 276 Filipino athletes will compete in next month's Asian Games in Bangkok, comprising one of the country's biggest contingents to the sporting event in recent years, reports AP.

Philippine Sports Commis-sion chairman Carlos Tuazon said 58 officials, funded by the government, and a similar number of privately funded heads of national sports associations will accompany the athletes.

Officials are optimistic the large delegation will improve on the performance of the 147member Philippine team at the Asian Games in Hiroshima, Japan, in 1994, said Pocholo Veguillas, head of the Philippine delegation.

The Philippines' shooting team has the largest number of participants with 27 members, followed by the men and women's basketball squads with a total of 24 players.

There are about seven athletes for boxing, the Philippines' most popular sport after basketball. In the Hiroshima games, the Philippines' three gold medals all came from

boxing. The Philippines has had difficulty assembling a large, welltrained contingent for the Asian Games as a result of the Asian crisis.

But the country, long a hotbed for basketball in Asia, hopes to challenge the region's current lords of that sport by sending its best prepared, a professional team to the

Bangkok games. As part of its preparation, the 13-man Philippine team is in the United States for a 22day training against American collegiate teams to simulate tough competition expected from defending champion China and perennial challenger South Korea.

Wu not so hopeful

BEIJING, Nov 57 China's Wu Yanyan, world record-holder for the women's 200-metre medley, warned today she did not expect to do well in next month's Asian Games, reports AFP.

The 20-year-old, who resumed training in July after a six-month physical and mental rehabilitation, said it would be impossible for her to fully recover her best levels before the Bangkok Games, which open on December 6.

"It is tremendously difficult to regain my best levels for the . Asian Games but I will try to reach a certain point." she told Xinhua news agency from her training camp in the south-western city of Kunming.

"Wu's coach Wu Jicai echoed concerns for her fitness and said her current training was unsatisfactory.

"She has been undergoing training for two weeks, which so far is not so good. She easily gets tired and doesn't breathe properly sometimes," he said. Wu set a world record of

2:09.72 in the 200 metre medley in the October 1997 China national games. In the World Championships

in Perth in January, Wu won the 200-metre medley with a meet record of 2:10.88.



Ticket sale worries BAGOK

BANGKOK, Nov 5 (AFP/Reuters): Asian Games organisers have admitted they will fail to reach their 330 million baht (nine million dollars) target for ticket sales at next months event. Deputy Prime Minister Bhichai Rattakul said

As Thailand and the rest of Asia fight a crippling financial crisis, ticket sales have failed to match hopes, Bhichai, chairman of the Bangkok Asian Games Organising Committee (BAGOK) said late Wednesday.

"We will not be able to reach that target," he told reporters. "We hope to get 250 million baht.

Bhichai said only 40 per cent of the tickets for the opening and closing ceremonies in a sparkling new stadium in Bangkok has so far been sold. "We hope that from now on

Bhichai said. Tickets have been on sale across the region for the December 6-20 Games, featuring 38 sports and 43 countries, since last month.

"The king will be lighting the torch on December 3rd at around 4 o'clock," Bhichai told the Foreign Correspondents' Club of Thailand. "He will light the Games with a magnifying

glass from the sun, he will not use matches," Bhichai said in a Wednesday evening address to

the club. The flame would be kept at Bangkok's Grand Palace until December 6, the opening day of the Games, when a team of runners will relay it to the new National Stadium in eastern

Bangkok for the ceremony. The first runner would be Prime Minister Chuan Leekpai,

Bhichai said. "Unfortunately, I will be the second one," the 72-year-old former foreign minister said.

Other runners would include veteran athletes and possible his son Bhichit Rattakul, the governor of Bangkok.
