Greene feels the urgency

MAEBASHI, Japan, Mar 5: Although Maurice Greene is the world record-holder in the 60 metres he has something to prove in the World Indoor Championship which began today, reports AP.

Greene is coming off a "very disappointing" second place in the USA Championships last weekend, his first defeat of the season.

"I didn't run like I wanted to," Greene said Thursday. "I know I let down my fans. I have to do something here to regain them. Now, I can make up for it. "I have a lot of faith in my

ability. always confident Greene, who set the world record of 6.39 seconds last year at Madrid, Spain, ran 6.40 in the semifinals of the USA Championships at Atlanta, but clocked only 6.49 in the final. losing to Tim Harden's careerbest 6.44.

Greene had an excuse. He slightly injured his left hamstring in the semifinals. and was cautious in the final, coming out of the blocks last.

"I started easy in the final. Greene, the 1997 world outdoor champion at 100 metres said "Something didn't feel right in my leg. I didn't know the problem. I didn't know whether it was a career-threatening in-

"It turned out to be no big deal. It's fine now. I expect to

have a good race here. "But there, I was uncomfortable and nervous. I told myself I wasn't going to rely on my start. If I could get out of the blocks safely, I would be fine. I relied on the middle part of my race. just wanted to finish healthy. I wasn't 100 per cent certain I was

going to win." As it turned out, Grene's start was horrible and that proved costly. Still, he ran fast enough to make the US team and earn a chance for redemption against Harden.

Greene said he feels fit enough to break the record again, but winning will be his major aim. "I'm always determined to

set the world record," he said. "But hopefully I can run technically correct and everything will fall into place."

Last year, Greene failed in several attempts to break Donovan Bailey's 100-metre world record of 9.84, and he blamed that on trying too hard. "I was talking about the world record, but I wasn't run-

ning my race to break it." said Greene, whose 100 best is 9.86. This year, he has taken a different attitude - less talking

and faster running. Greene and Harden are the favourites to return the world indoor 60-metre title to the United States for the first time since Lee McRae won in 1987.

MANCHESTER. England, March 5 (Reuters/Internet) : Chelsea chief Gianluca Vialli may have been a


manager for only 12 months but he has already impressed one of the oldest and most successful men in the trade --Manchester United boss Alex Ferguson.

Italy, has taken the rotational squad system used on the continent and employed it to good effect at Stamford Bridge even though the method has seen the




Vialli is looking forward to the challenge of attempting to outwit Ferguson when he sits down to plan his tactics for Sunday's game.

SCOTTSDALE; Arizona, Mar 5: Jan-Michael Gambill stayed cool under pres-

sure from Pete Samples to knock the world No. I out of the second round 4-6. 6-3, 6-4 in the 350,000-dollar ATP Tour event here Thursday, reports AFP.

"I feel great," Gambill beamed. "It's obviously the biggest win of my life and against the player whom I think is the best in the game. It's huge for me, it's the toughest I've ever stayed in a match.

players in the last year. Sampras, in his 261st week as world No. 1, has just nine weeks to go to tie the all-time

mark held by Ivan Lendl.

But he is under threat from Russian Yevgeny Kafelnikov. who is idle this week.

"It's disappointing, I had some chances, but I had some loose service games," added Sampras, who had won his last eight matches against fellow Americans. "I was being aggressive, but he got in some good passing shots, he was pretty

COPENHAGEN, Mar 5: Angry top-seed Marc Rosset broke three rackets and received a warning from the umpire as he crashed out of the 215,000 US dollars Copenhagen Open on Thursday, beaten 7-6, 6-4 by unseeded Daniel Nestor, ranked

Torian, who was credited with a time two hundredths of a second slower, demanded the computer photo be reviewed. insisting he was the winner.

The drama overshadowed Ethiopian Haile Gebrselassie's win in the men's 3,000m which leaves him free to secure a unique double if he can add the 1,500m this weekend. The first day also saw Olga

Shishigina of Kazakhstan win the women's 60m hurdles just over a year after coming back from a drug ban. US protests over Jackson's win were dismissed by race officials who studied the pho-

tographs, but they did not con-

vince Torian, the 23-year-old rising star of hurdle racing. Jackson, the 32-year-old British veteran, was second at the Indoor Championships in Paris in 1997, in Toronto in

1993 and Budapest in 1989. And there was tension from the start of his latest attempt to get the gold, with three false starts, one of which was blamed on the Welshman.

When it finally got underway, Jackson led but Torian was getting closer as the finish line loomed.

"I think Reggie hit the last hurdle which made it easier for me and I just threw myself at the line and lunged like hell,"

MAEBASHI, Ja- said Jackson as he celebrated pan, Mar 5: Colin with a union jack around his Jackson's celebra- shoulders, unaware of the brewing controversy.

"I am just so happy that it is now all done and out of the way," Jackson said of his relief at finally getting the title, to add to his single 110m gold from the outdoor World Cham-

pionships in 1993. But at a press conference after the race, Torian, who sat next to Jackson, said: "At the line I thought I had won it and I

still think I won it. "It was a very tight race from start to finish. It was very hard to separate the two of us at the

finish line. At the line Torian threw his head forward sideways with his arm outstretched which he said gave him the edge. But International Amateur

Athletic Federation (IAAF) rules state that the winner is the runner who gets his torso over the line first. "There was no official

protest, but there was a discus-

sion as the photo was reviewed." said an IAAF spokesman. "The result stands, Falk Balzer of Germany was third in 7.44sec. Torian insisted there was no personal animosity with Jack-

son and the two embraced at the

end of the race. But his coach Ed Nuttycombe said: "There is no way that Reggie was two hundredths of a second behind and I just want to

know what happened." The 9,000-seater stadium was virtually empty when Gebrselassie powered to victory in the men's 3,000m in 7min 53.57sec, almost half a minute outside the indoor world record of Kenyan arch-rival Daniel Konen.

The Olympic 10,000-metre champion, who had been tipped for a new world record, was clearly surprised at the lack of atmosphere and public support.

"It was empty and I am astonished," said Gebrselassie.

"The people told me it would be
