

Second British Trade Fair begins Dec 2

Encouraged by the spontaneous response in the last year's fair, the second British Trade Fair will be held in the city on December 2-4 displaying a wide range of goods and services and facilitating direct interaction among bilateral traders, reports AP.

Commerce and Industries Minister Tofail Ahmed will open the fair, which is gradually becoming an annual event with participation of increasing number of companies, business houses and institutions.

The Trade Fair includes an education fair and coincides with the British-Bangla Law Week beginning on November 29.

British Deputy High Commissioner in Dhaka Miriam McIntosh said the success of the first trade fair in March '97 had delighted them to hold the second one.

The fair will further help develop trade between Bangladesh and Britain, and diversify your exports," McIntosh told newsmen at Hotel Sheraton yesterday.

Second Secretary of Political Affairs of British High Commission Jon Geddes, Commercial Officer John

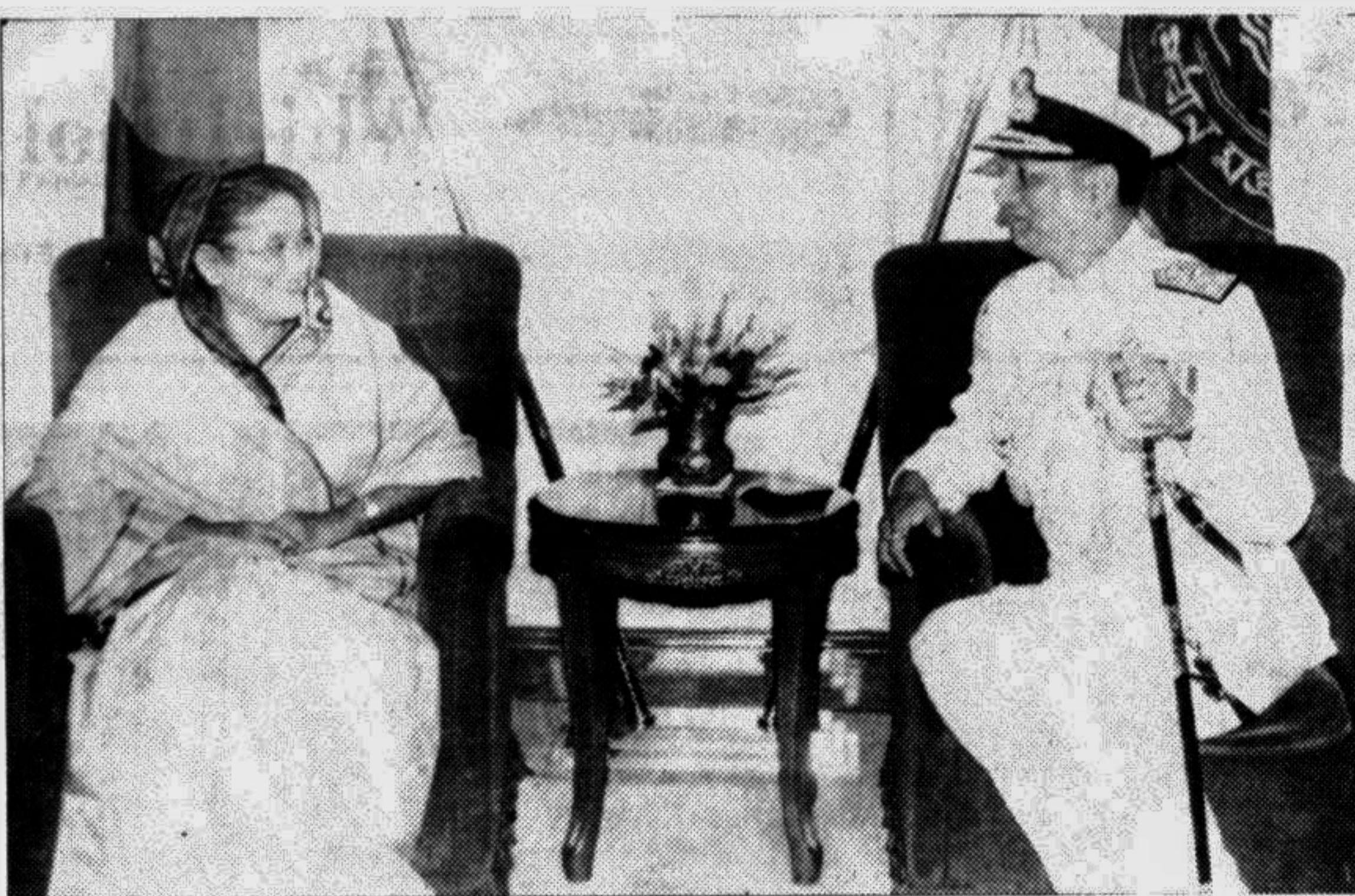
Chick, British Council Director Tom Cowin, Gender and Good Governance Adviser Farah Kabir and Education Promotion Officer Ripa Wallie also spoke at the press conference.

