From July-November '98

Toll collection from Bangabandhu Bridge stands at Tk 21.60 cr

The toll collection from the Bangabandhu Bridge stood at Tk 21.60 crore during the last five months (July-November '98) against the traffic movement of 3,56,872 vehicles during the same period, bridge authority sources told BSS yesterday.

After opening of the bridge on June 23 last year, the Bangabandhu Bridge authority had set the target of toll collection at Tk 22.25 crore from July to November '98 against the projected traffic movement of 2,80,000 lakh vehicles over the bridge.

The sources said on an average 2215 vehicles plied over the bridge per day although bridge authority had set the target of traffic movement of 1740 vehicles. This is about 27 per cent higher than that of the target of per day traffic movement over the bridge, they said.

Giving a per day statistics, the sources said, the toll collection from the bridge stood at on an average Taka 13.40 lakh per day against the projected target of Taka 14.19 lakh.

The bridge authority has already launched a programme to computerise the toll collection system within one year.

The official said the feasibility study conducted by the World Bank (WB) and the Bangladesh economists had indeed shown a healthy economic rate of return (ERR) from the bridge.

The WB has estimated the return at 15.9 per cent while the Bangladesh economists calculated the same at 22 per cent, he added.

"It will not only pay off all its foreign debts with interest by the year 2033, but also earn an impressive net income," he said adding the WB, Asian De-

velopment Bank (ADB) and Overseas Economic Cooperation Fund (OECF) of Japan provided 600 million US dollars (each 200 million dollar) to construct over 800 million US dollars Bangabandhu Bridge.

According to the WB study report based on the anticipated daily traffic demand and its earnings as a facility provider for railway, power, gas and telecommunication, the project's economic viability has improved from 14.5 per cent to 15.9 per cent at present and it might go up further.

Considering the traffic growth rate for the period from 1993 to 1997, the report said the projected average daily traffic in the opening year of the bridge (1998) has increased from 1630 vehicles to 1750. These increased traffic benefits have raised the ERR by 0.6 per cent, the WB report said.

Istiaq Aziz Ulfat, Central Co-ordinator and Sadek Ahmed Khan, Chief Co-ordinator of Bangladesh Muktiyoddah Sangsad Kendriyo Samannaya Parishad, in a statement said the defeated forces of the '71 have been killing freedom fighters as part of their conspiracy.

Ctg Customs House fails to achieve target

CHITTAGONG, Jan 4:

Chittagong Customs House, the key revenue collecting body of the country, has failed to achieve its collection target in first six months of the current fiscal year due to hartal, flood, and lack of manpower and container scanning machines, reports UNB.

Officials said the revenue collected by the Customs House here fell short of the highly ambitious target by nearly Tk 150 crore in the July-December period.

The target was Tk 6,658 crore for the entire 1998-99 financial year and Tk 3,147 crore for first six months (July-December, 1998). But the revenue collection for July-December totalled Tk 2,997.66 crore, a shortfall of Tk 149.34 crore over the target.

1 killed in road accident in Ctg

CHITTAGONG, Jan 4: One fire service man was killed when a speeding truck ran over him near Jetty no-4 at Chittagong Port here today, reports BSS.

Police said, the fire worker, Mohammad Ibrahim (40), was crushed under wheels of a marine workshop truck when he was returning home.

Police seized the truck and arrested the driver. A case was filed with Bandar thana in this connection.

Crime situation reviewed

Inspector General of Police (IG) A Y B I Siddiqi yesterday held a meeting with the senior police officers at police headquarters to review the crime situation of the country, reports BSS.

After reviewing the pending cases of the year 1997 and 1998, the meeting observed that the number of pending cases increased in the year 1998 compared to the year 1997, but the number of cases related to law and order situation decreased.

The meeting revealed that the number of cases on child abuse and rape increased in the recent days.

The IGP advised the police officials not to be alarmed on the increase of such cases and asked them to investigate those cases properly.

He directed the chiefs of all police units to take necessary protective measures against the extortionists and terrorists in the Dhaka metropolis area and other parts of the country on the occasion of Eid-ul-Fitr.

The IGP asked them to take necessary security measures on the road, rail and inland waterways on the occasion.

Siddiqi also urged them to take necessary steps from now on for maintaining peaceful and congenial law and order for the recently announced municipal elections.

Training course begins

A five-day training course on parliamentary reporting began in the city yesterday, reports BSS.

Organised by the Press Institute of Bangladesh (PIB) and Commonwealth Press Union (CPU), the inaugural ceremony of the training course was presided over by director general of PIB Dr Sheikh Abdus Salam. It was also addressed by chairman of the editorial board of The Daily Ittefaq Barrister Mainul Husain. The Daily Sangbad editor and CPU Bangladesh Chapter president Ahmedul Kabir, UNB chairman Anwarul Karim, political editor of the London-based The Express Tony Bavins and PIB senior instructor Rafiqul Islam Nasim.

Seventeen journalists working in different national dailies and news agencies are participating in the course.

Salary of madrasa for Oct-Dec sent to banks

Cardiac centre opens Jan 15

A 62-bed cardiac centre equipped with modern facilities opens at the Z H Sikder Women's Medical College and Hospital in Dhanmondi on January 15. Foreign doctors will be in the supervision of the unit.

At a press conference yesterday, the doctors said the unit would be the most modern cardiac unit in the country in terms of its instrumental facilities and the expertise. All kinds of cardiac surgery including open heart surgery will be operated at the centre, they said.

The cardiac unit will deliver the same service available in India, but the total cost will be at least 15 per cent less, said Dr Vettath Prabhakaran Murali of Royal Adelaide Hospital, Australia.

The cardiac centre is equipped with two cath laboratory, double cardiac operation theatre, two angiogram machines, two blood purifier and two heart-lung machines.

Among others, Dr T A Don Michael, Professor of Cardiology at the University of California, Los Angeles, USA, Dr John Russell of Department of Anaesthesia, Australia, and Dr T Prasad from India spoke at the press conference.

Timbers worth Tk 25 lakh recovered in Rangamati

RANGAMATI, Jan 4:

Forest officials have recovered about 20,000 cubic feet of timbers belonging to different costly species worth over Taka 25 lakh from different places of the district in a fortnight drive that ended today, official said, reports BSS.

Seven persons, allegedly engaged in smuggling-out the timbers as well as hoarding a part of those, were rounded up during the raid. A truck and eleven engine-boats were seized in these connections, officials said.

Timbers recovered included teak, garjan, gamar, shil koral, champafal etc, were reportedly extracted illegally from different reserved forests raised by the government.

Persons arrested during the raid were sent to Rangamati court for trial after constituting departmental cases.

Divisional forest officer of Chittagong Hill Tracts south forest division, Tapan Kumar Dey led the team which conducted the raid. More raids are likely to resume soon to combat illegal extraction of timbers
