Drop-out of students highest in SSC level

Education Minister A S H K Sadeq informed Parliament yesterday that the drop-out of students is highest at the secondary level, reports UNB.

In reply to Haji Md Selim (AL), he said the rate of drop-out is 38 per cent at primary level, 43.6 per cent at secondary, 37.8 per cent at higher secondary and 39.6 per cent at higher education level.

The government has taken a number of steps to check dropouts from the educational institutions, the minister said.

Sadeq said the government has a target to achieve 100 per cent enrollment of school-age children which is now about 90 per cent.

He said cooperation of guardians and concerted efforts of teachers and education officials were essential to achieve the target.

On another question, the education minister said a total of 1,837 educational institutions have been brought under government coverage of granting money from July 1996 to June

In reply to Mirza Azam (AL), the minister said the report of the Education Policy Committee will be formally placed in the House soon.




