

Brazil happy to settle for WC 2010

ZURICH, Feb 4: The head of the Brazilian football federation (CBF) insisted on Wednesday that his country's economic crisis would not affect its bid for the 2006 World Cup, reports Reuters.

But he hinted that Brazil may be happy to wait until 2010 provided FIFA's system of rotation is maintained and South Africa wins the vote for 2006.

The economic situation is happening now but I'm sure we can still put on the World Cup," said CBF president Ricardo Teixeira. "Everyone wants it."

Teixeira, a member of the FIFA executive committee that will decide in March next year where the World Cup is held, said Brazil's low-key campaign would gather steam once the recently issued FIFA guidelines on World Cup requirements had been digested.

He said Brazil, which has not hosted the World Cup for 49 years, deserved to be chosen. "In 2006 we will have gone 56 years without it. England held it in 1966, Germany in 1974, plus we have won it four times so we have every right to stage it."

Teixeira speaking from FIFA headquarters in Zurich where he was attending a meeting of the FIFA referees' committee, added, however: "If the rotation system runs logically, the tournament should go to Africa, then to South America, then to the CONCACAF region and only after that, back to Europe. I agree with rotation, but only if the World Cup goes to Africa next time and to South America four years after that."

Derby do it to Giggs again

MANCHESTER, England, Feb 4: Manchester United winger Ryan Giggs could miss the European Cup quarterfinal clash with Inter Milan in March after damaging a hamstring in a 1-0 win over Derby County in the English Premier League on Wednesday, reports Reuters.

Welsh international Giggs pulled up after only 10 minutes, holding his leg, and limped to the dressing-room before Dwight Yorke scored the winner in the 65th minute.

United manager Alex Ferguson said "He's got a hamstring injury. It makes him very doubtful for the Milan game. He pulled his hamstring against Derby last year also, which cost him a quarterfinal place (against Monaco). It kept him out for seven weeks."

Yevgeny going strong

MARSEILLE, France, Feb 4: Australian Open champion Yevgeny Kafelnikov brushed aside Dutchman Rijkman Schalken 6-3, 6-2 to reach the second round of the Marseille Open on Wednesday, reports Reuters.

The Russian number two seed said: "The change of surface was a problem and I took a while to settle."

Kafelnikov is now favourite for the title following the elimination on Tuesday of top seed Spaniard Carlos Moya.

"I'm satisfied with my game even if I don't play a great match," he said. "That's normal after a long and difficult journey (from Australia)."

Kafelnikov will meet Slovakian Dominik Hrbaty in the second round.

Fourth-seed Swiss Marc Rosset, who won the tournament in 1993 and 1994, beat French qualifier Cyril Saulnier 6-2, 3-6, 6-1.

Forssell fires Chelsea up

LONDON, Feb 4: Finnish teenager Mikael Forssell scored twice on his first start for Chelsea on Wednesday to see the London glamour side through their FA Cup fourth round replay 4-2 against lowly Oxford United, while Huddersfield beat Wrexham 2-1 in their replay, reports Reuters.

The 17-year-old forward, signed in December from HJK Helsinki to reinforce Chelsea's injury-depleted strike force, showed no first night nerves as he powered home in the 46th and 53rd minutes.

Chelsea, second in the Premier League and boasting a multi-million pound line-up, suffered a scare when they went a goal down in the fifth minute

against their cash-strapped First Division opponents whose first attack of the game forced a corner.

Jamie Cook's delivery caught the boot of Chelsea's France international Marcel Desailly and Oxford's Phil Gilchrist nodded home.

The goal galvanised Chelsea, who had managed only a last-gasp 1-1 draw to Oxford nine days ago, they levelled the score in the 13th minute after diminutive Italian Gianfranco Zola took a pass from Frank Leboeuf, rounded two defenders and passed to captain Dennis Wise who rammed home.

Zola, playing his 100th match for Chelsea, produced some more wizardry just before half time when he flicked the ball over advancing Oxford keeper Elliot Jackson and it ricocheted off the post into the goal.

After the break Chelsea's expensive class began to show and they took control of the game despite some spirited counter-attacks from Oxford.

