Int'l Financial Organisations (Amend) Bill '98 passed

Parliament yesterday passed "The International Financial Organisations (Amendment) Bill, 1998" by voice vote, reports

The Bill authorises the government to accept the proposed Third Amendment to the Fund Agreement and to accept any proposal for the increase in the quota of Bangladesh in the IMF. Piloting the Bill, Finance Minister SAMS Kibria said it was brought for technical correction.

He said the International Monetary Fund (IMF) reviews the quota of its members every five years. Following this amendment, the relevant law will not be required to be amended every year for receiving loan.

Khaleda refrains from giving reaction

Leader of the opposition in Parliament Begum Khaleda Zia has refrained from giving immediate reaction to the Prime Minister's announcement to renounce hartal.

"I am not aware of any thing about the statement," Begum Zia said lastnight.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina told a meeting with editors of national dailies and news agencies yesterday that Awami League would not resort to hartal when it returns to opposition. She also sought a similar pledge from the opposi-

"I am extremely tired after a day-long work. I cannot say anything now." Begum Zia told UNB when asked for her reaction at her official residence.

BNP Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiya also reserved his reaction on the Prime Minister's offer for renouncing hartal. "Let us see in tomorrow's newspapers what the Prime Minister proposed."

US, Iraq back to square one

BAGHDAD, Nov 15: Iraq has rejected US terms for an end to the crisis over UN weapons inspections, as conveyed through UN Secretary General Kofi An-

nan, diplomats said here today. They said US President Bill Clinton wanted a clear commitment from Baghdad that it would respect all UN resolutions on disarmament.

He also wants the Iraqi leadership to stop contesting the makeup and competence of the UN Special Commission (UNSCOM) in charge of disarming Iraq, the diplomats told

UNITED NATIONS, Nov 15: UN chief Kofi Annan today welcomed US President Bill Clinton's acceptance of an unconditional Iraqi decision to resume cooperation with UN arms inspectors, Annan's spokesman

Earlier the White House rejected Iraq's proposal to resume weapons inspections. "It is unacceptable." the US president's national security adviser Sandy Berger said in Washing-

An annex to an Iraqi letter offering compliance with UN resolutions on arms inspections was full of conditions and thus unacceptable, he said.

It is a highly conditioned statement, said Berger, it is not acceptable as we have received

Meanwhile, US President Bill Clinton has cancelled his trip to Asia for an economic summit, the White House said, and will remain in Washington to evaluate next steps on the Iraqi crisis.

Bangabandhu Murder Case

Four convicts file appeal petitions

The four convicts in the Bangabandhu Murder Case, now in the condemned cell of the Dhaka Central Jail, yesterday filed separate petitions appealing to the High Court against their death sentences.

Judge Kazi Golam Rasul sentenced to death 15 of the 19 chargesheeted accused in the Bangabandhu murder case on November 8 last. Four were acquitted.

Khan Saifur Rahman moved appeals for two convicts -- Lt Col (dismissed) Syed Faroogur Rahman and Lt Col (former act ing director BNCC) Muhiuddin Ahmed -- while Abdur Rezzak Khan submitted for Lt Col (dismissed) Shahriar Rashid Khan and Abdus Sobhan filed

for Maj (retd) Bazlul Huda. All the appeals were filed

The lawyers argued in their appeal petitions that the sentence of awarding death penalty by open firing squad was 'illegal, improper and expressive of the biased mind and attitude of the trial court through

The appeal petitions contended that the judgement was passed on basis of the charges framed illegally and not in accordance with law.

"The trial was held in noncompliance of the provisions of Section 94 and 95 of the Army Act as the joint trial of military service men with civilians and/or former military service men cannot be held," the petition filed by Khan Saifur Rahman said.

duced in the Special Tribunal of Additional District and Sessions Judge, Shahid Nuruddin, for recording of evidence in connection with the cases filed against him for possession of satellite telephone and foreign currency of 16 countries. The trial of the cases could

not be held as witnesses were not present in the court.

When produced in the court, Chetia submitted a petition to the judge to supply him necessary material for writing his biography while in jail. The court neither rejected the prayer nor passed any order Immediately.
