## Tyson's next bout in April

WASHINGTON, Jan 22: Mike Tyson, who knocked down Francois Botha of South Africa on Saturday, is likely to fight Axel Schulz of Germany on April 24 in Las Vegas, reports Xinhua.

A showtime Television exécutive producer Jay Larkin confirmed the date Thursday but said an opponent would be selected next week.

Possible opponents for Tyson also include Michael Moorer, but the fight can be carried on only when Tyson can escape from jail sentence next

month. Tyson knocked down Botha in the fifth round but lost every round on the scorecards of two of the three judges.

## Watertight security in Gwalior

# Pakistan open tour today

GWALIOR, Jan 22 (Reuters/AFP): A threat from Hindu militants behind them, the touring Pakistani cricketers finally get down to serious business on their Indian tour\* here Saturday. The three-day opener against India's second-string

provides Wasim Akram's tourists their only chance to tune up for the first of two backto-back Tests starting in Madras on January 28. Coach Javed Miandad said

on the team's arrival in New Delhi on Thursday he would field a virtual Test-strength side for the first match so the players could get used to Indian conditions, crowds and secu-Miandad himself played

three Test series here in 1979. 1983 and 1987. But only Akram among the current team was part of Pakistan's last Test tour 12 years ago. "Most of the others have

played one-day cricket here, but a Testimatch atmosphere is very different, very tense," the coach said. "They must get used to it first." Tight security awaits the

Pakistanis when they arrive in this central Indian city late today despite firebrand Hindu leader Bal Thackeray's decision to call off violent protests against the tour.

Guard dogs, troops and police were enlisted to guard Gwalior's Roop Singh Stadium.

Officials in Gwalior, some 350 km (220 miles) south of New Delhi took no chances putting up a security cordon to check all vehicles coming into the city.

Police said some 2,000 police and paramilitary troopers would guard the cricket ground. Sniffer dogs are being used to detect explosives and patrol dogs to guard the pitch. Durgesh Madhav Awasthi, police com-

mandant at the stadium, told Reuters. "They will be let loose at night, if intruders come they can kill them (intruders)," he

added. Some 15 patrol dogs from the Border Security Force were brought in to guard the pitch. Paramilitary troops in green fatigues and police armed with batons rehearsed near orange

and yellow bucket seats at the

25,000 capacity stadium. "We have been told not to relax the security," match organiser Prashant Mehta said. "There's no problem here, but we are not taking chances."

The irrepressible Miandad, who created a stir two years ago by inviting Thackeray to Pakistan for the World Cup, had another dig at the Shiv Sena supremo.




