Chief Justice traces history to highlight British-Bangla legal ties

Chief Justice ATM Afzal yesterday inaugurated the British-Bangla Law Week and said the common heritage of the two countries is reflected in their commitment to the rule of law and independence of the judiciary.

"We have a shared history of evolution from absolute to constitutional government. This heritage is reflected in our written constitution -- as in the unwritten British Constitution -- in the commitment to the rule of law, to the independence of the judiciary, and to the universal recognised human rights, which were embodied in the UN Declaration 50 years ago."

Some of the landmarks in this constitutional history are those where independent lawyers and judges invoked the supremacy of law over arbitrariness, the Chief Justice told the inaugural session of British-Bangla Law Week, organised to mark the 50th anniversary of the Declaration of Human Rights, at the British Council yesterday afternoon.

"I see it as a shared celebration to mark achievements of our common legal heritage, by members of the legal family, members of the Bench and the Bar, students and teachers of law, together with the many distinguished guests from Britain and from our neighbours," he observed.

He said the lawyers in the two countries not only speak the same language but also "share the concepts and values, which they apply in their daily practice."

"Chief Justice Coke in the famous Case of Proclamations in 1610 had led the judges to declare that 'the King hath no prerogative but that which the law of the land allows him' and that the King by his proclamation cannot create an offence which was not an offence before," Justice Afzal said.

"The long period of colonial relations extending over nearly two centuries is marked by tensions between the assertion of executive power and the law."

"While in colonial period there was no bill of rights and the judicial power was subject to substantial constraints, there are remarkable cases of assertion of judicial independence even by colonial judges."

"A great leap forward took place with the adoption after independence of a written constitution with a bill of rights and powers conferred on the High Court for judicial review of executive action and enforcement of the rights guaran-

teed by the Constitution.

"The constitutional jurisprudence that has grown not only in Bangladesh but throughout the region is based on a continuing flow of judicial decisions from the courts in Britain and from courts within the region."

"The constitutional guarantee of fundamental rights and the mandate to enforce those rights conferred on our Supreme Court has enabled our court to play an active role as the guardian of the Constitution and the rights guaranteed by it."

"The constitutional guarantee of equality has been relied upon to protect citizens against discriminatory and arbitrary exercises of administrative discretion. Public interest litigation is growing, which encourages public spirited citizens to play an active role in protecting the rights of the disadvantaged and those of the community."

Presided over by British High Commissioner in Dhaka David Walker, the opening session was addressed among others by Law Minister Abdul Matin Khasru, Attorney General Mahmudul Islam and Director of the British Council Tom Cowin.

President's pvt secy Aminul Islam dead

Aminul Islam, a member of Bangladesh Civil Service (Administrative) cadre and Private Secretary to the President died at the National Institute of Cardiovascular Diseases in Dhaka early yesterday. He was 59, reports APB.

Before taking up his present assignment in 1997 Islam served as Divisional Commissioner of Rajshahi and Joint Secretary and Additional Secretary in the Cabinet Division.

President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed visited the Eskaton residence of late Islam. He stayed there for some time, talked to the deceased's family members and consoled them.

The first *namaj-e-janaza* of Islam was held at Eskaton Officers' Quarter mosque. The second *janaza* was held at Banghaban premises which was attended by President Shahabuddin.

The third *janaza* was held at the Baitul Mukarram National Mosque after *Asr* prayers. Later, he was buried at Mirpur Shaheed Intellectuals graveyard.

His *qilkhwan* will be held at Anjali-3, Eskaton Garden Officers' Quarter after *Asr* prayers on Thursday.

He left behind his wife, three sons, one daughter and a host of relatives and well-wishers to mourn his death.

A man of amiable nature Islam was born at Chandrapura village in Sadarpur thana of Faridpur district. He wrote two books — 'Amla Kahini' and 'Ghure Elam Makkah and Madina'.

Four killed in separate incidents in N'ganj

NARAYANGANJ, Nov 29: Four persons including an infant were killed in separate incidents in the city today morning.

Hospital and police sources identified the dead as Rawshan Ara, 28, Sarmeen, one and half years, Sarwar, 25, and Mostafa, 20.

Rawshan, a gypsy and her daughter Sarmeen were run over by a Dhaka-bound truck at near Katchpur bridge on Dhaka Chittagong highway at about 9-30 am.

The victims died on the spot. The driver of the truck, however, managed to flee from the spot. However, Sonargaon police seized the truck.

In another incident, Shar-Char under Fatullah thana one Sarwar, an employee of a dairy firm, was electrocuted while he was doing his duty on the rooftop of his firm at about 7-05 in the morning. He died on the spot.

Meanwhile, the body of a garment worker was found hanging from the ceiling fan in a garment factory at Dharamganj under Fatullah thana today morning.

Bodies of the victims were sent to Narayanganj hospital for autopsy. Separate cases were filed.

Nasaka abducts 7 fishermen

Fake driving licence making materials seized: Five held

Navy ships recover smuggled goods worth Tk 45.83 lakh

Bangladesh Navy ships have recovered smuggled goods worth about Taka 45 lakh 83 thousand and arrested 20 crew with seven mechanised boats, an ISPR press release said in the city, reports BSS.

It said Bangladesh Navy Ship Shapla during a recent routine patrol apprehended one mechanised boat with seven crew carrying 109 tonnes of Burmese white salt worth about Taka 22 lakh 18 thousand (including the cost of boat) from near Sandwip.

Another BN Ship Shah Makhduh while patrolling in the Bay recovered smuggled goods including cylinder head, AC plant condenser coil, electrical parts and other illegal items with a country boat worth about Taka two lakh five thousand from near Hiron Point.

In another operation BN Ship Jamuna recovered 18 cartons Benson and Hedges cigarettes and three refrigerators alongwith two mechanised boats worth about Taka 11 lakh 90 thousand and arrested 10 crew near outer anchorage of the Chittagong Port on Friday.

Anwara Khatun's death anniversary today

Today is the 10th death anniversary of Begum Anwara Khatun, a member of erstwhile Bengal Legislative Assembly. She died in 1988 after a prolonged illness, says a press release.

Begum Anwara Khatun was a pioneer in Muslim women's education campaign and herself was one of the very few Bangladeshi Muslim women to have obtained MA, BT, LLB in British India. She was a close associate of Hussain Shaheed Suhrawardy, Moulana Bhashani and Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

She was one of the founders of Awami League and opposed the Muslim League government in the Assembly after the shooting of February 21, 1952. She was actively involved in the historic language movement of 1952. She represented Pakistan in the United Nations General Assembly and many other international forums and conferences.

Her eldest son Iqbal Ansari Khan is an Advocate of the Supreme Court of Bangladesh, and a former District Governor of Rotary International District 3280, Bangladesh, and has authored two books "The Third Eye" and "The Babri Mosque".
