

Cantona MU's best ever

MANCHESTER, England, Feb 17: Former France international striker Eric Cantona has been voted the best player in the glittering history of English Premiership leaders Manchester United by the club's fans in a ballot organised by the club's official magazine, reports AFP.

Cantona finished ahead of greats such as George Best, Sir Bobby Charlton and legendary players of the past like Duncan Edwards.

Wales international Ryan Giggs came third; between Best and Charlton and eighth-placed Beckham finished ahead of another star of the 60s, Scotland's Denis Law.

Charlton was a key member of England's 1966 World Cup winning team and starred alongside Best in the United team that won the 1968 European Cup, beating Benfica 4-1 at Wembley. Charlton scored twice and Best notched a superb solo goal in that match.

Edwards was regarded as English football's finest prospect when he was killed in the Munich air crash in 1958

that dented the United side, Charlton survived that crash. Magazine editor Justyn Barnes is not too surprised. "The average age of our readers is 22, and that is reflected in the high placing of modern players," he said.

The 90s have been most consistently successful era in United's history, but it is still arguable whether Ryan Giggs, who helped win two doubles deserves to be ranked above Sir Bobby.

Edmundo may move back to Brazil

RIO DE JANEIRO, Feb 17: Brazilian top-flight side Vasco da Gama are bidding to re-sign their former striker Edmundo, the club's vice-president Eurico Miranda said on Tuesday, reports AFP.

Edmundo - full name Edmundo Alves de Souza Neto - has been in Rio for a week after his latest walkout from his current club Italian Serie A side Fiorentina, but had said he would return after the carnival in which he had played the drums in a marching samba band.

Miranda gave no details but press reports say Vasco are prepared to pay 11 million dollars for the temperamental striker.

Edmundo, known as the animal for his volatile behaviour, was the key player in Vasco da Gama's championship season in 1997, winning a move to Italy. But he has failed to settle in Europe, walking out on more than one occasion on the club.

All signs point to Keegan

LONDON, Feb 16 (Reuters/AP/Inter): England's Football Association said on Wednesday that reports Kevin Keegan had already been appointed as the new manager of the England football team were premature.

The FA's acting executive director David Davies told reporters progress had been made in negotiations for Keegan to take the job and that the two sides were "not far away" from reaching an agreement.

Television stations and newspapers reported that Keegan, a former England player and currently coach of second division Fulham, would at first operate as a part-time manager to allow him to try to guide Fulham to promotion.

Newspapers said Keegan had been offered a four-year contract worth around 2.0 million pounds (\$3.25 million) and he would agree to share the England job with his responsibilities at Fulham until the end of the season in May or June.

The Football Association's international sub-committee met for two hours on Tuesday and spoke to Keegan by phone.

Keegan was leading training with Fulham at their west London training ground and was expected to hold further talks with the FA. Davies said: "We are making progress on the matter but we have always said that we hoped to have something positive to say by the middle of this week and that is what we are sticking to."

"We have made significant progress and we are not far away," he added.

In the 1970s, Keegan was England's top international player, playing 63 times for the country. At Liverpool, he led the side to their first European Champions Cup triumph in

1977 and later, after a transfer to Hamburg, led the German side to Bundesliga title and was twice named as the European player-of-the-year.

His only coaching experience previous to Fulham came at New Castle where he led the team to promotion to the Premier league but then saw his side blow a 12-point lead and finished second to Manchester United in the 1995-96 season.

Some questions still remain about his ability to deal with a

high profile, high-pressure coaching situation.

Former England coach Bobby Robson, who said he was interested in the job and was in early list of candidates, doubted that Keegan could succeed as a part-time coach.

"No, I don't think so at all," Robson said. "After six weeks of the job with England I realised to do two jobs at club and international level would be impossible."

Spurs reach last four

LONDON, Feb 17: A controversial goal by Norwegian international Sten Iversen on Tuesday gave Tottenham a 1-0 League Cup win over Wimbledon at a place in their first Wembley final for eight years, reports Reuters.

