Menon had said at the time that India had kept Sri Lankan garments - which account for about two thirds of its industrial output - as well as coconuts and alcoholic spirits on the Indian negative list.

The inclusion of tea and rubber in the negative list came as a surprise as Indian diplo-mats had been lobbying local trade chambers in favour of the trade pact, arguing that tea was being allowed into India duty free in line with the new agreement.

Sri Lankan businessmen say

export to India under preferential terms while most Indian industrial goods and heavy vehicles already enjoy zero tariffs in Sri Lanka.

Colombo is expected to keep Indian agricultural produce in a negative list although details have not been announced.

Indian exports to Sri Lanka are 13 times larger than its imports from the island.

The trade pact envisages India eliminating some of the tariffs on Sri Lankan products within three years from Monday while Sri Lanka will take eight years to reciprocate.

However, Sri Lanka's tariffs are to be brought down across the board by next year, making some of the concessions in the bilateral pact redundant.

Stanley Fischer, the fund's deputy director, told the academics that the IMF reform programme for Thailand's troubled economy was working. His audience didn't buy it. however, and expressed serious doubts the economy was about

Since then, thousands of businesses have closed and nearly two million people have been left unemployed. The IMF is supervising a \$17.2 billion bailout of the Thai economy in exchange for eco-

nomic reforms. While Fischer insisted the IMF had been flexible and adjusted its reform programmes as the situation in Thailand changed, the academics accused the agency of misreading the situation and flip-flopping on

its prescriptions. "First you told us to limit our fiscal deficit. Now you're telling us to spend more. These policies have severely affected the average Thai person," Pasuk Phong-paichitr, an economist from Chulalongkorn University, was

quoted as saying by the paper.
"Can the IMF be accountable to the Thai people or the pain and suffering caused by this ap-parent policy error?" asked Pasuk who is also the author of "Thailand: Boom and Bust."

Ammar Siamwalla, an economist with the Thailand Development and Research Institute, a government-funded think tank, had little faith in the IMF's recovery forecast.

"The bottom will be much lower than the IMF previously predicted," he said of the economy's forecasted nadir.

Some of the economists also criticised the IMF for requiring the government to shut down 58 insolvent finance companies last year.

One of the most difficult problems facing the economy is a liquidity crunch. With the level of bad loans so high, most Thai banks are reluctant to extend new loans, even to borrowers with good repayment track records.

That has forced many companies into further difficulties because they can't purchase raw materials.

But a government source said "something more ambiguous" was expected here from the three-member body, namely a request for "some additional time to consider damages." thereby delaying the start of the sanctions.

The same panel is also reviewing amendments to EU banana import policies that according to the European Union are consistent with WTO regulations, a position sharply contested by the United States. A ruling on the compliance question is due April 12.

The simmering and increasingly biter dispute centers on concessions that the European Union grants to banana imports from African, Caribbean and Pacific countries, several of which are former British and French colonies.

The United States maintained that such privileges harmed the interests of its multinational corporations notably Dole Food Company and Chiguita Branda International - that harvest and export bananas from central America.

Washington won a decision from a WTO dispute settlement panel in May 1997 that the European Union's banana policies were indeed discriminatory and inconsistent with WTO rules. The EU then amended its
