

Record books at stake!

MONACO, Nov 22 (Reuters/Internet): A German proposal to scrap all existing world records and start afresh in the new century will be put to delegates at next year's International Amateur Athletic Federation council meeting in Seville.

Helmuth Digele, a member of the IAAF council which concluded its final meeting of the year on Friday, believes the move is necessary to restore credibility to the world record list.

If accepted the year's best performances from next season will be recognised as world records from January 1, 2000, which will inevitably lead to a rash of record breaking in the new year.

Digele told reporters in Monaco that some of the records had been set at a time when systematic state-controlled doping programmes were the norm in countries belonging to the old eastern bloc.

He said documentary evidence from the former East Germany showed conclusively that drug taking was essential to the athletes' training programmes.

"All through the 70s and also through the 80s there was this manipulation," he said. "But I don't want to take away world records. Let us start again in the new century with new records."

The women's world record list, particularly in the field events, lends weight to Digele's contention that some records may be tainted.

Ten world records set in championship events have remained unchanged since freedom out-of-competition testing was introduced in 1988.

The women's field events provide the most striking evidence. No world record has been set in the high jump, long jump, shot put, discus or javelin in the past 10 years.

Digele said doping was still a major problem and called on the pharmacology companies to help the sporting federations.

"It's an overall problem and it's very important that we solve this problem in the near future," he said.

PM slams SOCOG

CANBERRA, Nov 22: Prime Minister John Howard criticised the Sydney Organising Committee for the Olympic Games (SOCOG) on Sunday, urging board members to stop squabbling in order to protect Australia's reputation, reports AP.

