SYDNEY, Nov 9 (Reuters/ Internet): Australian leg-spinner Shane Warne moved another stride closer to making his Test comeback when he was named on Monday as captain of the Victorian Sheffield Shield

Warne, who underwent shoulder surgery in May, was selected for the four-day match starting in Perth on Friday after successfully completing a one-day match against New South Wales on Sunday.

Warne returned figures of one for 23 from eight overs against NSW and is hoping to make it back to the Australian team during the upcoming Ashes series with England.

Australian captain Mark Taylor said he was pleased by Warne's progress but said he still doubted whether he would be back by the first Test starting in Brisbane on November 20. "It's great to see Warney

back," Taylor said. "He's bowling all right too. 'We've got our fingers crossed he'll be ready sooner rather






