## Swedish Davis

Cuppers STOCKHOLM, Nov 25: Defending titlist Sweden will rely mainly on veterans in the Davis Cup final against Italy on Dec 4-6, reports AP.

Team captain Carl-Axel Hageskog announced Tuesday a quartet of old hands including Jonas Bjorkman, Magnus Gustafsson, Nicklas Kulti and Magnus Norman.

Although Hageskog would not divulge his battle plan, it is very likely he will use Bjorkman and Kulti in the doubles. In the singles Hageskog has at least three players at his disposal

GENEVA, Nov 25: The governing body of European football outlined its plans on Tuesday for the new style UEFA Cup

competition and all but decided that it would come into effect next season at the same time as a revamped Champions' League, reports Reuters.

At an extraordinary general meeting of all its 51 national federations, UEFA recommended the new UEFA Cup, a merger of the existing competition and the Cup Winners' Cup, should be a knockout tournament from start to finish. Teams eliminated from the

Champions' League qualifying competition will, as now, take part.

But a further eight Champions" League sides — clubs who finish third in their respective groups and do not make it past the first round proper, will also enter the UEFA Cup at a later

In all, there will be 131 teams and eight rounds, including a qualifying round and a fi-

Although some UEFA federations expressed a preference for an alternative for a groupbased format in order to prise more television money out of the tournament, UEFA sources said the knockout version was certain to be approved at the UEFA executive committee meeting on December 10 and 11. Finishing touches will then

be put to the new, 32 team, Champions League which now appears certain to go ahead as planned despite efforts by the English to have the competition delayed for one season.

English FA vice-chairman Geoff Thompson tried to persuade delegates that the Champions League should be put off for another year.

But UEFA sources said that this was certain to be rejected next month.

UEFA general secretary Gerhard Laigner said: "There was some reservations about an early start, we made it clear that any new concepts have to start simultaneously because both competitions are interconnected. With proposed revenue ex-

pected to reach 800 million Swiss francs (567.4 million dollars), double the current sum, the smaller nations are campaigning for a similar increase. Currently all UEFA federations receive a minimum lump sum of 200,000 Swiss francs.

"The chances of any of us qualifying for the latter stages are slim enough as it is under the new format," Henri Roemer, president of the Luxembourg FA, told Reuters.

"I am all in favour of the bigger clubs getting a bigger cut, but unless the money is shared around better the development of the game in countries like mine will suffer.

"Let's free it, it's not only in the major countries where foot-

ball is watched on television." Among the other issues examined were UEFA's thorny relationship with the European Union and the question of multi-ownership of clubs.

UEFA called upon the federations to lobby their governments to stop the growing intervention of the European Union in footballing matters in particular central marketing about which UEFA is especially sensitive.

As far as multi-ownership, control of two or more clubs by the same company, was concerned the federations agreed unanimously to make every effort to ensure that business interests never interfere with sporting interests.

Despite UEFA's objections, two clubs owned by ENIC. Slavia Prague and AEK Athens, were allowed to compete in this season's UEFA Cup after the intervention of the court of arbitration for sport in Lausanne. UEFA are keen to make sure the practice is stopped so that

two teams owned by the same company are not drawn against each other, and the result manipulated by their joint owner. "I believe this is vitally important for the integrity of football," said Scotland's David Will, an observer at the meeting

but a highly respected vice-president of FIFA. "If you take the view that the owners main interests would be commercial there is an obvious conflict of interest."

Olympic Committee president John Coates admitted the resignation of high-profile Sydney organising committee board member Rod McGeoch was "embarrassing" for SOCOG and reflected badly on the 2000 Games ism scare in the Thai capital that forced the closure of the US organisers, reports AP.

McGeoch, dubbed "Mr. Olympics" by the press after heading the successful bid team. stood down Tuesday after days of infighting over claims he sought a fee to speak on the Olympics to a United States business delegation. tional Police.

Coates, also a SOCOG board member, tried to play down the significance of McGeoch's departure Wednesday.

"No doubt the issue's gone around the world but put it in context, it's one board member of 14," Coates said at a news conference.

But he admitted the latest in a line of significant departures was "slightly embarrassing," and there had been "some damage to SOCOG and the Olympics."

International Olympic Committee director general Francois Carrard said he was unconcerned about reports of disunity on SOCOG's board.

"The operations are in place and are running well and smoothly," Carrard told Australian Associated Press in London. Coates was the official who had briefed Carrard on the events and said he would discuss it further with IOC president Juan Antonio Samaranch at a meeting this weekend.

Fellow SOCOG board member John Valder used stronger language to describe McGeoch's decision.

"The resignation is enormously damaging to the board. Valder told Australian Broadcasting Corp. radio Wednesday. "Anybody who thinks the

board is going to sort of close the chapter on this today or tomorrow and open a new one I think has got another thing coming. This is going to leave a very nasty legacy behind it and I think it will take probably a long while for it to go away."

Coates said the resignation would reflect unfairly on SOCOG president Michael Knight, who is also the New South Wales state government's Olympics Minister.

Knight is considered a major source of the SOCOG infighting and conservative-aligned Mc-Geoch pointedly did not mention the Labour Party member in his resignation statement.

Coates denied that McGeoch was a frontrunner to replace Knight as SOCOG president if the Labour Party lost power in a state election next year. Coates said he had told McGeoch that he would not have the AOC support for the role of president or chief executive of SOCOG in 1961 before the Olympics were awarded to Sydney.

## AOC regrets Securing the Games

BANGKOK, Nov 25: Security efforts for the upcoming Asian Games have come under increased scrutiny after a terror-

Embassy, reports AP. A special operations centre to coordinate security for the 13th Asian Games, which will run from Dec 6 to Dec 20, was set up this week, said Maj Gen Chatchawan Suksomjit, chief spokesman for the Thai Na-

The centre was established after the embassy reopened its doors Monday after closing for three days in what embassy officials said was a response to a Nov 12 "worldwide caution" from the State Department of possible terrorist actions

against American targets. Senior police officials indicated the decision to close the embassy was just a precautionary measure to tighten up security procedures.

But local press reports claiming that Iraqi terrorists had entered the country underlined the need to guard against mayhem at the upcoming games, Asia's premier sporting

competition. The reports suggested the Games could be one

"The incident has raised our awareness of the need to be firm with security issue," said Chatchawan, who also commands the police's legal affairs division. "But from what we have gathered, the recent closure of the American Embassy was a safety-first measure."

Besides extra security measures for the embassy personnel, other agencies and the military are on an alert in case terrorist attacks are attempted, he said.

Interpol, the border patrol police, the immigration bureau and the Bangkok city police are some of the agencies that have been brought into the special operation command set up to prevent terrorism.

Five months ago, Bangkok's police formed a special 32-man counter-terrorism unit for the Games, which will bring 6,000 athletes from 41 countries to Bangkok.

The unit was commissioned after two months of special training in the use of different

of Intellectual Property Rights Protection to arrest the violators," said Santiparb. He said inspections have

been conducted in several garment centres and souvenir shops in Bangkok, where sales of non-licensed Asia Games souvenirs were spotted. Thailand expects to reap 5

million dollars from sales of souvenirs which have been copyrighted by the organisers of the December 6-20 Games, San-& tiparb said.
