Wembley boost for England

LONDON, Jan 13 (Reuters/Internet): British sports minister Tony Banks said on Wednesday that the sale of Wembley Stadium was a major boost to England's bid to host the 2006 World Cup.

Wembley Plc said earlier that it had agreed to sell the venue for 103 million pounds (\$169 million), ending months of uncertainty and clearing the way for the development of a new national stadium on the site.

The new stadium is central to England's 2006 bid and Banks said until the sale was settled the bid was being held back.

"Now we know it is secure we can go into the last 12 months (of the bidding period) on a high," said Banks.

"We are ready to move pretty fast. There is a great deal of national pride and prestige behind it."

Banks said there were still a number of issues to be raised, including the future of the stadium's famous twin towers which, at the very least, will have to be moved, but said he was delighted by the sale.

He said he hoped the new stadium would be ready in time for the 2002 FA Cup final but said a more realistic target was the following year, when the new stadium hopes to host the world athletics championships.

On the 2006 World Cup bid, Banks said: "We have a very, very strong case and we maintain we are the number one contenders."

"It is a very tight contest but there are only 24 people to persuade - the members of FIFA (executive committee)."

Banks said he was annoyed with some sections of the media who have not given full support to the bid.

"I would like people to realise this is a national effort which has the backing of (Prime Minister) Tony Blair and the government," said Banks.

Seven other countries are bidding for the 2006 World Cup: Germany, Brazil, South Africa, Nigeria, Ghana, Egypt and Morocco.

Freund has a choice

LONDON, Jan 13: Tottenham Hotspur's new signing Steffen Freund has the right to leave the English Premier League club before the end of his contract if he in London does not suit him, reports Reuters.

German international Freund, who agreed a move to White Hart Lane from Borussia Dortmund last month, has an escape clause in his contract like compatriot German Jürgen Klinsmann who left Spurs in controversial circumstances four years ago.

Freund, who arrived in London last week, has negotiated a deal which means he can leave two years earlier than the four-and-a-half years he has in his contract.

Steffi feeling fine

SYDNEY, Jan 13 (AP): Hamstring, ankle, wrist, knee, back, stomach - the injuries and illnesses have been mounting like the 21 Grand Slam titles Steffi Graf won before her career went into a tailspin.

Now she's thinking back as in comeback rather than back as in potential source of agony. Graf, 29, won the last of her Slams at the US Open in 1996, the year she skipped the Australian and also won the French, Wimbledon and the Chase Championships.

She was forced out of the game for 15 months in 1997-98, slipping from No 1 on the rankings to No 28.

Graf faced Serena Williams in a second round match at the Adidas International in Sydney on Wednesday and reached the quarters against Venus Williams with a tough win.

It is an unusual buildup to next week's Australian Open for Graf. She won the last of her four titles in the tournament in 1994 and her only appearance since was in 1997, where she made the fourth round.

Instead of going straight from a training camp in Florida to the Open, Graf scheduled tournaments in Hong Kong and now Sydney.

She missed the final in Hong Kong because of a stomach complaint, and was unsure if she could take her place in the first round in Sydney. She played and demolished Japan's Ai Sugiyama 6-0, 6-4.

"I wasn't sure to have as many matches as I could before playing a Grand Slam," Graf said.

"It's been a while that I've been able to start off the year without any injuries and be physically in very good shape," she is excited about her fitness and even agreed, a little reluctantly, to include herself in a list of five contenders for the Australian title along with Lindsay Davenport, Martina Hingis, Monica Seles and Venus Williams.

Her recovery from wrist surgery late last year went well and she finished the season by

making the semis at the Chase Championships. "It was great boost, it helped a lot to see that I was able to do it, coming back in the summer," Graf said. "After the wrist injury, to come back playing so quickly, I didn't expect that at

to me and I want to do the best there and that's how I'm going to lead up to the Slams," Graf said. "But I'll take whatever happens. I want to do well but I'm not waiting for it, whatever comes."

Graf admits that the Grand Slams have priority. She is three short of Margaret Court's record 24 titles. "In terms of goals, I never did really set them and I haven't really changed at all. The Grand Slams are the most important

Graf is working on an attitude shift, trying to lighten the load on herself. "It is difficult for me to let go. I'm still eager but I do take things a little lighter at times now," said Graf. "I don't expect as much as I used to and that makes it easier."

Steven moves into qtrs

AUCKLAND, Jan 13: New Zealand Brett Steven moved into the quarterfinals of the Auckland Open tennis tournament at Stanley Street on Wednesday with a 7-5, 6-2 win over Russian teenager Marat Safin, reports AP.