Iversen appeared to be offside when he neatly trapped the ball and scored with a curling job in the 39th minute of the second leg of their semifinal. The first leg ended in a goalless draw.

George Graham's team, now unbeaten in 12 matches, created most chances in a game of furious pace as Tottenham booked their first Wembley final since they beat Nottingham Forest in

the 1991 FA Cup.

Les Ferdinand had come close to giving Spurs the lead in the 14th minute when he spun to unleash a powerful shot, but he was denied by a brilliant save by goalkeeper Neil Sullivan.

A minute later Tottenham goalkeeper Ian Walker denied Wimbledon when he tipped a

Hanover makes WC bid official

HANOVER, Germany, Feb 17 (Reuters/Internet): Hannover on Tuesday officially applied to stage matches if Germany succeed in their bid to host the 2006 World Cup finals.

Mayor Herbert Schmalstieg informed the German Soccer Federation (DFB) that the northern city wanted to be a venue.

Schmalstieg also confirmed plans for an overhaul of the local stadium to transform it into a modern, all-seated arena with a 45,000 capacity.

The works, which will cost an estimated 70 million marks (\$40.02 million), should start next July.

Bizarri arrives to rescue Real

MADRID, Feb 17 (Reuters/Internet): Argentine under-21 goalkeeper Albano Bizarri will finally arrive in the Spanish capital this weekend to join Real Madrid, club officials said on Wednesday.

Bizarri was signed from Argentine club Real Avellaneda in January during the Spanish mid-season transfer window, but had been given permission to stay in his native country until now.

Boca duo grab top honours

MONTEVIDEO, Feb 17: Argentinian striker Martin Palermo, known as 'El Loco' or 'The Madman', was crowned here Tuesday as the 'King of American football' while his boss at Boca Juniors, Carlos Bianchi, was named as best coach, reports AFP.

Paraguay's eccentric goalkeeper Jose Luis Chilavert was voted the best goalkeeper in the Americas.

Palermo, a member of Boca Juniors' 1998 Argentine championship-winning team, took over the mantle from Chilean Marcelo Salas, who won the award when with Buenos Aires outfit River Plate, but is now with Serie A leaders Lazio.

France and Juventus midfielder Zinedine Zidane and former Juventus boss Marcello Lippi were named best European player and coach respectively.

Players are judged according to the continent in which they play their club football. For instance Roberto Carlos and Ronaldo are considered as qualifying for Europe in the awards.

A jury of 300 sports journalists from 56 countries voted on the awards and named the following dream teams:

DONA, Feb 17: German football legend Franz Beckenbauer, president of Bayern Munich and vice-president of the German football federation, reiterated here Tuesday his support for a biennial World Cup, as proposed by FIFA president Sepp Blatter, reports AFP.

Beckenbauer said, "Blatter has had a good idea which we must study minutely" during a 48-hour trip to Qatar, promoting Germany's bid for the 2006 World Cup.

Beckenbauer has claimed a biennial World Cup would open up the tournament to smaller nations.

A ray of hope for Sydney

LONDON, Feb 16: Sydney Olympic organisers can ease their financial troubles by reallocating more than 100 million dollars US 66 million) from a profit-sharing deal back into the Games, the IOC's marketing chief said Tuesday, reports AP.

"You would solve the financing issue in a stroke of a pen," marketing director Michael Payne said.

Raising money from corporate sponsors for the 2000 Sydney Games has become a major concern, especially in the wake of the Olympic corruption scandals.

With Sydney about 200 million Australian dollars short of its target for sponsorship revenues, Payne suggested the controversial profit deal should be reviewed.

"There is no way the Games should be compromised because of a profit deal that we are opposed to," he told The Associated Press in a telephone interview from IOC headquarters in Lausanne, Switzerland. "This money should be put back into the Games."

Payne said the IOC warned the Australians three years ago against projecting a surplus for the Games. Sydney organisers have predicted a surplus of 30 million dollars.

