DID U' KNOW?

T HAT in addition to de-Lcathlon, pentathlon and triathlon, there is an event called Biathlon. It is an athletic competition for combined cross-country skiing and rifle shooting. Competitors carry a single-shot, small-bore (0.22 calibre) rifle and ski over prepared courses. Men compete in-dividually over six and a half mile or twelve and half mile distances. During the former they have two shooting competitions and in the latter four. In both cases the shooting sections are divided equally between prone and standing shooting, and in each position the athletes have five shots at a target 50 metres away. The relay event is 4.6 miles. Each member of the four person relay team shoots once prone and once standing and has eight shots to make five hits at each of the two targets. There are time or distance penalties for each target missed. The women's equiva-




