

### Calcutta ready to host Indo-Pak cricket tie

NEW DELHI, Nov 22: Indian communists have offered to host an India-Pakistan cricket tie if Hindu militants try to disrupt it elsewhere in the country. newspapers said today, reports

The communist government in the eastern Indian state of West Bengal said late Saturday the match could be played in the lestwing bastion of Calcutta, the Hindustan Times reported.

"We are ready to play hosts for the match and will offer all possible security to the members of the visiting (Pakistan) team," West Bengla Home Minister Buddhadev Bhattacharya was reported as saying in Cal-

Calcutta, also the home of Indian soccer, is the capital of West Bengal.

Firebrand Hindu militant leader Bal Thackeray has threatened to sabotage cricket matches between India and Pakistan if they are played in Bombay, which is ruled by his Shiv Sena Party.

Prime Minister Atal Behari Vajpayee publicly pledged to protect Pakistani cricketers and said he would not allow their matches to be disrupted by any-"No organisation or individ-

uals would be allowed to obstruct the Pakistani cricket team," Vajpayee told reporters after an election rally in the northern city of Jaipur. The Shiv Sena is an ally of Vajpayee's Hindu nationalists.
