FIFA relaxes suspension

ZURICH, Jan 9: FIFA lifted the ban on the Cameroon football federation (FECAFOOT) on Friday after the country's government agreed to a new executive committee for the federation, reports AFP.

FECAFOOT's affairs will now be directed by a 12-man panel, eight of whom have been appointed by FIFA and four by the Cameroon government's ministry of youth and sport.

The new panel was needed after FECAFOOT's administrative council dismissed its president Vincent Onana, last year amid allegations he was involved in the Wrafficking of World Cup tickerts allocated to the Cameroon football federation.

Liu. Waldner to fight for final berth

PARIS, Jan 9: Olympic champion Liu Guoliang of China and Sweden's world champion Jan-Ove Waldner meet in an intriguing East versus West Pattle in the semifinals of the TTTF pro-Tour finals here today, reports AFP.

Both, 22-year-old Liu and 33-year-old Waldner notched up quarter-final victories on Friday in table-tennis equivalent to the ATP's Tour championship finals in tennis.

The 220,000-dollar competition, is not as big as a World Championship, Olympic Games or World Cup - but it is not far behind, grouping the best 16 men and women players from 11 international tournaments between February and November last year.

Waldner, who beat 1994 European champion Jean-Michel Saive of Belgium 21-15, 15-21, 14-21, 21-17, relished the chance to play Liu.

Liu, oozing confidence, thrashed world number 17 Patrick Chila of France 21-10, 21-19, 21-13.

In the other semi-final, world number-three from China Kong Linghui, who beat compatriot and world numbernine Yan Sen 21-16, 19-21, 21-14, 21-9, faces compatriot Wang Ligin. Ligin was a 17-21, 21-17, 16-21, 21-13, 21-12 winner against Ma Lin.

In the women's event, an all-Chinese semi-final line-up is in store today though Croatia's Tamara Boros, the only non-Chinese in the last eight, lost narrowly.

Brazil beat Colombia

TANDIL, Argentina, Jan 9: Brazil with goals by Matuzalem, Rodrigo Gral and Ronaldo Brazil defeated Colombia 3-1 Friday and now head Group B in the first round of the South American U20 soccer tournament, reports AP.

Mauricio Molina scored for Colombia in the 90th.

Also Friday, Paraguay defeated Bolivia 2-1 with secondhalf goals by Roque Santa Cruz and Francisco Escobar, overturning an early deficit from a goal by Ronald Garcia.

Bolivia's Marco Melgar and Paraguay's Diego Gavilan were red-carded for rough play five minutes before the end of the match.

Brazil have 6 points, Paraguay and Uruguay 3, Colombia and Bolivia none.

In Group A, defending champions Argentina have 6 points, Chile and Peru 3, Venezuela and Ecuador 0.

The first three from each group will play a round robin final round for 4 berths in the World Youth Championship

A win just one day before the midway point of the Serie A season would represent an enormous psychological boost to either side's title challenge.

Fiorentina go into the game on a six-match unbeaten run while Lazio have won their last four. They trail the leaders by six points.

Lazio's Italian World Cup striker Christian Vieri, who marked his comeback after a 15-week lay-off by scoring the winning goal against Bologna on Wednesday, said the game was bound to be an open one.

"I don't see how Fiorentina could come to play a defensive game given that they field four attackers.

2 top SLOC officials quit

SALT LAKE CITY, Jan 9: The worst ethics scandal in Olympic history has taken down the top two executives of the Salt Lake Olympic Committee in a bribery scandal involving scholarships, gifts and cash payments of up to 709,000 dollars to win the 2002 Winter Games, reports

Committee president Frank Joklik and senior vice president David Johnson resigned Friday amid the disclosure of a growing list of misdeeds surrounding the Games.

With the Olympics just three years away and much of the infrastructure already built, state leaders and Olympic organisers remained confident that Salt Lake City could still be a successful host.

"It must be made absolutely clear that the actions of a few do not reflect the values, moral expectations or standards of behaviour of this community and state," Gov Mike Leavitt said. "We deplore it and we revolt at being associated with them."

But the matter is far from resolved. The bribery scandal, which surfaced in November, remains the subject of four separate investigations by the Justice Department, the International Olympic Committee, the US Olympic Committee and a SLOC ethics panel.

And new allegations con-

tinue to surface. At a news conference Friday, Joklik described a number of misdeeds by bid officials, including cash payments to IOC members - more than 70,000 dollars in one case; payments for housing, travel, and education expenses for IOC member relatives; expensive gifts and free health care for IOC members and their families; and assistance in making a Utah land deal that left an influential IOC member from Africa with a 60,000 dollars profit.

In addition, Leavitt's spokeswoman, Vicki Varela, acknowledged late Friday that' the SLOC ethics panel is looking into possible use of bid committee credit cards to pay for female escorts for IOC mem-

Joklik said he knew nothing of gifts and payments to IOC members while he was volunteer chairman of the bid panel, but was stepping down because "changes must be made for the Games to proceed.

He did not refer to the payments as bribes, and said he didn't believe IOC votes were promised in exchange for Salt Lake's largesse.

"We've got to win this match without making calculations about what happens next. The only way that you get results in the championship is by taking matches one at a time," said

Vieri. Fiorentina's experienced coach Giovanni Trapattoni, a key figure in the club's successful run, agrees with Vieri's expectations of an open game.

"For us, this is clearly another big test," he said. "You lot all say that Lazio absolutely have to win. That's true but so do we.

"We always go out to win, we never hold back ... and against Lazio we won't be changing that attitude." Lazio will be without Czech midfielder Pavel Nedved and Croat striker Alen Boksic, both

injured, but will still field a classy side led by Roberto Mancini, Marcelo Salas and Vieri in attack. Yugoslav Dejan Stankovic, Argentine Matias Almeyda and

Portugal's Sergio Conceicao support playmaker Mancini in midfield while Alessandro Nesta and Yugoslav Sinisa Mihajlovic marshall the Lazio defence. Fiorentina are without two

suspended first choice midfielders in German Jorg Heinrich and Christian Amoroso. They will be replaced by Stefano Tarozzi and Giulio Falcone respectively.



When Carlsson became more aggressive and forced her way back into contention, recovering from 1-4 in the second set. Dokic remained composed and held three match points at 5-3.

Although Carlsson survived then, Dokic finally claimed victory in the tiebreak on her seventh match point.

"It's probably the greatest day of my life," said Dokic. "I've never won something this big before and it gives me great confidence. We weren't expected to win coming into the tournament, but I've played some great tennis and got through."
