New ambassador of Algeria to Bangladesh, Aissa Seferdjel, presented his credentials to President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed at the Bangabhaban yesterday, reports APB.

Welcoming the new envoy, President Shahabuddin said that the existing relations between Bangladesh and Algeria were excellent and the two countries shared common Islamic heritage and culture.

He recalled with gratitude that Algeria was among the first Arab countries to accord recognition to Bangladesh.

Algeria had also sponsored Bangladesh's admission to the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) during its 4th summit held in Algiers in 1973 which was participated by the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Rahman, he added.

President Shahabuddin said both the countries have identical views and perceptions on many regional and international issues, particularly those related to the Muslim Ummah.

He said both Bangladesh and Algeria are co-operating with each other in various regional and multilateral fora like the UN, OIC and NAM.

Reciprocating a similar sentiment, the Algerian ambassador hoped that the existing friendly relations between the two countries would be deepened further in coming days.

DU Library to come under Internet network soon

The Dhaka University Library is going to be linked with other libraries of the world through Internet as its computerisation is likely to start working next week, reports BSS.

The library will receive the latest technology and become up-to-date in the fields of computer application, both nationally and internationally, director of the computerisation project Dr Fazlul Haque said.

Necessary preparations for converting the existing manual information system into a computer-based information system (CBIS) are now in the final stage, he added.

The university authorities undertook the "Dhaka University Library Automation Project (DULAP)" for modernising the library work on which officially began last July.

The Taka 124 lakh project is expected to be completed by June 1999.

The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) donated a major portion of the cost of the project i.e. Taka 87 lakh.

The government of Bangladesh and the University Grants Commission (UGC) shared the remaining Taka 37 lakh.

Implementation of 9 road dev projects in Ctg uncertain

CHITTAGONG, Dec 22: Implementation of nine road development projects in the district, involving over Tk 13,400 crore, is still hanging in the balance due to bureaucratic bottleneck, informed sources alleged, reports UNB.

Besides, six other projects, including expansion of Hathazari Road (Tk 5,894.10 crore), Dhaka Trunk Road (Tk 999.66 crore), Foyez Lake approach Road (Tk 175.72 crore), CRB Road (Tk 180.77 crore) and Arakan Road (Tk 999.50 crore) could not yet see the light of the day from inside the files, they said.

But no development activity has yet been undertaken although the CDA area has been extended by 212 miles during the period.
