



According to the WB release, the project will provide assistance for the agricultural sector to ensure that farmers have adequate supplies of seeds, fertilisers and other agricultural inputs for planning the next rice crop.

"This will also provide assistance for additional food imports in order to maintain and augment grain stock that would otherwise be depleted with the partial loss of two rice crops," it said.

In the flood-hit manufacturing sector, the funds will enable manufacturers to import machinery, spare parts and other raw materials, besides additional import of fuel, cemen and other construction materials that are needed for relief operation and repair of physical infrastructure.

As per the aid conditions, up to 20 per cent of the credit proceeds could be used retroactively for eligible imports for which payments were made after July 12, 1998, the date of the onset of severe flooding.

According to assessment by the donor agency, the floods will have a substantially adverse impact on economic growth in 1998-99.

"A preliminary assessment suggests that GDP growth this fiscal year could decline to below 4 per cent from the 5.6 per cent achieved in 1997-98. The agriculture sector is likely to suffer the largest loss," said the World Bank.
