Three S Korean athletes banned

SEOUL, Nov 5: Three South Korean female athletes have been banned from the Asian Games in Thailand next month after failing a doping test, officials said Thursday, reports AP.

"They are expected to be suspended for two years by related sports organisations in the near future," said Kim Taeyoung, a spokesman for the Korea Sports Council.

Identified only by their initials, the two gymnasts and one swimmer tested positive for furosemide, a banned diuretic that promotes weight loss.

The doping test was conducted on 210 national athletes two weeks ago.

On Thursday, fresh tests were conducted on six female gymnasts, including the two who failed the initial test. Officials plan to test South Korea's other 500 athletes soon.

It is the third time that South Korean athletes have failed drug tests. A female weight lifter and a male sprinter were suspended for using banned drugs in the early

South Korea plans to send 710 athletes to the 13th Asian Games to compete in all but three of the 36 events.



February LAS VEGAS, Nevada, Nov 5: The world welterweight title bout between unbeaten American Oscar de la Hoya and Ghana's Ike Quartey has been postponed until February, promoter Bob Arum said Wednes-

day, reports AFP. The fight, scheduled for November 21 in Las Vegas, had to be switched after De la Hoya was injured in training. He was cut above the left eyebrow by a sparring partner.

De la Hoya, who twice this year postponed a fight with Patrick Charpenter due to torn cartilage in his left wrist, required stitches after taking a blow while training at this facility in Big Bear, California.

The 25-year-old De la Hoya (29-0, 24 KOs) and 28-year-old Quartey (34-0-1, 29 KOs), both unbeaten, were set to square off at the Thomas and Mack Cen-

De la Hoya trainer Roberto Alcazar told the Los Angeles Spanish-language newspaper La Opinion that the cut was small but the fighter had been advised to rest for 10 days, a break that would make it impossible for him to be ready for November 21.

Dino Duva, representing Quartey, complained that Arum first told him that the cut would not affect the fight, then backtracked.

"I'm very irritated by the way in which this situation has been handled," Duva told La Opinion.

A new date for the bout has vet to be decided. Duva prefers February 6, while Arum would reportedly prefer February 13.

Poland given condition

WARSAW, Nov 5: Poland must solve the controversy over access to its Tatra mountain reserve if it wants to hold the 2006 Winter Olympics, the head of an International Olympic Committee team said Wednesday, reports AP.

Chiharu Igaya and 15 other members of the IOC group spent three days visiting the southern mountain resort of Zakopane. which is bidding for the Games. Igaya declared Zakopane

and Poland as a whole fit to hold the Games, but stressed that the question of using Tatra National Park should be settled first.

In August, a group of Polish intellectuals, including two Nobel laureates, protested the bid by Zakopane, saying the environment would be destroyed by venue construction and by thousands of visitors.

Much of the Zakopane area is in the Tatra National Park, established in 1954 to protect plants and wildlife. It was designated a natural reserve by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation in 1992.

Tatra National Park features Kasprowy Wierch, which is Poland's tallest mountain available to skiers at 6,557 feet (1,967 metres). It has two ski slopes, and park management has long resisted calls to build more lifts, saying it would damage the environment.



PAKISTAN SHOCK **NETHERLANDS**

FIH WILL INQUIRE

thority to decide that," the governing body's secretary said. Meanwhile, the FIH is also to review the structure of all its tournaments at its next meeting, FIH vice-president Man-

zoor Hussain Atif said.