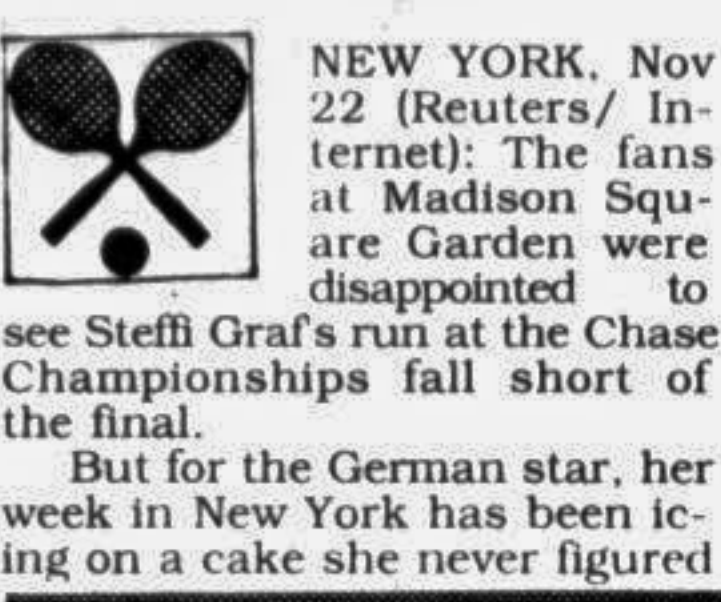

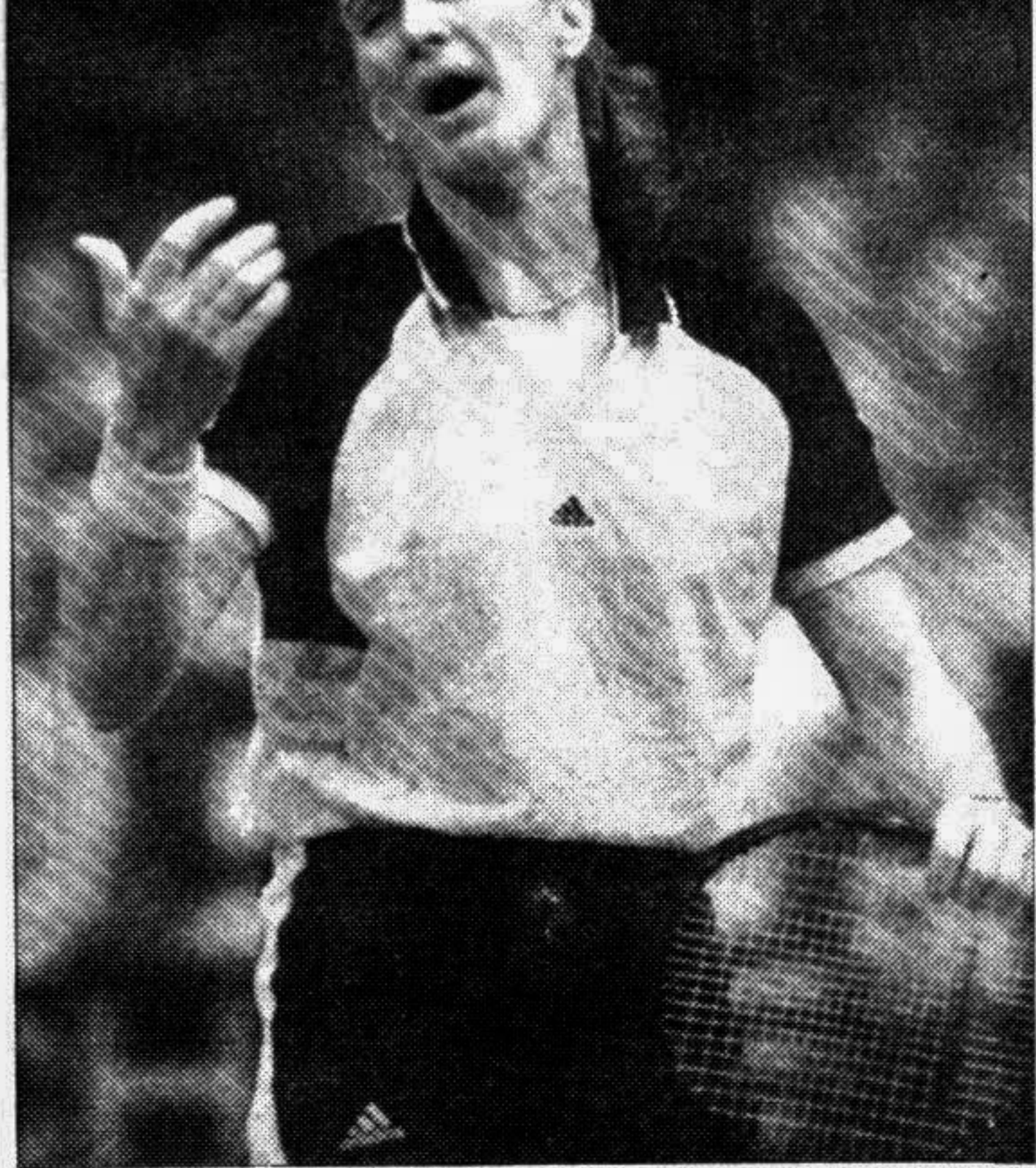

Frazier seeks \$84m in suit

PHILADELPHIA, Nov 22 (AP/Internet): As promised, lawyers for "Smokin' Joe Frazier filed a lawsuit Thursday seeking payment for 140 acres of land that Frazier owned in the 1970s.

The former heavyweight champion is seeking more than \$84 million from the companies and individuals involved in a deal to sell the tract in Southampton, Berks County, to an Ambler resident, Frazier claims he never received a dime in payment for the land and was paying to protect his interests. The defendants denied his allegations.

Frazier, sharply dressed in a dark grey suit and black fedora, told a news conference Friday that he's not out to hurt anybody. But he said he wants his land back.

"I don't want to rush anybody out of their home," he said. But he said the homes would be his if the matter weren't worked out.

Frazier's attorney and daughter, Jacquelyn Frazier-Lyde, had sent a letter to property owners last week that cited a "fraudulent transfer" and warned they were on his property.

"I think the homeowners are all a little bit disturbed and distressed about it," said Edward Wild, a lawyer for homeowners' association representing some property owners. "They don't understand why they've been sued. They all paid good money for their homes."

Wild called the prospect of people being put out of their homes "unlikely," but said the lawsuit will make it extremely difficult to sell a home or even refinance a mortgage.

Frazier-Lyde, saying her seven-year investigation had turned up evidence of fraud "that would blow your mind," wouldn't rule out going after the homes on the land.

"I could see it going to that extent because, I have to tell you, this is not a pretty situation," she said. "People have to be held responsible. Joe worked very hard to have something, and no one had the right to transfer his land without his consent."

The lawsuit said Frazier bought the disputed tract in 1973 with \$834,000 of his boxing money. Years later, he entered into an agreement with a company called Abcon Inc. -- whose principal was Ambler resident Werner Fricker -- to sell it.

not a lot of great points." Hingis, looking to end a puzzling six-month title drought, scored a 6-2, 7-6 (9-7) victory over 15th-ranked Irina Spirlea of Romania to earn one last shot in 1998 at the player who seized her top ranking and US Open crown.

Sunday's match -- the only best-of-five sets contest in women's tennis -- will mark the second championships final for

Hingis appeared to be in for a much longer day when Spirlea raced out to a 5-1 second-set lead. But the Romanian, who has a habit of mid-match mental lapses, watched as the 18-year-old Swiss sensation ran off six games to take a 6-5 lead.

After repeatedly failing to close out the set, Spirlea finally held serve to force the tie-break in which she squandered consecutive set points at 6-4 and 6-5 with backhand errors.

Spirlea saved one match point by depositing a backhand right on the baseline to make it 7-7. But at 8-7, after Spirlea sailed a forehand wide, Hingis had the match on her racket and belted a rare ace down the middle.

Graf, attempting to reach her seventh final in 13 trips to Madison Square Garden, was riding a 12-match unbeaten streak with two titles since a return from September wrist surgery.

The oft-injured German had won her previous three matches after dropping the first set. But her luck ran out Saturday as she suffered a hamstring injury in the third set that hampered her mobility and gave Davenport the edge down the stretch.

Graf had trouble getting her game together early as Davenport sailed through the opening set in 23 minutes.

But from 2-2 in the second, Graf began to serve better, keeping Davenport from teeing off on second-serve returns with more strategic placement on her initial delivery.

Graf served two love games and broke the top seed twice to run off four straight games and send the match into a third set.

With a 3-2 lead, Graf appeared on the verge of seizing control of the match. She reached triple breakpoint in the next game, when disaster struck in the form of a sharp pain.

Davenport won the next five points to level the set at 3-3 instead of having to face Graf serving for a possible 5-2 lead.

At the end of that game, Graf had her right thigh massaged by the trainer and then heavily taped.

The German star continued to play, but her ability to run was clearly restricted and Davenport took the last three games.

Davenport teamed with Natasha Zvereva of Belarus to capture the doubles title, defeating Natalie Tauziat and Alexandra Fusai of France 6-7 (6-8), 7-5, 6-3. The winners split 200,000 dollars, while the French pair shared 100,000 dollars.

both players, who last clashed two months ago in the Open final, Davenport reached the final here in 1994, losing to Gabriela Sabatini, while Graf claimed her fifth championships title by beating Hingis in the 1996 final.
