# Trim defence budget, let vital sectors grow

Suggesting the need for a transparency in defence expenditures, speakers at a seminar yesterday called for containing the ever-increasing military budget to allow other vital sectors to grow, report agencies.

Such views were expressed by some of the experts at a seminar on "National Security of Bangladesh in the 21st Century" at the BIISS auditorium in

the city. Most of the speakers at the seminar, organised by the Bangladesh Institute of International and Strategic Studies (BIISS), said the defence budget should be minimised to divert more funds for development ac-

tivities and poverty alleviation. In his paper, Group Captain Ishfaq Ilahi Choudhury said there was need for people's participation in the policy making of the defence.

Arguing that defence expenditure should remain at its present level over the next decade. he said: "After all it is people's money and they must decide how best to spend it.

# Showcause on govt

The High Court yesterday ordered the government to show cause as to why it shall not be directed to refrain from "unwarranted and abusive exercise of power" under Section 54 or seeking remand under Section 167 of the Code of Criminal Procedure.

The HC also directed the respondents to show cause as to why they shall not be directed to strictly exercise power of arrest and investigation within the limits established by law and the constitution and in particular, the constitutional safeguards contained in Articles 27. 31, 32, 33 and 35 of the constitu-

A Division Bench of the HC comprising Justice A M Mahmudur Rahman and Justice Mohammad Muzammel Hossain further directed the respondents to show cause as to why they should not be required to comply with the guidelines

The Court also ordered the respondents to show cause as to why they shall not be directed to make monetary compensation to the families of victims of custodial death, torture and custodial rape.

"There is a disturbing pattern of arrests to raise money and after torture such persons are produced in the Court of Magistrate with a prayer for police remand in the name of investigation, but in most cases remanding to police custody exposes such persons to torture as a result of which deaths and serious injuries are Caused to them," the petition alleged.

In support of the allegation. deaths of Shamim Reza alias Rubel, Shima Chowdhury, and Arun Chakraborti in police custody and a list of about 200 people who died either in police custody or in jail custody, were mentioned in the petition.

Several senior party colleagues of Vajpayee attributed the drubbing of BJP at the hustings to the unprecedented rise in prices of essential goods particularly that of onion. Soon after the electoral re-

sults began pouring in last night, the Prime Minister had a 40-minute meeting with President K R Narayanan for what was officially described as a 'routine' exercise. Sources in BJP maintained that Vajpayee had not tendered the resignation of his council of ministers.

While the left parties and other anti-BJP groups once again asked the Congress to take initiative to form an al ternative government at the centre, Sonia Gandhi's party chose to maintain restraint asserting that it would not destabilise the Vajpayee government

The Congress, however, made it clear that it would not shy away forming the government if the BJP-led coalition ministry collapses on its own after the election results in the four states. According to results an-
