## Atletico set to let Juninho go

MADRID, Jan 25(Reuters/Internet): Atletico Madrid are expected to allow to Juninho to leave this week, with English clubs Middlesbrough and Aston Villa set to fight it out for his signature.

Juninho's father and agent is due to meet with Atletico officals later on Monday with a view to negotiating his return to England -- despite the player's assurances this weekend that he wants to stay and fight for his place.

The Brazilian playmaker was once again left on the bench for Atletico's impressive 2-1 victory over Celta Vigo on Sunday and coach Arrigo Sacchi has made it clear the player is not in his first-choice side.

"I appreciate him as a footballer but the problem is that I can't play him and Juan Carlos Valeron together," said Sacchi.

"We have two excellent central midfielders but when they have played together things haven't worked out."

Atletico president Jesus Gil acknowledged for the first time this weekend that the club have received offers for Juninho. But the Brazilian has insisted he wants to stay and fight

for his place. "My patience hasn't yet come

to an end," he said on Sunday. "If I play 15, 20 or 40 minutes I have to demonstrate that I'm strong and committed to winning a place in the starting line-

"Every player who is in this situation has to do the same, although with so many rumours it's difficult to concentrate. Every coach has their own ideas." Juninho added: "I've always

been comfortable here in Madrid. I've never said anything else and I would never leave here. My idea is to play here at Atletico and fight for this club."

Aston Villa have been leading the race to persuade Juninho away from the Spanish capital but Middlesbrough, who sold him to Atletico in 1997, are believed to have first option to sign him should he become available again.

## USA, Bolivia end goalless

SANTA CRUZ, Bolivia, Jan 25: Tony Meola returned to goal for the United States for the first time in 4 1-2 years, and the Americans played their second straight goalless draw under new coach Bruce Arena, this time against Bolivia on Sunday, reports AP.

Meola, 29, was the starter for the United States in the 1990 and 1994 World Cups but had not played an international game since July 4, 1994, when the Americans lost to Brazil 1-0 in the second round of the World Cup. Meola had four saves in his 28th career international.

Kasey Keller of England's Leicester City was the starter during last summer's World Cup in France and Liverpool's Brad Friedel was his backup.

Arena, who took over as coach from Steve Sampson following the World Cup, and made his debut as coach against Australia on November 6, was Meola's coach at the University of Virginia in the late 1980s.

Meola left soccer after the '94 World Cup to pursue careers in acting in the NFL, then returned with the launch of Major League Soccer and has started for the New York/New Jersey MetroStars for the past three seasons.

Arena started a lineup that included a mix of the players on the World Cup roster (defenders Jeff Agoos and Eddie Pope; midfielders Claudio Reyna and Cobi Jones; and forwards Brian McBride and Joe-Max Moore) and youth.


