

People won't accept farcical municipal polls: Khaleda

Opposition leader Begum Khaleda Zia has again asked the government to create congenial atmosphere for municipal elections by accepting their four-point demand, reports

"The government will be held responsible for the consequences if the municipal elections are held unilaterally without the participation of opposition parties ... The people will never accept this farcical election," she said in a statement yesterday.

The BNP Chairperson and Leader of the Opposition in Parliament congratulated the people of all strata for their spontaneous observance of the 18-hour hartal across the country ignoring all provocation and armed attacks by the "fascist government".

By observing the hartal, she said, the people have rejected the government's undemocratic move to hold the pourashava polls unilaterally. "They have also demonstrated their support for the four-point demand," she said.

The opposition leader said they had demanded resignation of the Chief Election Commissioner and restructuring of the Commission with a new CEC in consultation with the parties having representation in parliament to ensure free and fair municipal election and enable the people to exercise their vot-

She alleged that the present CEC and EC had proved in the past elections through their pro-government role that they were not neutral.
