BONN, Nov 12 (Reuters/Internet): Bayern Munich's Brazilian striker Elber was fined by his club for receiving too many yellow cards.

Two other Bayern players, midfielders Stefan Effenberg and Mario Basler, were handed hefty fines last month.

Éffenberg was punished after being caught driving while over the alcohol limit and Basler for spending too much time at the Oktoberfest beer festival.

LONDON, Nov 12: Roy Evans has agreed to step down as joint manager of English Premier league club Liverpool leaving Frenchman Gerard Houllier in sole charge, English newspapers reported today, says

Early editions of the papers said that Evans had talks with the Liverpool board on Wednesday night where he declined offers of a move "upstairs" to a general manager's role.

Evans, in joint charge of team affairs with Houllier since the beginning of this season, had been under mounting pressure as Liverpool managed just one win in their last eight

Tuesday's 3-1 home League Cup defeat by Tottenham compounded the problem and Evans, connected with the club on and off the pitch for more than 30 years, agreed to let Houllier take sole control.

Evans, somewhat reluctantly, took over from Graeme Souness in 1994 but has failed to win the trophies expected after three decades of success at Anfield.

Much liked and respected by fans and players alike, he was sometimes considered "too nice" for the harsh world of management. He now appears to have completely severed his Anfield ties and is awaiting details of his pay-off.

Former France coach Houllier was reported to be bringing in former Lens coach Patrice Bergues as his assistant, to replace Dough Livermore who is also reportedly leaving.




