

Bergkamp to beat the fear in the air?

LONDON, Nov 8 (Reuters/Internet): Dennis Bergkamp is ready to put aside his fear of flying and join the Arsenal team on the flight to Athens for their European Champions' League match against Panathinaikos on December 9.

The Sunday Mirror reported that Bergkamp, who has not flown for more than four years, was discussing the possibility with manager Arsene Wenger and team-mates.

The English champions are bottom of their group after their 3-1 defeat by Dynamo Kiev last Wednesday. They face French side Lens at home on November 25 and victory in Athens could be vital to their chances of progressing to the knockout stage of the European Cup.

Bergkamp's fear of flying stems from a bomb scare on a flight from Dallas to Amsterdam in July 1994 and the fact that he had previously lost friends in an air crash, the paper said.

Bergkamp has dismissed as "ludicrous" the alternative possibility of a 49-hour overland trip to Greece if he were needed for the match.

"What would be the benefit of a journey that would leave me shattered?" he told the paper.

Graf, Tauziat enter final

LEIPZIG, Germany, Nov 8: Steffi Graf, back in action after a long injury break, beat Belgian Dominique Van Roost 6-1, 3-6, 6-0 in the semifinals of the Leipzig Grand Prix on Saturday to set up a final against France's Nathalie Tauziat, reports Reuters.

The 29-year-old German, playing her first tournament since an operation on her right wrist which sidelined her for two months, delighted the home fans with a battling performance against Van Roost, the third seed.

The former world number one, who has slumped to 22nd in the WTA rankings, will face a stiff challenge from Wimbledon finalist Tauziat in today's final of the 450,000 dollars event.

The French second seed recovered from a slow start to bat fourth seed Irina Spirlea of Romania 2-6, 6-3, 6-2 in Saturday's other semi.

It will be Graf's fifth appearance in the final here. She won the title four times in succession from 1990 and has never lost a match at the tournament.


"It was tough because she moves very well and she's fast," Graf said of her match with Van Roost. "I'm delighted because I didn't expect to get that far in a tournament so shortly after my operation."

For the first time in over 13 years, Graf, who started her career in 1982, is unseeded at a tournament.

For today's final, she can turn to statistics for inspiration. She has won all her previous 19 meetings with Tauziat, who was the oldest player to enter the event at 31.

"I have to be careful," said Graf. "Nathalie is playing really well at the moment and she will put me under pressure."

Titans' skin proves too tough for Lions' claws



MUNICH, Nov 8 (Reuters/Internet): So outstanding he had been their start to the season that TSV 1860 even thought they could win a Munich derby for a change.

Hit-man Hearn still packs a punch

DETROIT, Nov 8 (AP): Thomas Hearn called it the best punch he's ever thrown. Jay Snyder didn't dispute the claim.

Hearn, starting a comeback at the age of 40, looked like the Hit-man of old Friday night, taking just 88 seconds to knock out Snyder in a cruiserweight bout at Joe Louis Arena.

"The impact was so powerful. I've never hit anybody like that before," Hearn said. "I've hit people hard before, but that just felt like something exploded."

Hearn (58-4-1), fighting for the first time in two years, unleashed a three-punch combination that rocked Snyder before a crowd of about 7,000. He finished him off with a looping overhand right that caused Hearn to slip — leaving both boxers on the canvas for a moment.

The difference was that Hearn dominated right back up. "Once I started to fall off balance, the punch had already landed," Hearn said. "I tried, but I just couldn't stop myself. I got up fast, wasn't I? I've got springs in my butt."

Snyder, who earned 10,000 dollars for his trouble, was flat on his back for about two minutes. Handlers finally got him up on a stool in the middle of the ring, where he sat for over five minutes in the middle of a mob of Hearn well-wishers who rushed the ring to celebrate.

"I'm really disappointed because I really thought I had a chance to take him out," Snyder said. "That was no slip. I hit him with a left hand on the chin, and the left isn't even my power. I knew I had to jump right on him, because if I stayed outside, he'd kill me with his reach."

"But, as it is, he broke my nose. And then he knocked me out."

It was third time this year the 37-year-old Snyder (19-6) has been knocked out in the first round. The bout had been scheduled for 10 rounds.

It was the first fight for Hearn since Nov. 29, 1996, when he TKO'd Karl Willis in five rounds.