Chelsea manager Gianluca Vialli who has been forced to play up front himself in recent matches because of injuries to Tore Andre Flo and Gigi Casiraghi chose to take Forssell off halfway through the second half before he could try for a hat-trick.

Oxford, combative to the end, scored a consolation goal from the spot in the 76th minute through Nicky Banger after Wise handled in the area.

It was a second yellow card offence for fiery Chelsea captain Wise who received his marching orders for the fourth time this season.

Surprise call up for Cole

England take on world champs

LONDON, Feb 4: England recalled Manchester United striker Andy Cole on Wednesday for a friendly international against France at Wembley next week in a squad selected by sacked coach Glenn Hoddle, reports Reuters.

Hoddle, who has criticised Cole in the past for squandering chances, had selected the sharpshooter for the squad before his sacking on Tuesday and interim manager Howard Wilkinson did not change it for next Wednesday's game against the world champions.

There is also a place in the squad for midfielder Kieron Dyer of First Division title chasers, Ipswich but none for midfielder Paul Gascoigne.

Cole's call-up by Hoddle came as a surprise, for he had called for the deposed England manager a coward for not selecting him in the past.

"In my opinion his behaviour towards me has been cowardly," Cole said in November, adding that if Hoddle did select him: "I'm afraid I would have to think seriously about it."

He was also omitted earlier last year from the 30-man England squad for the World Cup finals in France.

It was not immediately clear if Cole would have accepted the call-up if Hoddle were still manager but, with 10 Premier League goals this season and 15

Zagallo boys win again

RIO DE JANEIRO, Feb 4 (Reuters/Internet): Former Brazil coach, Mario Zagallo kept his 100 per cent record in charge of Portuguesa as they beat Rio Branco 3-2 in the Paulista (Sao Paulo state) championship.

Portuguesa's victory on Wednesday was their fourth in four games under Zagallo and kept them top of group one in the first stage of the competition.

Paulo Cesar Carpegiani, who led Paraguay at the World Cup in France, also celebrated his fourth victory in as many games at Sao Paulo as they defeated Flamengo 1-0 away in the Rio-Sao Paulo tournament.

Brazil's 1994 World Cup-winning coach Carlos Alberto Parreira was less fortunate.

His good start at crisis-torn Fluuminense was undone with a 4-1 defeat at Santos in the same tournament.

The Brazilian season starts with a plethora of competitions and yet another opened on Wednesday.

The Copa Brasil, a nationwide knockout contest, began with South American champions Vasco da Gama overcoming Ji-Parana 4-2 away in a first round first leg in the city of Porto Velho, situated in the depths of the Amazon rainforest.

That victory saved Ji-Parana the trip to Rio de Janeiro, as away teams who win their first leg by two goals or more go straight into the next round.

Each Brazilian state has its own championship but the major clubs are generally exempt from the opening rounds.

The big clubs from Rio de Janeiro and Sao Paulo take part in the season-opening Rio-Sao Paulo tournament while the Copa do Sul features their counterparts from southern Brazil.

So nice of Rafter

SYDNEY, Feb 4: Two-time US Open tennis champions Patrick Rafter, a major supporter of children's charities, went a step further Thursday by launching his own, reports AP.

The Patrick Rafter Children's Foundation will be headed by the Australian star's sister Louise.

Rafter made "Anonymous" donations of about US \$3,800,000 dollars over the past two years following his wins in the US Open. Details were later leaked to the media.

"I didn't want it to be seen as some sort of publicity stunt," Rafter said.

He promised he would continue to keep "a pretty constant stream coming from me" to keep the foundation alive.

Rafter, 26, said his motivation was that he wanted other children to know what it was like to be brought up by loving parents in a caring environment, just as he and his eight brothers and sisters were.

"This is a pretty big step in my life," Rafter said. "We're very optimistic and very positive about what we can achieve and how much money we can raise."

Rafter said he hopes to organise celebrity events like golf or tennis days to raise more money for his foundation, as well as having one major fundraiser a year.

Rafter said he and Davis Cup captain John Newcombe donated money last year from Davis Cup proceeds, and said other players had also contributed.

"This brings you back to earth a little bit and it gives you a different look at life," Rafter said.