The three-day UK Trade Fair will provide a showcase for an extensive range of world class British goods and services that are available in Bangladesh.

British High Commission's Commercial Officer John Chick said the fair has generated huge enthusiasm and already attracted a "larger gathering" of 44 companies, while the number was 31 in 1997 fair.

British Council Director Tom Cowin said seven educational institutions — 3 universities and 4 colleges — took part in the last year's fair, but this year 15 institutions, including 10 universities, will participate.

Products on display will include generators, vehicles, tractors, security equipment and foodstuffs. Petroleum, chemical, electrical products, household and consumer goods will also be on display. The service sector will be well represented with participation of banking and finance companies and various consultant firms.

BNP trying to create artificial crisis: Zillur

LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Zillur Rahman yesterday said Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) is trying to create artificial crisis in the country and hatching serious conspiracies to destabilise the country, reports BSS.

The Prime Minister was addressing workers and leaders from different political parties who recently joined Bangladesh Awami League at his office in the Jatiya Sangsad.

Minister for Post, Telecommunications, Housing and Public Works Mohammad Nasim, Whip Mizanur Rahman Manu, ASM Firoze MP, Abdul Latif Mirza, Wazuddin Khan, Abdul Latif Biswas, senior vice-president of Pabna district Awami League M Saiful Huq Chunnun and president of district Jubo League Belayet Hossein were among others present.

The new entrants in Awami League are: General secretary of Bera thana (Pabna) BNP and former Upazila Chairman Mohammad Rowshan Ali, Jatsakini Union Parishad chairman and senior vice president of Bera thana BNP Abdul Gani Fakir, chairman of Masumdia Union Parishad Mohammad

Akram Hussain Akkas, chairman of Ruppur Union Din Gaffar, Puran Bharenga Union BNP president Dr Shamsu and others.

The minister said the opposition has become envious of the present government's success in tackling different issues like Ganges water sharing treaty with India, accord for establishing peace in Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT), Bangabandhu Shetu over the Jamuna river and most severe and prolonged flood of this century.

Rahman said different donors and international organizations have lauded the role of the government in the efficient management of post-flood rehabilitation and reconstruction.

He said this is the first time that the government has created credit facilities for marginal peasants.

The minister said Leader of the Opposition Begum Khaleda Zia wants to create obstacles in materializing the election pledges of Bangladesh Awami League through hartals and other programmes.

It said as three subsequent official holidays will fall at a time, unregistered general letters will be delivered on the day before Shab-e-Barat holiday.

FBCCI leaders meet Tofail Govt, entrepreneurs can help develop stable industrial base

Commerce and Industries Minister Tofail Ahmed has underscored the need for close cooperation between the government and entrepreneurs for developing a stable industrial base in the country, reports APB.

"Let us work together to convert the economic challenges into genuine opportunities for sustainable industrialisation in the next millennium," he said.

The minister was addressing the newly-elected president and other members of the Executive Committee of the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI) at the Commerce Ministry in the city yesterday.

"We want to start the next millennium with a fresh zeal" to attain progress, he told the gathering and called upon the business community to work relentlessly towards materialising the dream of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman for the economic emancipation of the country.

The executives of the apex body of country's business community focused on the macro issues for industrial expansion and referred to the establishment of a liaison office of the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation (UNIDO) in Dhaka.

They stressed the need for undertaking plans for giving

further boost to the small and cottage industries sector to ensure a vibrant rural economy.

The FBCCI leaders appreciated Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's no-hartial gesture and lauded the steps taken by her government to create an investment-friendly environment in the country, said an official release.

FBCCI president Abdul Awal Mintoo extended his organisation's full support to the government's development-oriented plans and hoped that efforts would continue for creating a sound environment to help implement their programmes for growth in industry and export.

Tofail said that after the construction of Bangabandhu Bridge, the government was concentrating on expansion of industrialisation in the country's Northern region and contemplating special incentives for setting up industries there.

He said the government was determined to ensure that contribution of industrial sector to the GDP was increased from the present 8.1 per cent to 25 per cent in the terminal year, 2001-2002, of the Fifth Five-year Plan.

