## JS told 242,849 get overseas jobs

during '97-98 A total of 242,849 people got overseas employment in fiscal 1997-98. Parliament was told yesterday, reports UNB.

Replying to a question from Shah Mohammad Abul Hossain (BNP), Labour and Employment Minister MA Mannan said wage earners sent Taka 6,748 crore in foreign currency during the last fiscal

In 1997-98, he said, 119,678 people were employed in Saudi Arabia, 48,821 in UAE, 29,634 in Singapore, 24,103 in Kuwait. 5,825 in Oman, 5,414 in Bahrain, 1,552 in Qatar, 1,407 in Libya, 439 in Korea, 83 in Brunei and 1.997 in other countries.

He said 10,120 Bangladeshis returned from Malaysia till November 6 last. Some 150,000 Bangladeshi workers were legalised in Malaysia this year,

Mannan said the government has discussed the issue of manpower export with some African countries.

In reply to a supplementary, he said there are over 400 legal recruiting agencies dealing with manpower export. The government and individuals' initiatives also helped create opportunities for overseas employment, he said.

Replying to Adv Fazle Rabbi (JP), he said none was sent abroad with employment following recommendation of any MP and the government does not have any such plan.

second session.


The discussants suggested that the number of magistrates judges as well as courts should be sufficiently increased for disposing of the pending cases speedily.

## Rampage in jewellery shops protested in Feni


