points from their 18 games. Last season, they narrowly escaped relegation but this time around the situation looks even bleaker.

New coach Rainer Bonholf who was Vogts' assistant during his eight years in charge of the German national side, is plan-ning to sell-off most of the team's highly paid 'stars' and start anew next season, be it in

the First or Second Division. "I am glad Berti's having a go," Bonholf responded. "Things are starting to happen here again. If he's on board that might give us a push. We need to win back that old feeling of everyone pulling together.

shocked.

Baird said in his latest statement that he discussed with the three men what would be involved in the bid. "Part of that was the issue of

intense coverage of the costs and extensive activities involved in the Olympic lobbying process but I certainly did not ask them to censor anything or not to investigate matters if they considered it appropriate." he said.

"What I sought was their support and to make them aware of the process that was needed and to ensure they did not have an incorrect perception of what was involved in the lobbying process," Baird's statement said.

Baird got no sympathy from other politicians, including Prime Minister John Howard, a fellow Liberal

"Go and ask Bruce Baird about that," Howard told reporters when asked for a reaction to Baird's claim. The Labour party now gov-