To achieve the target, the government has adopted a private sector-led and export-oriented growth strategy, the minister said adding that "we are acting as promoters to the private sector."

Chief of Army Staff, Lieutenant General Muhammad Mustafizur Rahman, Bir Bikram, attended the ceremony as chief guest and distributed degree certificates among the gentlemen cadets who had passed the BA and the BSc examinations under the National University during their two years' course at the BMA.

Company Senior Under Officer Mohammad Sultan Mahmud Shyamal stood first in order of merit in the first division in the BSc examination with distinction in mathematics and military subjects. He was awarded Dr Muhammad Kurot-e-Khuda Gold Medal for securing the top position in the BSc examination. On the other hand, gentlemen cadet Ibrahim Faruk stood first in order of merit in the first division in the BA examination with distinction in military subjects and received Dr Muhammad Shahidullah Gold Medal.

More donations to PM's Relief Fund

Various organisations and individuals donated Tk 10.98 lakh and US dollar 19,868 to the Prime Minister's Relief and Welfare Fund yesterday, reports UNB.

Of the amount, Bangladesh Ambassador to Nepal sent a cheque amounting to US dollar 5,351.92 and US dollar 14,516.72 has been received through the foreign ministry.

The Headmaster of Shishubagh KG School at Rahmatganj in Chittagong donated Tk 4,000, officers and workers of National Savings Directorate Tk 39,500, Teachers' Association of Shahjalal University of Sylhet Tk 50,000, Bangladesh mission in United Nations sent Tk 10.03 lakh and Nutun Mulgram Darul Ulum Dhakil Madrasa in Jessore donated Tk 1,000.

Inflation trend upward: Kibria

Finance Minister S A M S Kibria told Parliament yesterday that there was an upward trend of inflation during the current fiscal year, reports UNB.

The rate of inflation was 7.25 per cent in September this year against 6.99 per cent recorded in 1997-98 fiscal year, he said replying to Kazi Sirajul Islam (AL-Faridpur).

The Finance Minister said that to keep inflation under control, the government has taken steps to import food in the public and private sectors according to requirement for sale in the open market.

The government is also pursuing a correct monetary and revenue policy, he added.

In reply to Fazlul Azim (BNP-Noakhali), Kibria said the government is considering a proposal to sell bonds in foreign currency to expatriate Bangladeshis.

Responding to Mizanur Rahman Chowdhury (Jamaat-Nilphamar), the Finance Minister said the country earned foreign currency worth 8,960 million US dollar, including 5,161 million US dollar from export in fiscal 1997-98. The amount is 6.41 per cent more than in 1996-97.

Hawkers protest eviction

Demanding rehabilitation for the vendors, they also threatened mass hunger strike on the street if they were evicted without taking necessary measures for their rehabilitation.

The hawkers will submit a memorandum to the City Mayor Mohammad Hanif today to lodge their formal protest in this context.

JCD demands immediate release of its leaders

Festival on Brecht begins today

A 13-day festival marking the 100th year of the birth of German theatrical genius Bertolt Brecht begins at the Goethe Institut in the city today.

The festival will be divided into four sections — film, theatre, exhibition and seminar. Today's inauguration will be followed by the screening of the film "The Three Penny Opera."

At a press conference yesterday, Barbara Meyer-Marroth, the Director of the Goethe Institute, said the festival begins with a documentary "Bertolt Brecht" which will include films of his work presented on stage, feature films which he made in the 20s and also films portraying his family and the place where he lived.

She explained that six films including "Galileo" and "Mother Courage" will be shown. There will be five theatre performances from Nov 29 to Dec 3 at 7 pm each day. The exhibition, she explained, will be from Nov 26 to Dec 8 from 3 pm to 8 pm. And the two seminars will be held on Dec 4 and 5.

Ataur Rahman, Director of Nagorik Natya Samprodaya, said that Brecht was the most popular European playwright in the developing countries, specially in Bangladesh. He said that "Galileo" was presented as a fight for the truth against the church, bringing in the clash between fundamentalism and the truth.

Ramendu Majumdar spoke of how Bangladeshis got exposed to Brecht during '71, when they went to Calcutta and saw Brecht's adaptations. He said that more of Brecht's works could have been revived in Bangladesh.

Mamunur Rashid said that Brecht had a great social impact on the theatre arena in Bangladesh and India and was far ahead of his times. He said that Brecht was aesthetically rich and not a writer with left leanings alone.