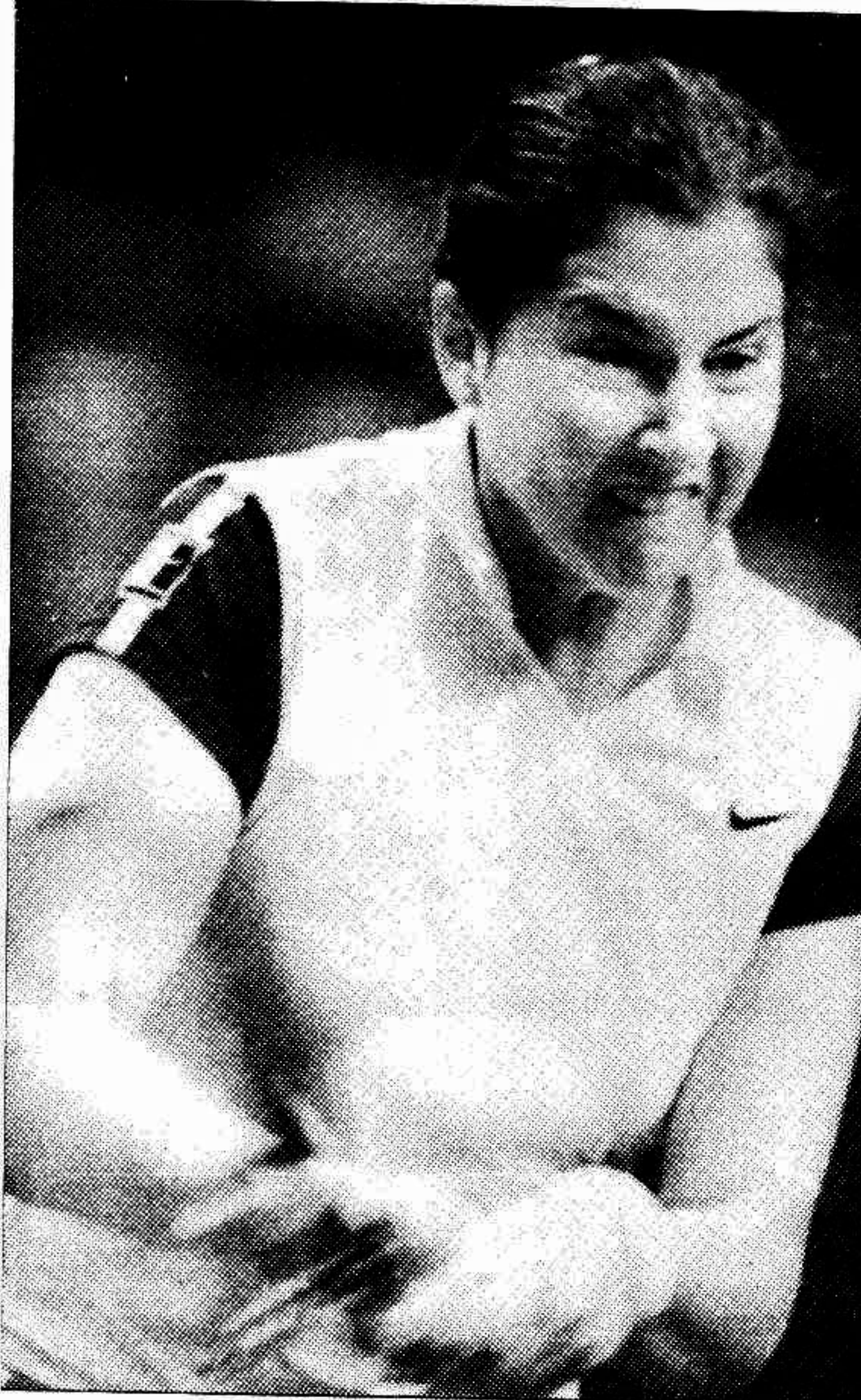
One of the first recipients of the foundation is Father Chris Riley, whose Youth Off The Streets programme is designed to help homeless or drug-addicted children in Sydney.

Davenport struggles to win

TOKYO, Feb 4 (Reuters/Internet): World number one Lindsay Davenport made hard work of beating fellow American Mary Joe Fernandez 6-4, 6-4 on Thursday

to reach the \$1 million Pan Pacific Open quarter-finals.

