Hingis sails into qtrs

SYDNEY, Jan 12: World No 2 Martina Hingis, aiming for a third straight Australian Open title, continued her impressive buildup with an easy win at the Adidas International on Tuesday, reports AP.

Hingis cruised into the quar-terfinals with a 6-2, 6-1 win over Australian Alicia Molik after a first-round bye.

The Swiss youngster was pushed from the summit by American Lindsay Davenport last year, but beat her rival at the end of season Chase Championships and then last week at the Hopman Cup teams tournament in Perty.

Hingis admitted she missed the top spot and wanted to start the journey back with victory at the Australian Open starting next week. Although she said an Open win would put her back at No 1, this was disputed by tour officials.

"I'm not that far away but yes miss not being No 1," Hingis said. "It gives me more motivation going into matches. I learned a lot from last year and playing well again at the Chase Championships helped me a lot, winning a big tournament

Hingis said losing the top ranking meant a noticeable change in the amount of time taken up by off-court matters, such as media and sponsorship commitments.

"Being No 2 is a lot different." she said. "This is all about

Lindsay now." But Hingis, who lost semifinals at Wimbledon and the French and US Opens last year after claiming all but the French Grand Slam event in 1997, said the rankings slip had done her some good.

"It's taught me not too take it too easy," Hingis said. "I was not practising that hard."

The tournament's fifth seeded woman, Conchita Martinez of Spain, became the first major casualty when beaten by Austrian Barbara Schett, 6-3, 7 6(7-4).

Quebec may take legal action

QUEBEC, Jan 12: Quebec City, which failed in its bid to host the 2002 Winter Games, may sue the International Olympic Committee, an official said Monday, reports AP:

Rene Paquet, former head of the Quebec City bid committee, said the city may seek compensation because the rules of a contract signed with the organisation were broken.

"I think it would be only fair that all these instances be compensated," Paquet said.

Paquet said the decision whether to sue will be discussed with representatives of the Quebec, federal and city governments this week.

Two top officials of Salt Lake's bid committee resigned last week after an investigation by the committee's lawyers found improper payments were made to win the Games.

"I think they now have a black eye," Paquet said, referring to the bribery scandal now rocking the American city. Paquet also said IOC presi-

dent Juan Antonio Samaranch should resign.

"I think when you're thinking of cleaning up the boat, you have to change the captain, he

said. He said the Quebec City committee would have withdrawn its 12-million dollars bid if it had known what was going on in Salt Lake City.

Quebec City was a candidate along with Salt Lake; Ostersund, Sweden; and Sion, Switzerland.

AUCKLAND, Jan 12: Defending champion Marcelo Rios made a controversial first-round exit from the Auckland Open tennis tournament on Tuesday, then was

accused of throwing his match to Romanian Andrei Pavel. reports AP. The Chilean lasted just 46 minutes on the main court, winning the first set 7-5 but

then withdrawing, citing in-jury, after he was broken in the second game of the second set. It put a surprised Pavel, ranked 64th, into an unexpected second-round encounter against Spain's Fernando Vi-


Pave's compatriot Adrian Voinea dumped former world No 1 Jim Courier out of the tournament 7-6, 6-1 in another match Tuesday, then said he had watched Rios' game and as far as he was concerned the Chilean had "tanked," or thrown, his match.

"Andrei was expecting from game to game that Rios would quit and so it was not easy for him to play under the circumstances," said Voinea.

And while Rios appeared to be clutching his back during the match as well as giving the impression to Pavel in the locker room ahead of the match that he was struggling with his back, the Chilean disputed that, saying it was his right hamstring that gave him problems.

Rios, reported to have been paid an appearance fee of around 50,000 US dollars, said on his arrival in Auckland at the weekend that he was worried about his injured hamstring but hoped to complete the

tournament. After Tuesday's withdrawal he said: "I want on court to try to do my best, I was able to play but I struggled a little bit.

"I don't know how bad it is, when the body cools down and I will check it later and see how it is going."

"Now I'll go to Melbourne and hope it gets better. It is always disappointing to retire from a match, but that is the way it goes. You have to listen to

your body and take care of it." Tournament director Graham Pearce said he didn't believe Rios had thrown his match and swept aside rumours that the Chilean wouldn't be paid his appearance fee.

"That is not correct, but commercial dealings of appearance fees are a private matter and are not for comment," Pearce said.

"There is no doubt that he came here to play and try and win and had he been fit he would have tried to go right through.


"It was quite clear from watching him that his movements were restricted and with the Australian Open coming up it is understandable that he would want to be as fit as possible for that."

Sampras recently pulled out of the Open and the Colonial Classic citing exhaustion from a tough finish to last season.

Other players seeking topquality competition in the round-robin event as they prepare for the Australian Open are Michael Chang, Goran Ivanisevic, Tim Henman, Yevgeny Kafelnikov, Thomas Enqvist, Petr Korda and defending champion Mark Philippoussis.

"Last year was a great year for me in many ways, but I think where I did fall short was in the big tournaments," said Agassi, who jumped from 122 at the start of the year to end the season at No.5.

He was the first player to go from outside the year-end top 100 and finish the year in the top 10, but he reached no further than the fourth round of any Grand Slam.

Korda will use the tournament this week to prepare for the defense of his Australian Open title, but as his 31st birthday approaches this month he isn't expecting too much from

himself. "Last year I had some more matches under my belt, and at the end of last year I didn't win as many matches as the previous year, but I feel well right now and am starting to hit the

ball well again," said Korda. "I'm still enjoying what I'm doing, but I have to be realistic. You can't win everything you want. I'll try to defend the title the best I can, and we'll see.