Despite a 91-minute rain break in the second set when Steven, 11 years older than the 18-year-old Safin, had the youngster on the rack with three break points at 15-40, he carried on where he left off to win convincingly.

Others to get into quarterfinals were second-seeded Spaniard Felix Mantilla, who came from a slow start to beat Romanian Adrian Panu 1-6, 6-1, 6-4, eighth seed Dominik Hrbaty of Slovakia, who had to fight hard to put away Brazilian Fernando Meligeni, 7-6 (7-2), 7-5, Romanian Andrei Pavel with a 6-3, 6-4 win over Spain's Fernando Vicente 6-3, 6-4 and Dutchman Sjeng Schalken who beat Czech Daniel Vacek 6-4, 6-4.

Into his fifth quarterfinal in seven years, Steven, who beat third seed Wayne Ferreira in the first round, was in strong form.

"I started off unbelievably well, but I also felt good going back on court after having the short break," Steven said.

"I wasn't stressing out during the break because sometimes you can get a bit anxious thinking I've lost an opportunity to break him at 15-40 with the rain delay giving him a chance to get back into the game."

"But I went out there and put the pressure on, particularly in the last game when I moved really well."

Venables awaits the Palace axe?

LONDON, Jan 13 (Reuters/Internet): Crystal Palace manager Terry Venables is to be sacked after just five months in charge, the Daily Mirror reported on Wednesday.

The newspaper said the former England manager had been offered a position as consultant with the English first division club by owner Mark Goldberg but had not decided whether or not to accept the position.

It said Venables had grown increasingly frustrated by financial restraints imposed on him in the transfer market and the final straw was a plan to sell striker Matt Jansen.

Venables, one of Britain's most experienced coaches, has bought 13 players and has a squad of 40 players at the London club.

Graf & Venus meet in qtrs

SYDNEY, Jan 13: Steffi Graf and Venus Williams set up a quarterfinal power struggle at the Adidas International tennis tournament with contrasting second-round victories Wednesday, reports AP.

Williams was in top touch beating South Africa's Amanda Coetzer 7-6, 6-2 while Graf struggled to a 6-2, 3-6, 7-5 win over Serena Williams in an exciting match lasting almost 2-1/2 hours.

With Venus and Graf winning on Centre Court, the world's No 1 Lindsay Davenport was given little respect, pushed to an outside court for her opening match after a first-round bye. Davenport beat fellow American Mary Joe Fernandez 6-4, 7-6 and plays Patty Schnyder in the quarters.

Graf took women's tennis to another level with her awesome power in a decade of domina-

tion, but concedes Venus is now the hardest-hitting player on the tour. Williams, yet to win a Grand Slam tournament, says her ability to give the ball a fierce whack is not the most important concern as she faces Graf, who has 21 Slams to her credit.

"You can overpower someone but sometimes they like the pace, so power isn't everything," Venus said.

Graf said she considered Venus the better of the Williams sisters and an imposing opponent for Thursday's match.

"Venus plays with a little more thought, with more controlling hits and some amazing serves and some amazing shots but Venus is the more stable one."

"Steffi is a smart player, a great player with a lot of experience," Venus said. "She's just kept coming and kept coming no matter what hit her, and she's on top of her game and playing just about as well as she did when she took off. It's really great."

Graf withdrew from an exhibition final against Venus in Hong Kong last week because of a stomach ailment. But her decision to play the two Australian Open tuneups goes against her usual practice of heading straight to Melbourne after a month of training in Florida.

She made a great start Wednesday, breaking Serena Williams' opening two serves to take a 4-0 lead.

Serena, running on younger legs, came back strongly to send the match into a third. Graf lost her opening service but then broke back immediately.

Tommy on a new mission

LAS VEGAS, Jan 13 (AP): Tommy Brooks probably knows better than anyone how to fight Mike Tyson.

Now he has a new challenge - teaching Mike Tyson how to fight again.

"I'm trying to reinstall in him his boxing ability," Brooks said. "We know he still has his power. It's getting that power to the opponent that we've been working on."

Brooks was an assistant trainer in Evander Holyfield's corner the night Holyfield battered Tyson before finally stopping him in the 11th round of their first heavyweight title fight.

He was there again when Tyson went berserk and bit Holyfield's ears.

Brooks learned a lot in both fights, enough to prompt Tyson manager Shelly Finkel to look him up when it came time to find a trainer for Tyson's latest comeback.