The tournament favourite, in action for the first time since she lost in the Australian Open semifinals last week, looked jaded early on and found trouble placing her shots.

Veteran Fernandez often caught Davenport off guard with off winners down the lines.

Davenport was finally jolted into action when Fernandez broke her serve and went 4-2 in the first set of the second round match. She won the next six games.

Davenport plays seventh seed Ananda Coetzer next. The South African mounted an extraordinary comeback from 5-1 down in the third set to overcome Els Callens of Belgium 2-6, 6-1, 7-5.

Determined fifth seed Steffi Graf was forced to stage a fighting recovery to avoid defeat by Russian Elena Likhovtseva.

The former world number one had been a set and 5-3 down before clawing back to win 4-6, 7-6, 6-2.

"I just think that I didn't play very well today and I made it difficult on myself," Graf said.

Australian Open champion and second seed Martina Hingis is Graf's next opponent.

Third seed Jana Novotna of the Czech Republic had an impressive 6-2, 6-2 win over hard-hitting Mariana de Swardt of South Africa.

Novotna now faces eighth seed Natasha Zvereva of Belarus who eliminated American Lisa Raymond 6-3, 6-2.

Sixth seed Anna Kournikova appeared to have overcome her serving difficulties as she outclassed Cara Black of Zimbabwe 6-2, 6-3.

The Russian had brought her Australian Open service problems to her first round match in Tokyo.

Graf meanwhile criticised Davenport and Hingis on Thursday for suggesting broad-shouldered Australian Open finalist Amelie Mauresmo played tennis like a man.

"They (Davenport and Hingis) made their comments. I think their comments were absolutely not right to make," Graf said after her second round victory in the Pan Pacific Open.

"I have my own point of view. I think that everything will be cleared up and there is nothing left to talk about."

Lemerre not taking 'em lightly

PARIS, Feb 4 (Reuters/Internet): France coach Roger Lemerre said England would not be adversely affected by this week's sacking of Glenn Hoddle when they face the world champions at Wembley in a friendly international on Wednesday.

"The English will always be the English. For them, the truth is on the pitch and not outside and their combativity remains a great strength. They always bounce back," Lemerre said on Thursday when he named his 18-man squad.

Hoddle was sacked on Tuesday for saying in an interview that the disabled were paying for sins committed in previous lives. All Lemerre had to say to that was: "C'est la vie."

Comparing styles of play, Lemerre said: "It's the current fashion to mock English, but in other words a long game, never ending headers and unceasing breaks down the wing."

"But this sort of remark is insulting to English football, and football in general. At the World Cup, France had other team assets, but we were inspired by the fighting spirit of the English," he said.

"I'd like France to win at Wembley, like Lens," Lemerre said referring to RC Lens' upset 1-0 win over Arsenal in the European Champions' League.

"But this clash will not be at all easy. You only have to look at history," he said.

England have won 23 of their 33 matches against

France, including their last meeting in Montpellier in 1997, and lost only six -- never at Wembley.

Lemerre said that the current successful French influence in the English premier league did not mean he would

necessarily pit Chelsea's Marcel Desailly and Franck Ribery at the back and Arsenal midfielder duo Emmanuel Petit and Patrick Vieira.

"This match is above all part of the build up to the match against Ukraine," Lemerre said looking ahead to France's Euro 2000 qualifier at home on March 27.

"With players like (Michael) Owen, this match is definitely a good step, but Ukraine is what counts," he said.

Lemerre has picked a big centre forward in Lilian Laslandes of Girondins Bordeaux to lead the attack at Wembley, knowing his style should suit the match.

"Laslandes will play, that's a certainty. To pick a striker I base my decision on his form ... and his characteristics in his position," he said.

Veteran Olympique Marseille defender Laurent Blanc, speaking in Marseille, said: "It's an important test against a great footballing nation, especially with us assuming our status of world champions. 'We only played at Wembley once, and lost. It's a mythical stadium with a real history,' he said.

"Since they were eliminated from the World Cup, England have experienced a number of turbulent moments. But English football is in the middle of change.

"Under the influence of former players like Hoddle, all good tacticians, it's evolving in the right direction for the greater good of football."