The IOC was saying, "This is crazy to be talking about a profit now. You should wait until the day after the closing ceremony," Payne said. "For various reasons, they wanted to lock down issues on profit two or three years ago. May be that should be reopened. There's

more than 100 million dollars involved."

Under terms of the IOC's contract with Olympic cities, 90 per cent of any surplus goes to the host country and 10 per cent to the IOC. Of the 90 per cent set aside for the host country, 10 per cent goes to the national Olympic committee.

The profit-sharing arrangement for Sydney has gone through several changes.

In a deal with the New South Wales government, the Australian Olympic Committee (AOC) agreed to give up its veto power over key decisions in exchange for a guaranteed sum of 100 million dollars.

Later, the NSW government effectively bought out the AOC's right to the money. The funds go to the AOC whether there is a surplus or not.

"That money has now been taken off the balance books," Payne said. "In hindsight, it might have been premature to

talk about profit."

The IOC's share of the profit deal was eventually capped at 13.5 million dollars. The IOC has said it would earmark most of its share to a special fund for sports programmes in Australia and the rest of the Oceania region.

Payne said IOC president Juan Antonio Samaranch has made clear the international committee is ready to help out if the organising committee and government request it, including reconsidering the IOC's profit share.

"It would seem the first place to start is to look at the whole profit deal, which we thought was a bad idea in the first place," Payne said. "We would never do a deal of this nature again. Never in a million years."

Even before the corruption scandals involving Olympic bid cities, Sydney was struggling to meet its 2.6-billion dollar budget.

Specifically, organisers have fallen short of their 874 million dollars sponsorship target.

This has led to fears that budget cutbacks will be made that could affect the Games.

Nebiolo supports Samaranch

ROME, Feb 17: Primo Nebiolo, the powerful president of track and field's world governing body, on Tuesday offered his first formal support for embattled IOC president Juan Antonio Samaranch, reports AP.

Nebiolo's statement was issued through the Council of the Association of Summer Olympic International Federations, over which Nebiolo presides.

"The Council is convinced that Samaranch is exceptionally qualified to navigate the IOC through these troubled waters," the ASOIF statement said.

As time like this when strength, wisdom and determination are absolutely necessary to reinforce faith in the Olympic Movement, his experience and leadership cannot be questioned."

Samaranch has faced numerous calls for his resignation from newspapers and personalities outside the IOC as a result of the corruption scandals surrounding the Olympic bidding process.

Nebiolo, who is an IOC member and president of the International Amateur Athletic Federation, has been unusually silent on the Olympic crisis.

The quotes in the press release were attributed to an ASOIF spokesman and not Nebiolo himself.

In addition to Nebiolo, the other members of the ASOIF Council are: George Kilian, United States (basketball); Aldo Notari, Italy (baseball); Rene Roch, France (fencing); Lu Shierong, China (badminton); Paul Henderson, Canada (sailing); Juan Angel Calzado, Spain (field hockey).

MEMPHIS, Tennessee, Feb 17: Top-seeded and Martin held off a strong challenge from qualifier Jonathan Stark to win his opening match in the 825,000 dollars, Kroger St Jude tennis tournament 7-6, 4-6, 7-5, reports Reuters.

Stark, an American ranked 268th in the world, matched Martin shot for shot until the final game, when he lost his match. A Stark double fault and three passing shots put Martin into the third round of tournament he has won two times.

Stark, who is making a comeback from hand surgery in 1998, has won several doubles titles on the ATP Tour and nearly upset Martin.

"He was hitting most of his serves over 110 or 120 miles and hour (175-195 kph) and still getting 72 per cent of his first serves in," said Martin. "I put a lot of balls back in play and that was really the key to the match."

Martin served seven aces and lost his serve only once.

Most seeded players were idle Tuesday including second seed Mark Philippoussis of Australia, and third seed Tommy Haas of Germany.

Martin next will face Kenneth Carlsen of Denmark, who beat American Steve Campbell 6-0, 6-1 in the second round.
