## Judge asks Lewinsky to submit to interview with Starr

WASHINGTON, Jan 23: President Bill Clinton's impeachment trial resumed today with attention divided between senators' questions and a new legal battle touched off by prosecutors' efforts to force Monica Lewinsky's cooperation, reports

US District Judge Norma Holloway Johnson ordered Monica Lewinsky to submit to an interview with prosecutor Kenneth Starr to assist the Senate impeachment trial, a le-

gal source said. The source, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said Johnson ruled that House prosecutors had no right under Ms Lewinsky's immunity deal with Starr to force her to submit to their questioning. But Johnson ruled that Starr could force Ms Lewinsky to answer questions from his staff and allow the House prosecutors to attend.

Republican Rep Henry Hyde ob-tained Starr's help Friday in attempting to force Ms Lewinsky to talk to them, touching off a legal battle in Johnson's court.

Judy Smith, a spokeswoman for Ms Lewinsky, said her legal team was considering an appeal. "We're taking that question under advisement," she Starr's prosecutors and the

lawyers for Ms Lewinsky went to court late Friday arguing over whether she had to cooperate. Hyde had written Starr seeking his help with Ms Lewinsky, who rejected being interviewed by the House team. Democratic Sen John Kerry said he opposed the ruling.

"It's an inappropriate intervention of the judiciary in the proceedings of the Senate," Kerry said. "It is a separation of powers problem." Back at the trial, senators

began a second day of probing the two legal teams, submitting written questions through Chief Justice William Rehn-

Republican Rep Lindsey Graham, one of the House prosecutors, pleaded with senators not to end the trial and "leave

this confusion behind." "If you leave us confused about whether or not this is a crime or not, the impact is far greater than if you rule that this is a crime but the political death penalty is not called for," he said, arguing senators should allow the trial go through to a final vote of the

In response to an international tender, four companies had expressed their interest to set up the factory, the source said. These are, Foster Wheeller and ABCD of USA, Technimont of Italy and Ngarjun of India.

## Sanctions against Burundi suspended

ARUSHA, Tanzania, Jan 23: A summit of regional African presidents today suspended economic sanctions against war-torn Burundi, Ugandan President Yoweri Museveni announced, reports AFP. The regional leaders have

unanimously agreed that sanctions should be suspended - not removed completely, but suspended," Museveni said at the summit in the northern Tanzanian town of Arusha. A communiqué said the sus-

pension "will be subject to review based on the progress made in the negotiations" currently underway in Arusha between 20 Burundian delega-

The sanctions were imposed a week after Tutsi major Peirre Buyoya seized power on July 25, 1996, in a bid to force him to negotiate with Hutu rebels to resolve a civil wear that has left some 200,000 dead since 1993.

Buyoya told the summit grouping leaders of Uganda, Tanzania, Kenya, Rwanda and Ethiopia, and representatives of Zambia and the Organisation of African Unity (OAU) that he wanted to see a peace agreement signed by the end of the year.