Snyder, who picked up the nickname "Swamp Man" during a Toughman contest about 10 years ago, was at a decided height and reach disadvantage to the 6-foot-1 Hearn. At 5-8, Snyder only came up to the Hit-man's chin.

Hearn, who weighed 147 pounds when he made his professional debut in 1977, carried close to 195 pounds into the ring against Snyder, who works as a maintenance supervisor at a manufacturing plant in Spartanburg, South Carolina.

His goal during this comeback is to fight four times and eventually earn the cruiserweight championship. If he succeeds, it would be the eighth world title for Hearn in welterweight, middleweight, light heavyweight and upper-middleweight divisions.

Hearn said he expects to fight Danny Lalonde in January.

Hearn won his last crown in 1995 with a first-round knockout of Lenny Lapaglia for the World Boxing Union cruiserweight championship. This time, he would like to win either the WBA or WBC cruiserweight titles.

Pete, Greg go for title

PARIS, Nov 8: Britain's Greg Rusedski reached the final of the 2.25-million-dollar Paris Indoor Open on Saturday when he defeated Russian Yevgeny Kafelnikov 6-3, 4-6, 6-3, 4-6, 6-4 in a tense semifinal, reports AFP.

And after walking off court he made it clear that he felt that he could go all the way and claim the title.

Rusedski said: "Every match I've played with him has been a good match. I lost 7-6, 7-6 to him in Memphis and the last match we played went four sets — and three of those were tiebreakers. I was a set up against him in San Jose before I got my wrist injury."

"But I definitely feel my game is better and tomorrow will be another test."

"I'm sure Pete is extremely motivated. He really wants to win this week. I've played some good tennis against him and just come to short."

The victory, which keeps alive Rusedski's hopes of qualifying for the eight-player ATP championships later this month, also avenged Kafelnikov's three-set victory over the British number-two's Davis Cup teammate Tim Henman in the third-round 48 hours earlier.

Earlier Sampras, who is bidding for his third win in the world's richest indoor tournament, had outdone fellow-American Todd Martin 6-4, 7-6.

Sampras, who showed no ill-effects from the back injury which nearly caused him to withdraw in his third-round match against Jerome Golmard of France, admitted: "My back felt as good as it can feel. It's amazing after the last couple of days and all the ups and downs."

Sampras, hoping to set a new record by finishing on top of the rankings for a sixth consecutive year, is currently in his 244th week as world number one — third on the all-time list behind Ivan Lendl (270) and Jimmy Connors (268).

Martin, who scored entertaining victories over Australia's world number three Patrick Rafter and fifth-seeded compatriot Andre Agassi, described the last few days as "this has been the best week of my season."

Martin, out of tennis for seven months in 1997 because of elbow and shin injuries, had now lost all but two of his 19 encounters with Sampras.

If Rusedski's grin looked even larger than usual after his win, Kafelnikov could not have looked more gloomy.

Frustrated after a bad start in which he trailed 0-3 after making two horrendous errors by hitting an easy overhead wide and then netting what should have been a forehand, the Russian showed his temper and was lucky to escape disqualification.

He was warned for hitting a ball into the crowd and moments later he had a penalty point deducted when he smashed his racket in anger to drop his opening service game of the third set.

Kafelnikov, a finalist here in 1996 (the same year that he won the French Open) remains in contention for one of the vacant spots in Hanover, but he can afford no slip-ups when he plays in Moscow next week.

He reached the quarterfinals in Stuttgart and was a semifinalist in Vienna and he has greatly improved his rallying — especially his backhand.

Until Saturday he hadn't dropped a set since arriving in the French capital.

Ironically against Kafelnikov, the Canadian-born British player, who set the world's fastest ever service when he hit a 239.7 kilometres per hour (149 miles per hour) effort at Indian Wells, was often let down by his main weapon.

He served eleven aces — but also in double-faults. A controversial line call, when the crowd clearly thought a forehand from Kafelnikov was on the line, caused uproar and Rusedski needed several attempts to serve.

"I'm not calling the line so I don't know that I did wrong. But the crowd got a little bit excited. They didn't like the call and they got involved in the match, which was nice to see."

"I like it when they get involved. I think I handled the situation pretty well. I kept calm and made sure I served the next ball in. I knew that if I missed that serve the whistling would get worse."