Brooks is the latest in a series of trainers Tyson has gone through since splitting with Kevin Rooney shortly after becoming the youngest heavyweight champion in the world at the age of 20.

He's not the first with ideas about how Tyson can recapture the form that once made him the most feared boxer in the sport. But he has Tyson's confidence and trust, which seemed to be lacking in other trainers.

Brooks will be the only one in the corner shouting instructions Saturday night when Tyson begins his comeback with a scheduled 10-round fight against South Africa's Francois Botha.

Tyson has kept only a few people from his old entourage under Don King. Among the notable missing are Richie Giachetti, who trained Tyson for the second Holyfield fight, and Jay Bright, the trainer in the first.

For the last two months, Brooks has been with him daily in training camp, working with Tyson on things like head movement and punch combinations while trying to instill some confidence shaken in the losses to Holyfield.

"At first I didn't think I would have enough time," Brooks said. "But Mike and I just clicked, and it has been plenty of time."

The time spent refining Tyson's boxing skills will be needed if he is to regain the heavyweight championships. Tyson in recent years has looked baffled at times in the ring, unable to get inside against some fighters and an easy target with his head for others.

That didn't make much difference against opponents who were either scared going into the ring or scared once they got into it. But Holyfield showed Tyson could be beaten by a fighter who is not afraid of

moving forward and attacking against the former champion. It's a dilemma Brooks realizes as he trains Tyson.

SLOC's cause for concern

SALT LAKE CITY, Jan 13: Key backers of the Salt Lake City Winter Olympics expressed hopes on Tuesday that corporate sponsors would not be scared off by a sex- and-scholarships bribery scandal that has tarnished the organizers' image, reports Reuters.

But in a bow to reality, officials of the Salt Lake City Organising Committee (SLOC) conceded it would take until August 2000 instead of August 1999 to raise the 859 million dollars from sponsors needed to help fund the 1.45 billion dollars 2002 Games.

Broadcast rights and tickets will take care of the rest, and a spokeswoman said officials were confident the funds would be raised.

A meeting on Thursday at which the SLOC board of trustees was not have heard an ethics committee's report on one of the four investigations into the bidding process has been postponed, and no new date was set, the SLOC said. A spokeswoman said the report was still not finished.

Officials and business leaders in Utah are hoping allegations that organisers offered members of the International Olympic Committee lavish gifts, cash, plastic surgery, scholarships and even sex paid for with SLOC credit cards will not hurt the games' all-important sponsorship.

I believe that we will keep our sponsors and gain the sponsors we need because of solid business decisions," Spencer Eccles, chairman and chief executive officer of Salt Lake City-based security bank, told a conference on Tuesday.

But the scandal has already taken its toll, turning the dream of the Olympics into a nightmare. SLOC president Frank Jirik said he and senior vice president Dave Johnson

would resign, on Monday, Salt Lake City Mayor Deedee Corradini, a member of the bid committee before being elected mayor in 1992, said she would not seek a third term. Her current one is over at the end of this year.

Corradini denied the scandal influenced her decision. If she had won the election, she would have been in office during the Games.

US West, the Denver-based regional telephone company, sent shivers through the SLOC when it said it would withhold a \$5 million payment until the bribery allegations were cleared up.

But there was good news from Atlanta, home of longtime Olympics sponsor Coca-Cola.

"As a supporter of the Olympics for 70 years, we believe in and are committed to the Olympic movement," Coke spokesman Ben Deutsch said.

He said committee officials were scheduled to meet with IOC marketing director Michael Payne on Tuesday and today. He said Coca-Cola had expressed concern to the IOC and the USOC about the allegations.

"We're encouraged by the initial response of the IOC, USOC and SLOC and are confident they will take the appropriate measures to resolve this issue," he said. "We remain committed to the Olympic movement and will continue to support the people of Utah and the 2002 Games."

Jim Peters passes away

LONDON, Jan 13: Jim Peters, the English marathon runner who captured the imagination of the sporting public when he staggered round the final lap at the 1954 Empire Games in Vancouver, Canada, has died aged 80, reports Reuters.

Peters led the field by around five kms as he came into the stadium but in the blazing heat he fell six times as he staggered and then crawled agonisingly towards the tape.

He was eventually overtaken by the rest of the runners and never crossed the finishing line after finally being helped away when it was clear he could not continue.

Peters retired from athletics after the Games, forerunner of the Commonwealth Games, but the image of his heroic efforts still lives on.

An obituary in today's times described the episode as "one of the most dramatic and poignant failures of modern athletics."
