# Bankers colluded with top businessmen to burden NCBs with Tk 4466cr in bad loans

A special audit of the four nationalised commercial banks (NCBs) has unearthed widespread corruption in approving loans, which resulted into a colossal amount of defaulted debts.

The audit of the banks' 1996-1997 accounts also found that high-ups in the society including top businessmen had these loans sanctioned through insidious relationships with

bank officials. These banks are stuck with thousands of crores of taka in classified loans, much of which could have been avoided if the banks had followed their own rules and regulations in approving them, according to the audit reports submitted by the Comptroller and Auditor Gen-

The reports concluded several senior officials like branch mangers and general managers of these banks were responsible for the irregularities.

These "serious irregularities" included misappropriation of money through fake loan sanctioning letters, unauthorised loans and opening letters of credit (LCs) violating rules.

In 1996-97 alone, the four NCBs of the country created a burden of Tk 4466.26 crore in

classified loans, according to

the audit reports. The auditors also detected some serious irregularities in the banks including misappropriation of money through fake loan-sanctioning letters, release of unauthorised loans and opening letters of credit (L/Cs)

violating rules. In many cases, the officials of the NCBs were found involved with the borrowers in committing the crimes.

"The borrowers, in collusion with the bank officials, misaploans after a proper scrutiny of financial conditions of the borrowing institutions," director general of Commercial Audit Md Mesba Uddin Khan said in the reports.

The auditors scrutinised the books and records of 95 borrowing institutions of the four

They examined the documents of 29 Sonali Bank borrowers who received over Tk one crore each, 17 borrowers of Agrani Bank, 21 of Janata

Bank and 28 of Rupali Bank. The auditors found Sonali Bank's classified loans to 101 institutions were Tk 1385.42 crore till June 3, 1997. The entire amount was defaulted.

# Grief-shot parents seek justice

Parents of the two college students who were stabbed to death outside the Sher-E-Bangla National Stadium at Mirpur on Friday, yesterday appealed for justice and proper investigation into the killings.

The appeal was made by Shah Alam and his wife, parents of Imrul and Amjad Hossain, father of Rimon, at a press conference at the Jatiya Press Club.

Imrul and Rimon were stabbed to death and

two others injured when an open air concert to collect funds for flood affected people, organized by Joy Bangla Oikkya Jote, was going on inside the stadium Friday night.

Parents of the victims alleged that one of the seven persons arrested in connection with the murders was released by police after a telephone call from an MP. They alleged that Imrul was found in a fatally injured condition inside the Mirpur thana compound on Friday night.

### BNP's petition case against Home Minister rejected

By Court Correspondent The Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate. Dhaka yesterday rejected a Petition Case filed by BNP leader Md Ashraf Hossain against the Home Minister, State Minister for LGRD and five police offi-

In the petition, he mentioned that on November 7 when he was addressing a public meeting at Paltan Maidan as acting general secretary of BNP, he saw that AL terrorists attacked the meeting at the directive of Mofazzel Hossain Chowdhury Maya, State Minister for LGRD and Home Minister Rafiqul Islam. At the same time he saw that police under the supervision of DMP Commissioner and OC of Motijheel thana, threw tear gas shells and foiled the

meeting. The petitioner had prayed for warrant of arrest against the accused.

# Non-stop hartal, if needed: Khaleda

SYEDPUR, Nilphamari, Nov 25: Opposition leader Begum Khaleda Zia renewed today her threat of non-stop hartal until fall of the government, reports

Begum Zia's statement came a day after Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in Parliament on Tuesday reiterated her announcement that Awami League would never call hartal. She sought positive responses from the opposition parties, renouncing hartal.

"Our movement will go ahead to save the country and people from the misrule of this government," said the BNP

Referring to the Prime Minister's call for renouncing hartal, she, at a public meeting here said: "They cannot be trusted. Sheikh Hasina had breached commitments of not participating in any elections under the Ershad government with 15party and 7-party alliances. "Hasina herself became a

traitor by violating commitments made at Laldighi maidan in Chittagong where she had declared at a public meeting that those who would take part in elections under Ershad be condemned as national traitors," Begum Zia said.

"But barely 24 hours after her declaration, she changed mind for joining elections under Ershad. And the 15-party alliance fell apart, leaving 8 parties with her," the Leader of the Opposition observed in a flashback on the anti-autocracy movement in the 80s.

"So how she can be trusted," Begum Zia posed a question to her audience at Syedpur Pilot High School ground this after-

"Holding a mid-term election is the only way to prove her (Hasina's) statement right, as then Awami League will take seat in the opposition, and refrain from calling hartal as per its declaration. "It's true that at present she

(Hasina) will not enforce hartal as she is now in power," the former PM told the meeting. See Page 12 Col 8

The World Bank has approved 200 million US dollar credit to Bangladesh for a fasttrack emergency flood recovery project, reports UNB.

A WB release announcing the approval of the credit package in Dhaka yesterday said it is part of a broader effort to help the country respond to the devastating floods of July-September 1998.

This project will provide quick-disbursing assistance to maintain macroeconomic stability while helping finance import costs associated with restoring damaged infrastructure, production levels and

foodgrain stock. The credit is being provided by the International Development Association, the World Bank's concessionary lending affiliate, on standard IDA

NEW DELHI, Nov 25: India's ruling Hindu nationalists appeared set to suffer major reverses in key state elections today, according to early exit polls reported on state-run television, reports AFP.

The polls suggested that Prime Minister Atal Behari Vajpayee's Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) would lose power in New Delhi city and the northern desert state of Rajasthan after major swings to the main opposition Congress Party. However, the BJP was very narrowly ahead in India's

largest state, Madhya Pradesh,

COX'S BAZAR, Nov 25: The first batch of 46 Rohingya refugees belonging to eight fam-ilies returned to Myanmar through the Teknaf border point at around 8 am today, of-ficial sources said.

The resumption of repatriation ended a 16-month deadlock in the process. The last batch of Rohingyas went back home in July 1997.
