C'wealth states urged not to grant asylum to convicts

Foreign Secretary Mustafizur Rahman Monday urged the Commonwealth states to reject requests of political asylum by those who were involved in the assassination of father of the nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and members of his family, a message received in the city, from London said, reports BSS.

The Foreign Secretary while leading Bangladesh delegation to the senior officials' meeting in London said, "The terrorists should not be allowed to escape the due process of law and a fair trial by finding asylum in foreign countries, including Commonwealth member states."

He informed the representatives of the member (Commonwealth) states that these terrorists should be handed over to the Bangladesh authorities so that they could undergo the judicial process.

The government will make all-out efforts to bring back convicts, a senior official of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Dhaka Monday.

A total of 15 former army officials were sentenced to death but only three of them were present in the dock when the judge read out the verdict Sunday.

Major (rtd) Bazul Huda was brought back from Thailand Sunday.

It is learnt that the convicts are hiding in some countries in North America and in Africa. The government has already sought Interpol's assistance to track down the killers and bring them back.

Faujdarhat-EPZ train service from January

CHITTAGONG, Nov 10: A special train service between Faujdarhat and the Export Processing Zone (EPZ) will be operated by January next under the supervision of Chittagong City Corporation, reports UNB.

The decision was finalised at the 17th meeting of the Chittagong Development Coordination Committee held at the City Corporation on Monday with its co-chairman A B M Mohiuddin Chowdhury in the chair.

An understanding was reached between the Railway authorities and the city corporation last week in giving train service on lease to the City Corporation to operate special train service.

The coordination committee meeting also decided to allow housing society business in the port city with certain conditions. A society must ensure facilities including setting up school, madrasa, mosque, play ground, road as well as sewerage system.

Weather Light rain likely

Prisoner escapes from hospital

A convicted prisoner escaped from the Mohakhali Chest Disease Hospital late Sunday night.

Mafizul who was sentenced to 13 years imprisonment in 1996 on charge of dacoity in Bhola was admitted to the hospital on August 31 under police custody. He managed to escape sometime after 10 pm Sunday, jail sources said.

They said Mafizul was shifted to Dhaka Central Jail from Barisal on August 14 this year for treatment of tuberculosis.

Two attending wardens of the jail -- Razzak and Idrish -- were suspended soon after the incident on charges of negligence of duty, said a jail official.

A case was lodged with Gulshan thana Monday.

More donations to PM's Relief Fund

Assistance for flood victims continues to flow in with the latest tranche of over Tk 26 lakh coming from home and abroad, reports APB.

It includes US\$ 50,000, equivalent to about Tk 24 lakh, donated by expatriate Bangladeshis in Saudi Arabia and Tk 144,326 by Bangladesh community and philanthropists in the United Arab Emirates.

The donations, in separate cheques, were made towards the Prime Minister's Relief and Welfare Fund, said an official release yesterday.

Another release says a sum

of Tk 1.27 lakh was donated to the PM's Fund by some organisations and philanthropists at home and abroad.

The contributions include Tk 50,000 from Prof A M Faruk, general secretary of Bangladesh Agricultural University chapter of Awami League, Tk 50,000 from Nani Gopal Choudhury of the Oman chapter of Bangabandhu Parishad, Tk 12,000 from M All of the Awami League in Oman and Tk 10,000 from philanthropist A Rahim of that country.

The amount also covers Tk 2,000 each from Deputy Director of Secondary and Higher

Secondary Education Board of Khulna Mohammad Nurul Islam and Modasser Ahammed of Rafidur Injection in Jeddah, and Tk 1,450 from Kopot Mela, a children's organisation of Chittagong.
