Dhaka for int'l cooperation, partnership for human rights

Bangladesh made a fervent call for immediate measures for guaranteeing human rights to women and children, specially the girl child, reports APB.

Making the country statement at a commemorative meeting at the UN General Assembly in New York, country's Permanent Representative Ambassador Anwarul Karim Chowdhury stressed the need for international cooperation and partnership for human rights.

The Bangladesh envoy said, "Our priority should be eradication of poverty," and, in this respect, he called for fulfillment of the right to development.

"Atrocities cannot be committed, human dignity violated, with impunity," Ambassador Chowdhury told the meeting organised in observance of the 50th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights on Human Rights Day on Thursday, according to a message received in the city.

Statements were also made by the President of General Assembly, the UN Secretary-General.



Japan urged to grant legal status to Bangladeshi workers

Bangladesh Ambassador to Japan Rashed Ahmed has appealed for granting legal status to some 14,000 Bangladeshi workers in Japan by providing them training visas, reports UNB.

As Japan afflicted by aging society and high cost of production, they have either the choice to relocate their industries abroad or import cheap workers from countries like Bangladesh, he said while speaking at a charity concert in Tokyo yesterday.

The concert was organised by three Japanese NGOs with the support of Bangladeshi community to raise fund for the flood victims in Bangladesh.

Rashed said Japanese companies highly praise Bangladeshi workers for their hard work, sincerity and commitment, according to a message received in the city.

The ambassador said while Bangladeshi workers are contributing to the Japanese economy, they live in fear of police particularly in the context of global movement towards a new world order involving free movement of goods, services and people across the borders.

IMC to help improve skills of Bangladeshi consultants

Institute of Management Consultants (IMC) Bangladesh will help improve professional skills of Bangladeshi consultants and save money by reducing dependence on foreign consultants, reports UNB.

The only institution of consulting professionals in Bangladesh, the IMC has already gained international acknowledgement by getting membership of the US-based International Council of Management Consultants Institute (ICMCI). IMC President Saidul Huq told a press conference in the city yesterday.

This acclamation will qualify Bangladesh's consultants to get Certified Management Consultant (CMC) status and to work anywhere in the world, he said.

The IMC will provide logistic and information support to its members to develop skills and build international network.

It will hold its first general meeting in Dhaka on February 3 in 1999 inviting leading consultants of the world.

IMC Bangladesh Chairman and pro-vice chancellor of North South University Prof Hafiz GA Siddiqui, Dhaka University Treasurer and also treasurer of IMCB Prof Shamsul Huq and East West University Pro-VC Prof M Musa were present at the press conference at Jatiya Press Club.

There are such institutes in South Asia. The other one is in India.

BIMST-EC meet begins Thursday

A three-day meeting of BIMST-EC will begin in the city on Thursday in a bid to give a concrete shape to the new economic bloc grouping three SAARC and two ASEAN countries, reports APB.

Bangladesh-India-Myanmar-Sri Lanka-Thailand-Economic Cooperation (BIMST-EC) was formally launched in Bangkok in December last year at a meeting of the five South and South-East Asian states.

State Minister for Foreign Affairs Abul Hasan Chowdhury led the Bangladesh team to the Bangkok meet while four other delegations were led by the deputy ministers of the respective countries in the meeting.

Foreign Minister Abdus Samad Azad is scheduled to inaugurate the Deputy Minister level meeting at a local hotel on December 19.

The meeting will be preceded by a two-day senior officials' meeting of the member countries.

The Dhaka meeting is seen here as significant in carrying forward the BIMST-EC to its cherished goal of a broad-based economic cooperation among the five Asian countries. It is expected to explore more areas of cooperation and lay organisational foundation of the bloc.
